SEPTEMBER AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

The September meeting was attended by six members of the public, many of whom had concerns about the numerous events happening around the Purbeck Valley area and in Sandyhills Copse. Residents expressed their view that whilst on principle they do not object to events occurring there is a lack of monitoring, control and consideration for neighbours displayed by some event organisers. With relation specifically to Purbeck Valley Farm it was reported that Purbeck District Council have been requested to enforce some control on events on many occasions over the last four years and that they have failed to address the issues raised. On the contrary the number and scale of events being permitted has escalated. The Parish Council are pressing PDC to take note of the complaints and to ensure that whilst they are looking at the issues raised they are doing so in a joined up way; for the planning, licensing and environmental health departments to communicate, giving a rounded picture of what is occurring, how it impacts on the parish and to regulate events accordingly so that neighbours of the farm can enjoy their home and surroundings.

The parishioners stressed they did not want to stop well managed and controlled events.

Concerns were also raised about Stag parties taking place in Sandyhills Copse. A parishioner had experience bad language, anti-social behaviour and reported irresponsible driving and litter around the area. The parishioner spoke specifically about the lack of respect for wildlife and nature and they felt that an area of outstanding natural beauty was not an appropriate venue for such events.

County Cllr Brooks reported that the County Council was still relatively quiet, it being holiday season. The Councillors are expecting an announcement on the Local Government Reorganisation by the 15th of September. The Council have been in a state of limbo waiting for an announcement and should it not come she reported they will stop planning for LGR and proceed with business as usual.

A resolution from the Council regarding improving the safety of the crossing outside of the school has been put on hold. There was a proposed figure suggested for the installation of a Puffin Crossing but this was challenged on a recent visit from Highways and the Council are waiting for more information from DCC. Cllr Brooks has recommended the provision of a school crossing patrol and this is something the Council will consider when it has all the facts regarding the installation of a Puffin Crossing. It was noted the figure for the installation of a Puffin crossing will be out of the realms of the Parish

Council's budget so should it even be a consideration it would require the support and fundraising efforts of the community.

Cllr Dragon had received noise complaints regarding sudden gunfire at the Castle which the parishioners had not been aware of. In addition there had been complaints about noise after evening events at the Castle. Andrew Eustace, representing the National Trust, apologised and advised they do always endeavour to forewarn the locals of any planned gunfire and control those leaving events late at night. There is maintenance work taking place in the Castle; Scaffold has been erected on the outer bridge and there is erosion prevention and improvements to the grass being carried out within the monument. The Trust are also resurfacing the Car Park at Castle view. This will take place in October and half the car park will remain operational when work is being carried out. The sheep will be reintroduced to graze the mound in mid-September.

The Council has researched and considered the purchase of Purbeck stone to improve the pavements in East Street but they plan to petition DCC to pay for the repairs before giving the matter further consideration. Being in a conservation area it is important the appropriate materials are used and that the aesthetic quality of the street scene is maintained.

The Council resolved to grant the sum of £7,100 to help with refurbishments to the Village hall. The money will be pledged to Viridor Credits who have awarded a grant to Village Hall in excess of £71,000. The Council's contribution will secure this grant.

A report was made on the progress of the CCLT. With relation to this the Council has been updating its housing needs record in order to have the most accurate picture of what housing is required in the village and should you wish to be added to the list please contact the Clerk. More information can also be found in this addition of CVN. There will be a meeting for the public to learn more about the Community Land Trust in October.

The Council considers all planning applications and submits comments to the District Council. The Parish Council had no objection to proposals for the following: the replacement of window frames on the first floor dormer window and on the front elevation at 10 West Street, Corfe Castle. The conversion of former cow sheds into single holiday letting accommodation at Tapers Barn, Rabbits Hill Lane, Corfe Castle. A monopitch building for storage of vehicles & equipment and to build earth bank on south side at Lower Scoles Farm, Kingston, Corfe Castle. A two storey rear extension at 19 Townsend Road, Corfe Castle. To erect an agricultural workers dwelling

on land at West Street, Kingston (the Council specified its use should be restricted purely to agricultural use). The Council also had no objection to an information only pre-application request to change windows from timber grain to UPVC at the building behind 55 West Street, Corfe Castle.

The planned September meeting of the Parish Council was supposed to have taken place in Church Knowle village hall on 12th of the month. Because only two Parish Councillors were in attendance by 8:10pm, the Clerk advised those attending that the meeting was inquorate. PDC Councillor Malcolm Barnes and DCC Councillor Cherry Brookes arrived a few minutes later and at 8.30 pm it was decided to abandon the meeting and re-schedule it for later in the month. Following contact with Councillors the following day, the Clerk summoned a meeting of Members and Parishioners to be convened at 7:30pm on Tuesday, 26th September at Church Knowle Reading Room so that outstanding matters not discussed on the 12th could be resolved.

So that was that. The November edition of CVN – which would normally contain news of the October meeting of the Parish Council – will also contain news of the recalled September meeting.



Community Woodland Days

Nature in the castle

Corfe Castle may have been built as an impregnable fortress, but it has always been a part of the beautiful natural environment of Purbeck.

That made it an ideal venue to showcase some of the area's wildlife and the work we do to protect the natural environment and make it accessible for everyone.

Inspired by Nature workshops in the castle this autumn have been focusing on reptiles, bats and moths while Land is the theme of family-friendly storytelling.

Studland hasn't been left out of the programme with a guided walk looking at the dragonflies of the national nature reserve and the wetlands where they live.

More guided walks offered the chance of a close encounter with some of the animals which inhabit the twilight hours – Bats at Dusk and Deer at Dawn.

As well as Corfe Castle, the National Trust looks after nearly 8,000 acres of land in Purbeck, including two national nature reserves.

Important habitats such as wildflower-rich grasslands and the largest tract of unspoiled lowland heath in Dorset are managed for nature and the enjoyment of the public by National Trust rangers, ecologists and volunteers.

Increasingly, the Trust is working with partner organisations, neighbouring landowners and tenants to promote a healthy natural environment at a landscape scale.

Corfe Castle Community Land Trust Affordable Housing Update

The Corfe Castle Community Land Trust (CCCLT) has received approval from the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) to be established as a Community Benefit Society. The aim of the CCCLT is to endeavour to provide affordable rental housing exclusively for people with strong connections to our village community. Precise eligibility criteria will be determined at a later date.

Special General Meeting

As required by the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) Rules, the steering group has formed the first Board to take the CCCLT forward towards its first general meeting which will be open to members. At that 'Special General Meeting', to be held before 19 November 2017 (date to be set), the Board will step down and offer themselves for re-election; other members will then have the opportunity to stand for election to the Board, having become members of the CCCLT.

Public Meeting



MILLENNIUM DIARY UPDATE



Here is the Millennium Diary update for this month, but first I need to correct an error in last month's update. Sheila Doyle-Stephens is still very much with us and living in London. Sorry for the mistake in the September CVN.

Within the pages of this Diary you will find the words and thoughts of the people of Corfe Castle, as well as descriptions of all the Millennium activities, which took place during the year 2000. Pages of the Diary were sold to people who live within the parish of Corfe Castle including Kingston and to people who were staying in the village or who were related to villagers. Once sold, what went onto the page was entirely up to the author.

What follows is a record of some of the entries from October 2000.

- 1 October Tim Hamilton Fletcher describes his day. Tim and Mary still live at the top of West Street.
- 3 October Cynthia Sansom describes a visit to Dorchester in connection with William Barnes and local artist Dennis Lowson; also the old Post Office which as many will know used to be in West Street. Cynthia still lives in East Street.
- 4 October Alan Blakey from Kingston talks about the Pre-School and what some typical things cost in 2000. Wow – there have been some changes there in the last 17 years – have a look.
- 5 October Eileen Weedon describes the village she remembers when she was a girl; also fascinating memories.
- 6 October Jan Harriott on holiday with Mike in Cyprus. The Harriotts are still in Corfe although Mike has largely given up his plumbing work.
- 7 October Sybil Windsor talking about her day. Sybil is no longer with us.
- 8 October Brian Johnson writing on behalf of his mother Phyllis from Springwell Close about Corfe history.
- 9 October Phil Stuckey who works for the National Trust describes his day and his duties for the Trust. Phil still works for the Trust, but has recently moved away from Corfe to a new job.
- 10 October George Preston reminisces about how he and his family came

to Corfe while he was still serving in the Royal Tank Regiment. After leaving the army he became manager of the Bovingdon ranges and estate. The Preston family have now moved from where they used to live on the Swanage road to East Street.

- 11 October Lynne Stuckey, wife of Phil, has a busy day and receives nuisance phone calls – nothing changes!
- 12 October Kevin Reynolds and members of the Festivities Committee enjoy a drink together. The Festivities Committee still do a magnificent job putting up the Christmas lights as well as many other things throughout the year. Kevin and Debbie still live in the village.
- 13 October The Wake-Walkers have a normal day; they still live in Purbeck, but have moved out of Kingston.
Also the Westerns have a day out in London at the Eye and Millennium Dome – remember that?
- 15 October The Hunt family have just moved into Marblers in West Street. Marblers is now owned by Leigh and Paul Jobling; the restaurant is run by Love Cake and upstairs is B & B. It is now called Olivers.
- 16 October E Mullett reflecting on times gone; fascinating history.
- 18 October Nick Crutchfield working at Sandy Hills Workshops.
- 20 October Anne Preston working in the Surgery dispensary and preparing for a Conservatives fund raising do at Creech Grange. See also 10th October for George's entry.
- 21 October Elizabeth Carrington-Mail has a busy day raising funds for the RSPCA and working with Jock in the garden. Jock has now passed away.
- 22 October Mary Wills reflects on the closure of the Methodist Church which happened that day with a special service. Mary still lives in the village and the church has been converted into two houses.
- 23 October Dr Steve Horsnell reporting from the temporary surgery in the village hall car park. Since then Dr Steve has retired and the surgery has moved to its super new facility off West Street. We are so lucky to have such a good team and excellent facility.
- 24 October The youth shelter in the middle halves was being built, courtesy of Mrs Joyce Armstrong. The shelter is still there and much used.

- 25 October Peter Ford reports from Canada.
- 27 October Stephen Dru Drury and Richard Piercy get storm bound in Brest and return in the Barfleur in force 10 winds. The Barfleur is still running, but Stephen and Richard have sold the boat. See below for a record of what happened to them in the subsequent years.
- 30 October Brian Varney, the popular steward at the RBL reports on his day. The RBL is still a much used venue in the village, although undergoing change and Chubbie is still the steward.

Update by Stephen Dru Drury and the Yacht Shearwater since 2000

On the 27th October 2000 I and Richard Piercy were on our shared yacht Shearwater in Brest, having the intention to sail back to Poole for a winter refit. However the intense low which brought storm force 10 winds caused us to change our plans. As there was no reasonable chance of getting back to the UK in the next few days we decided to leave Shearwater at Brest and made arrangements with a local boatyard for her to be looked after.

We returned over winter to do some maintenance and found everything in France so good that we decided to stay for the next season and obtained a berth in the large Brest marina. Shearwater is a 32 foot Gibsea yacht and expensive to berth in the UK; in France marina dues are half of the UK price. So what started as one season turned into a stay of twelve years. Over the next couple of years we explored West and South Brittany

A few of years earlier Richard had applied for marina berths in several French ports, but without luck. However in 2002 we were suddenly and out of the blue offered a berth in Loctudy, a small fishing port in south Brittany. We took the berth and over the next ten years explored the Atlantic coast of France. We got to know Loctudy well and were welcomed by local people both in the businesses and by other boat owners, who were all French and very helpful.

The weather was always better than UK weather and the sailing good with many places to visit within easy reach, and of course the restaurants; our favourite being the Mer a Boire on the Loctudy Marina, which became a home from home serving some of the best meals I have eaten.

Every year we would venture to a new location and became familiar with the off lying Islands; the Isles de Glenan – the nearest and most challenging to sail around being very rocky and similar to the Scilly Isles; the Isle de Groix – probably our favourite island; Belle Isle and Isle de Yeux further South.

Of course we also visited the fascinating and lively towns all along the Biscay coast including Concarneau, Lorient, Quimper, Vannes and La Rochelle. The Biscay coast also has many rivers which it is possible to sail up for several miles. Our favourite was to sail up the River Charante as far as Rochfort where we would be locked in to a handy marina. We kept Shearwater in this area for a year and explored it thoroughly. Every second year we used to return to the boatyard at Ridge for over winter maintenance. Nevertheless when we got back to Loctudy we always felt we had come home.

As time passed Richard developed sore hips and eventually in 2008 had to give up sailing. Stephen bought Richards half share and stayed in Loctudy until 2012 when in May I brought Shearwater back to the West Country and kept her in Plymouth at Mountbatten, the old RAF Marine Branch Headquarters. There were two more years sailing in the West Country and the Channel Islands before I sold Shearwater to a RNLI Engineering Project Manager. She is still moored off the RNLI quay at Holes Bay.

Just a gentle reminder that the dispensary team need at least **48 HOURS** notice (this doesn't include Saturdays and Sundays) to process your prescription safely and accurately. We can only accept a repeat prescription at a minimum of 21 days to avoid overstocking of medication at home as we work on a 28 day cycle.

We can accept repeat prescription orders by telephone only between the times of 8.30am and 12.30pm every day, but for those of you with internet access why not sign up to our on-line system which allows you to order your prescription on-line anytime during the day. We still accept repeat prescriptions by filling in your repeat prescription slip and then posting it in the box provided outside of the main door or by the dispensary window.

developments news:

Last month we announced a grant for replacing and upgrading the roof from **Viridor Credits Environmental Company**. Work on this is planned to begin in January, and will happen only on week-days. Some of the car park will be taken up with contractor's equipment, and there will be scaffolding around the perimeter of the building, but events inside the hall can continue as usual.

Meanwhile "Final Push" fund-raising continues. Locals who have not yet Bought A Stone (forms on website and in the Village Shop), are encouraged to do so. We also have further bids currently being considered by other grant providers.

AFFORDABLE HOUSES FOR VILLAGERS.

We all want Corfe Castle to be a vibrant living village with a village store, Post Office facilities, pubs, churches, a school, restaurants and other shops. This will no longer be the case if we cannot keep young villagers, who have grown up here with their families and have their roots here, in the village. The problem is that the cost of buying a house here is very high, and even normal rents are too expensive for many villagers. Very tight Council planning controls make it impossible simply to build more houses to meet the need and demand.

One way to meet this problem is to build houses here specifically to be rented just to local people at a rent that they can afford. The Council planning policy allows small developments of houses for this purpose on land where normal “commercial” building would not be allowed. The conditions for planning permission would be that the house could never be sold, and must be rented at an “affordable rent” to people with a close connection with Corfe Castle. Such house would probably be owned and managed by a Housing Association. The Government has been talking about extending the “right to buy” of Council House tenants to tenants of Housing Association houses, but if this happens it is likely that it will not apply in small communities; and there are other ways of making sure that the houses could not be sold. We have done something like this before at Hollands Close and Abbots Cottages.

The Parish Council has maintained a Parish Council Housing Needs register since the 1980s. This shows that there is a need, and who needs a house. It must now be brought up to date. If you or any member of your family needs a house in Corfe Castle please fill in the proforma enclosed with this CVN and send it to the Parish Clerk, Ali Burnett, 41 Bell Street, Swanage, Dorset, BH19 2RY Tel 01929 426125 or give it to Dragons Bakery, or Michael Bond (51 West Street).

If you have family or friends who have had to move out of the village because they could not find a house here please send them a copy of the proforma.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD.

Operation Christmas Child is a worldwide scheme to provide Christmas presents to very poor children who would not otherwise receive anything at Christmas. Amongst other places where parcels are delivered are countries in Africa, and countries in the very poor areas of Europe such as Bosnia, Serbia, Romania, Moldova, the Ukraine, and possibly Greece. There is a large and efficient system, much of it based on Christian churches, to collect presents, transport them to their destinations and distribute them to the children who really need them.



Corfe Castle Primary School has been involved in Operation Christmas Child for several years.

Parcels consist of a number of small presents fitted into a shoebox. Boxes may be packed with presents suitable for a boy or a girl within one of three different age ranges. Leaflets will shortly be available which explain very clearly the sort of presents which are suitable, and those which should not be included, and how to package them and prepare them for dispatch. A donation is requested to cover the costs of collection transport and distribution. Suggested amount £5.

This year members of the congregation of St Edward's Church will be coordinating the collection of boxes within the village.

Boxes collected in England are normally moved by truck to Eastern Europe. Parcels for Africa are collected in the USA and moved there by ship. Because of the time that it takes to collect up boxes and move them to their destination boxes have to be ready and collected in early November at the latest.



The Revd Ian Jackson writes:





Age UK Dorchester is advising older people living in Dorset, about the importance of caring for their feet. Due to health and mobility problems, older people can sometimes struggle to reach their own

feet, and they will develop some foot problems as they age, simply as a result of daily wear and tear.

Foot pain can be extremely debilitating, and over time it can become a significant health issue. If it becomes uncomfortable to walk for an older person, they are less likely to get out and about and take part in social activities or daily exercise that is vital for health and wellbeing.

It is also important for older people to get their feet checked regularly, especially if they have a long-term condition such as diabetes or arthritis, as their feet are particularly vulnerable, and any problems should be reported to the GP as soon as possible. The right footwear is also essential, and wearing comfortable, well-fitting shoes, is important.

Good nail care can also help to keep feet feeling comfortable; however, many older people find it hard to clip their toenails properly, partly as they can be hard to reach, but also because they become tougher with age - nails that become too long can press against the end of the shoe and the constant pressure can cause soreness, infection or ulceration. Toenails that have been poorly cut can also become ingrown.

Age UK Dorchester has recently expanded its footcare clinics throughout Purbeck - Wareham, Swanage, Bere Regis, and Wool.

John Hembrow Vearncombe

14th December 1929 – 15th August 2017



The funeral of John Vearncombe took place at Kimmeridge Church on 24th August. John moved to Swalland Farm in 1959 with his young family and with his son, Rob and grandson, George. They have farmed here ever since. Not that it was an easy life! Things got off to a difficult start with the discovery that the land had been an artillery range, used by American troops training for D-Day. The unexploded shells left behind resulted in Swalland Farm earning the rather dubious record of having the highest number of high explosive shells per acre in Great Britain. The stress and lack of income caused by the clearing of these explosives would have been enough for most mere mortals to throw in the towel and walk away. But John stuck at it and with sheer determination and a lot of hard work he and his family won through. They also received much help from the Mansel family, neighbours and the local farming community. Sadly, despite many battles, they never received compensation from the Government! In his spare time (do farmers ever have spare time?) he was chairman of the Village Hall Committee and the Purbeck Discussion Club. He and Pam also loved ballroom dancing – when they could find the time. John's passion for dairy cows laid the foundation of the Pedigree Dairy Herd that Rob and George work with today and he was always proud of this family business that he had set in motion all those years ago.


