#### NOVEMBER MEETING FOR CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

As autumn deepens and mist settles over the Purbeck Hills, the Parish Council gathered on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2025 in the Village Hall to discuss the matters that shape daily life in Corfe Castle, from community safety and village upkeep to heritage preservation and local engagement.

Community Voices and Volunteering: One resident attended the meeting, highlighting the important work of the Community Speed Watch team, which now operates with fewer volunteers than in the past. The Council expressed gratitude to those continuing this valuable service and agreed to help recruit new members.

**Reports and Updates:** <u>Dorset Councillor's Report:</u> A detailed update was received, including the recent outcome of the Sandbanks Ferry Inquiry. The Inspector approved toll increases with modifications, maintaining bulk ticket discounts and rejecting the proposed road toll, a positive result for local residents. Dorset's housing land supply was also discussed, with implications for future planning decisions.

National Trust Update: Representatives from the National Trust shared exciting news about 'Purbeck Goes Wild 2026', a initiative involving young people in learning about local ecology. The Council thanked the National Trust for their continued engagement with the community.

**God's Acre Charges:** The Copncil reviewed the level of charges for burials, memorial stones etc as it is clear that the current income will not fund long term maintenance and more would have to be paid by Parish tax payers. The Council resolved to set out charges at a level comparable with Swanage charges. This will mean a substantial increase from next April.

The budget for 2026-7 will be considered again at the December meeting.

**Policies, Safety and Maintenance**: A comprehensive review of Council policies and risk assessments was undertaken and approved. To view any policy or risk assessment please visit our website.

**Scouts' St George's Day Parade:** The Parish Council received a request for use of the car park in West Street to enable the Scout's to hold a St George's Day Parade on Sunday 26th April 2026. The Parish Council agreed to apply to Dorset Council on their behalf for the free use of West Street Car Park for Scouts, their families, and others taking part in the parade.

**Highways**: <u>School Safety Signage</u>: The Clerk will ask Dorset Council to replace the existing "Crossing Ahead" signs with clearer "School" or "Children Crossing" signage.

<u>Festival Traffic:</u> The Parish Council will again raise its concerns with Dorset Council about the impact of festival traffic on residents when festival goers leave. <u>Pavement Parking:</u> Following local feedback, the Parish Council agreed to contact homeowners along a problem stretch to encourage considerate parking and prevent obstruction of pavements. Please could everyone take care when parking, and think about others. "Can a wheelchair user or carer with a pram, safely pass my car?"

**Looking Ahead:** Councillors and the Clerk noted a busy schedule of upcoming meetings with Dorset and Purbeck partners, covering topics from transport to youth engagement. Preparations also continue for projects such as community transport, and the Reflection Garden at Gods Acre.

**Planning and Licensing Matters**: The Parish Council reviewed several local planning applications, and after carefully considering the impact on neighbours and the historic character of the village agree to submit the following comments:

<u>Application</u> No: P/FUL/2025/06049 .<u>Location</u>: Corfe Castle Sports Field Hollands Close Corfe Castle BH20 5HE. <u>Proposal</u>: Erection of outdoor gym equipment and new gate in existing fence enclosure <u>Comment</u>: No objection.

<u>Application</u> No: P/LBC/2025/06169 & P/FUL/2025/06168, <u>Location</u>: 42 East Street Corfe Castle BH20 5EQ, <u>Proposal</u>: Removal of temporary hoarding to footpath, remove remaining sections of existing failed retaining wall, construct new blockwork diaphragm wall clad with reused stone flags., <u>Comment</u>: As the property lies within a conservation area and the internal side of the wall is visible to passers-by, the Parish Council wishes to record its objection to the application and requests that both sides of the wall be faced with Purbeck Stone, not just the external face.

<u>Application</u> No: P/HOU/2025/06048, <u>Location</u>: Applecross Colletts Close Corfe Castle BH20 5HG, <u>Proposal</u>: Replacement of an existing shed with a Malvern Hopton Summerhouse. <u>Comment</u>: Corfe Castle Parish Council has no objection: This appears to be a re-siting of the proposed summerhouse. Previously it was on the boundary with the adjacent property, replacing an existing shed, but it now appears that they want to put it in the corner of the plot. This is arguably a better location for it.

**Next Council Meeting:** Monday 8<sup>th</sup> December 2025, at 7pm in the Corfe Castle Village Hall, Bill Carter Room. The meeting starts with a public session, giving residents the chance to have their say.

As we wrap up our November Council updates, we wish all readers a very Merry Christmas and a happy New Year!

#### **Environmental Group Update**

#### A FEW TIPS FOR A GREENER CHRISTMAS



#### SECRET SANTA

Instead of buying friends or family individual presents,

opt for a Secret Santa gift exchange. Each person is allocated someone to buy for, either by drawing names out of a hat, or by using an online tool. Everyone agrees to the budget for each present and provides their wish list. This can be a lot less stressful than trying to buy for lots of people, and as the budget is higher, people can include on their wish list a present they'd really love to receive. It should also result in less unwanted gifts, thereby reducing waste.

#### TABLE DECORATIONS

As many Christmas crackers are not recyclable and the gifts inside are often made of plastic and/or thrown away after one use, why not try making your own? In my family, we organise a lovely sociable pre-Christmas crafts day, and as part of this we make our Christmas crackers. We use scrap materials (loo roll cores, used wrapping paper or crepe paper, old ribbons, etc) and just buy the snaps and little gifts to go in them, which ticks both the money saving and green boxes. Alternatively, you can buy a cracker making kit (e.g. Poole based The Cracker Company has a lot of different options).

#### CHRISTMAS TREES

From a green viewpoint, real trees are preferable to artificial trees, ideally one with roots you can look after and use each year! Otherwise, after the big day, trees can either be home composted, put in your garden waste bin, taken to

the tip or you can support a local charity by arranging for them to collect it for a donation — e.g. Lewis-Manning Hospice Care offer this, book online or ring 01202 708470. If your preference is for an artificial tree, the recommendation is to use it for at least 10 years, so try to buy a better quality one.

#### Hamza's Hidden Wild Isles

Don't miss this stunning nature series on BBC iPlayer. Wildlife cameraman Hamza Yassin takes us on a tour of the hidden nature of the UK. In the first episode alone (spring), there was incredible footage including the courtship

displays of great crested grebes, hares boxing, nightingales singing (they have a repertoire of up to 1,000 different phrases learned from other birds) and numerous adders curled up together to bask. And guess what? All these can be seen here in Purbeck!



#### Slowing the flow

You might have noticed some strange-looking installations in the fields in Purbeck. These are various methods we're using on our tenanted farmland to help prevent flooding downstream.

One of the techniques is creating leaky dams in ditches made from stacks of

logs. In open fields, tree trunks have been pinned to the ground where floodwater is known to run. Both these things will act as barriers in storms, spreading water over the floodplain rather than it careering downhill. In other areas, scrapes (hollows) and bunds (embankments) will encourage storm water to form temporary ponds where it soaks into the soil gradually.

#### **Church Knowle Parish Council - November Meeting**

The November meeting of the Church Knowle Parish Council took place in the Church Knowle Village Hall on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> November 2025 at 6:30pm. It was attended by eight members of the Council (Cllr Burt in the chair) and two members of the public.

#### **Public Discussion**

The results of the traffic survey that had been made available to parishioners who requested them were discussed. It was felt that the decision not to impose any speed limits on the Grange or Furzebrook Roads was the wrong one. It was argued that this should be revisited in light of the increased tonnage and frequency of heavy good vehicles using the road and the large increase in tourist numbers going to the Blue Pool. Residents have been campaigning for over 30 years to have a speed limit and, while mercifully there have been no serious accidents, near misses are a frequent occurrence leaving many residents fearful of walking along the road. While there were only a few vehicles measured exceeding the speed limit this is because the speed limit is 60mph. There are however a significant number of vehicles exceeding the proposed speed limit of 30mph.

It was also observed that there are often cycling and running events routed through the parish and that these are on narrow roads with a present speed limit of 60mph. A reduction in the speed limit has obvious safety advantages.

The Arne Parish Council is continuing to push for a speed limit and Church Knowle is fully in support of their campaign.

#### Tender for Firewood

Two offers for the firewood from the felled ash tree in the playing field have been received and the higher one of £200 was accepted. This tree will be replaced in the next couple of months.

There were no planning applications to consider.

#### The New Inn

Sadly the New Inn is now closed and the owners, Punch Taverns, are advertising for a new pub landlord. This is the only pub in a parish that has no school, post office or shop and it is hoped that it will re-open.

#### Vacancies on the Parish Council

There is still one vacancy on the council which has a full strength of nine and any interested parishioners can apply to clerk@churchknowle-pc.gov.uk.

#### Change of Chair

Cllr Derek Burt stepped down as chairman and Cllr Ian Gilbert was voted in as the new chairman.

The meeting finished at 8:15 pm. The next meeting of the Church Knowle Parish Council will be at the Furzebrook Village Hall at 6:30 on 9<sup>th</sup> December 2025.







#### **Purbeck Passage Houses**

Long ago if one wished to get to the bustling port of Poole from Purbeck, transport was usually by horse, cart or boat. The quickest way to get there would have been by water. However, bad weather could delay travel by sea, so a business opportunity arrived, creating the need for an amenity for passengers to shelter in (and maybe have a drink or two) thus the 'Passage House' was born.




Isaac Taylor's 1796 map of Poole Harbour

Four 'Passage Houses' served Purbeck - one at Gold Point, Arne, one at Wytch, another at Ower and the fourth at South Haven on the Studland Peninsula.

#### Arne

Arne's passenger service to Poole was set up in 1721 for 'honest an orderly passengers' by George Whiffen, a retired mariner. There may have been a rowboat service prior to that as in 1753, a new Passage House was built.

By 1789, part of the 'Passage House' or 'Severett House' as it was otherwise called, was used to store clay which was shipped to Poole and onwards to the Potteries for Josiah Wedgewood. Two boatmen lived here in the late 1700s, but it's use declined and by 1889, Charles Dickens (yes, that one) noted that it had fallen into disuse.

#### South Haven, Studland


Another 'rowboat service' existed here before the Ferry house was built here in 1678. It crossed between North Haven Point to South Haven and in 1581, the Governor of Branksea Castle, amused himself by shooting at the passengers until one day he killed someone which stopped his entertainment! The tenant of the Ferry House had to maintain the passage boat. Like all the other houses, alcohol could be bought here which lead to one Swanage lady drinking one too many glasses. She'd set off at 6am and walked to Little Sea to take the boat to the Isle of Wight to sell straw bonnets. Arriving at the Ferry House she had a light refreshment of bread, cheese, beer and some chasers, continued drinking during the crossing until she passed out in the boat and eventually returned home having sold nothing.



#### Wytch

It was the ferry service coming back from Poole to Wytch Passage House that suffered in that storm in March 1759. The boat was blown onto the mud flats

and thirteen passengers 'many of them in liquor' attempted to escape to Brownsea but were smothered in the mud. The six who stayed with, or near to, the boat were rescued. The ferry service was still operating in 1889 and was also used as a carriage service for goods and building materials not available in Purbeck like slate.

#### Ower

'The History of Dorset' claims that Ower was the chief port in Purbeck, principally used for exporting stone and marble. The marblers paid a 1lb of pepper yearly on Ash Wednesday to be able to use Ower quay. Since 1710, stone has not been exported from here as clay took over.



During the late 19<sup>th</sup> century, the Inn was abandoned as even by 1820, a house guest recorded it in his diary as a hovel, the rooms filled with chimney smoke, and it flooded so he was obliged to stand in water.

#### Revd Richard writes,

"He's making a list, and checking it twice; He's gonna find out who's naughty or nice..."

This year is the 1700<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the famous Council of Nicaea in 325AD. And there's a good chance Santa was there! Or rather St Nicholas of Myra, from whom we derive the name Santa Claus.

The Council centred around the question of whether Jesus was indeed divine. There's a story that as the Council met, Nicholas became so angry at Arius, the leader of the group that refused to accept Jesus's divinity, that he marched across the room and punched him. The Council immediately sent Nicholas home for such bad behaviour!

I rather like the idea of a Christmas card depicting Santa Claus punching someone and then having to move his own name from the nice list to the naughty list.

The story of the punch may well be myth. We have rather more evidence that Nicholas's life was marked by constant generosity as an overflow of his own faith in God's unconditional generosity in Jesus.

The idea that only those who have been good enough get a gift is the very opposite of the message of Christmas.

"Christmas is the time when Christians recall God's greatest gift – the gift of Christ given to people of dubious moral standing like us. Not because we deserved it, but despite the fact that we didn't. It's why we give gifts at Christmas, not to win favours from others, but for the sheer joy of it." (Bishop Graham Tomlin)

Whether we imagine ourself on the naughty list or the nice list, a saint or a heretic, the gift of God himself is offered freely to us.



#### **Anne Bond writes**

This follows from last month when I described the old-fashioned routines of living in a large unmodernised house 70-something years ago.

In March of 1949, another baby joined the household - and he was a boy! Almost immediately, all we girls got Whooping Cough. It was vital that the new-born baby shouldn't catch it. There were no medicines to keep him safe, and no cure for us; the disease just had to be allowed to run its course. The expensive answer was to despatch us in the care of the Nursery Maids to a hotel on Weymouth Sea Front until we were no longer dangerous to the baby. History doesn't relate how the hotel staff reacted.

I was five years old, and the twins were two. I remember exploring the Sea Front, rows and rows of stalls selling everything imaginable from tin seaside buckets to candy floss and food. Apparently, one of us children swiped a colossal flat fish from where it hung over the edge of its display table and skipped back to the hotel swinging it merrily. There was no swimming because it was only March, but we all enjoyed paddling in the little waves breaking onto the smooth wet sand. Our west-Dorset cousins lived near the sea. When we went swimming with them, each child had a rubber ring attached to a long length of clothesline. You wore the rubber ring around your waist while their Nanny sat firmly on the pebbly beach with the ends of the clotheslines tied around her middle. Their beach had a fierce undertow so was quite dangerous. Here in Weymouth, it was just gentle sea and sandcastles.

Christmas the year of my brother's birth was wonderful. We had a vast Christmas Tree with clip-on real candles on the lower branches that were extinguished each night. Most of the families from neighbouring farms came to tea. I remember sitting on the floor around the tree with all the children, a roaring fire in the hearth, small presents for everyone, and thinking in my childish mind: 'how beautiful, how friendly, this is how things ought to be all the time!' I had on a pretty dress, and white socks just like my friend Joyce, the gardener's daughter. Nanny made us wear brown socks on weekdays, white only on Sundays. Later, all four of us wore everyday yellow aertex shirts and grey shorts, the girl's ones with pleats and side fastenings, and my brother's pair with buttons down the front and pockets each side.

It is still not too late to gather leaves for leaf mould which helps plants during difficult weather. Gather in a dust bin bag, fill place upside down and put fork holes in. Will rot beautifully.

December is also a good time to be untidy in the garden; you can leave piles of twigs for wildlife, and deadheads on the ground as mulch.



#### Purbeck puffins: 2025 News.

This time last year I wrote a piece for the CVN about how our local puffins fared in 2024. Here is the annual update.

The first sighting in 2025 was on the 20<sup>th</sup> March when six puffins were seen. Some of

them came ashore and one pair mated on the sea. This was a promising start to the season, confirming that we had the same number of puffins preparing to breed as in the previous two years. Mating was seen again on 5<sup>th</sup> April and 23<sup>rd</sup> April and there was evidence suggesting one bird may have laid an egg on 21<sup>st</sup> April. With an incubation period of 41 days, this first-laid egg should have hatched about the 1<sup>st</sup> of June.

On the morning of 1<sup>st</sup> June there were lots of excited emojis on our WhatsApp group following a report of two separate sightings of a puffin flying into the cliff with fish! However, these sightings were of birds(s) in flight and seen only very briefly. If the first chick had hatched on 1<sup>st</sup> June, fish-carrying by the adult puffins should, if they had reared chicks to fledging age, have lasted until at least 12<sup>th</sup> July. However, although a further 43 hours of observations between 1<sup>st</sup> June and 12<sup>th</sup> July gave us many sightings of puffins, not another puffin was seen carrying fish.

On 9<sup>th</sup> of June, a puffin was photographed on the sea with strands of seaweed dangling (fish-like) from its bill, which it brought into the cliff. Maybe the birds seen briefly on 1<sup>st</sup> June were also carrying seaweed rather than fish! Either way, the lack of any further sightings of fish carrying puffins between 1<sup>st</sup> June and 12<sup>th</sup> July means that they cannot have reared any chicks to fledging age in 2025. It is most likely that none of the eggs laid in late April even hatched.

The puffin carrying seaweed into the cliff on 9<sup>th</sup> June was probably (re-) building a nest – most likely having recently laid a new egg to replace one it had laid earlier and lost. On 17<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> June one puffin showed all the signs of incubating an egg again. However, the 25<sup>th</sup> June was the last day on which puffins were seen on the cliff. On 1<sup>st</sup> July we found just 2 puffins far out on


the sea and on 4<sup>th</sup> July we found 4 puffins again far out to sea. Watches on 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> July found no puffins at all! They had all gone – before any replacement egg laid in early June might have hatched. This egg may have been predated or maybe just abandoned due to the departure of the other puffins.

So, our three pairs of puffins all failed to rear any pufflings to independence in 2025 – the same result as in 2024 and 2023. We still don't yet know why the puffins seem to be failing every year but predation of their eggs or chicks is the most likely cause. Crows were seen many times landing on the cliff ledge and looking into the crevice where the puffins nest. A stoat was seen on the clifftop nearby, and although we did not see any rats, I am sure that they are scampering around down there too. Getting proof of predation in future years remains a priority. However, solving this particular "who dunnit" could easily take several more years. Some pre-emptive action to reduce the vulnerability of the puffins to predation of their eggs or chicks might be needed now. With only six ageing puffins left, they might be running out of time!

#### **Eyes to the skies**

Hi all, after a quiet few months at the tollgate, finally the season has settled into a winter pattern, albeit very mild still when writing this (15/11)

The beautiful autumn leaves are still providing some cover for the odd Chiffchaff/ Willow-warbler and Blackcap left over from our glorious summer. The feeders at the hut have been inundated with Finches and Tits and we even have a resident first winter Grey Wagtail (not to be confused with the many Pied Wagtails this one has bright yellow underparts) who has been most entertaining, spending its mornings on my car windscreen & mirrors. There are still plenty of Collard Doves, Sparrow, & Chaffinches taking advantage of seed on the floor left by the messy feeding Goldfinches.

Yellowhammers have been visiting recently and in greater numbers, I counted x6 together making it a toll hut record, but I have also noticed them more frequently in the hedgerows around the Bay.

Large flocks of Goldfinches, Meadow Pipits and Linnets are feeding in the surrounding fields, and down in the bay we have our own mini murmuration of Starlings at least 300/400 strong feeding mostly in the field by the coast guard cottage's. Some of you may have noticed changes in the fields around the Bay Area where more cover crops have been planted and some field edges left unharvested to benefit our existing wild bird populations and to attract and

encourage the more elusive Corn Bunting and Cirl Bunting perhaps (fingers crossed).

In the last few days (14/11) we have seen the return of the White-Tailed Eagles hunting along Smedmore ridge; they have been a regular feature during the winter months for the last three years only disappearing in May this year to breed for the first time, perhaps they are the same birds that were recorded fishing at Chapmans pool on 08/11? The ridge is also popular with Red kite, Buzzard, Sparrow hawk and Kestrel.

Also, keep checking house/ church and barn roofs for incoming Black Redstart, I've already seen one at Blackmanston and the second on the fossil museum roof in Kimmeridge, the Red tail is a giveaway.




