## CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

### MAY AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

The Councils Annual General Meeting in May was attended by three members of the public. A parishioner reported they had found the finish of the new road surface bumpy and uneven to drive on, mainly due to the reused iron drain and gully covers which are old and worn. The job is not yet complete at the time of going to press and it was proposed by the Council there should be a handover with a representative from highways to ensure the required standard of work was met, the result of which I shall update you with in June. I hope the road works have not inconvenienced any residents or had a negative effect on local businesses; Dorset County Council were efficient at installing signage confirming that businesses were open as usual to try and reduce the impact of the resurfacing on trade. It was remarked that the new surface is quieter which is good news for those living on East Street and I hope they are in agreement. Please do feed back if you have any comments.

The Council said goodbye to the Perenco Community Liaison Officer, Suzie Baverstock, who attended the meeting. Suzie has been in post for ten years and has been of great support and assistance to the Council and in helping to fund projects such as the school mini bus and our new street lighting. The Council wish her every success in the future.

Helen Selby, Secretary of the Vintage Ploughing Committee presented a cheque to the Council for £1000 on behalf of Wareham and Purbeck Young Farmers and The Vintage Ploughing Committee. The Council would like to express their thanks and gratitude for the donation and thanks also to Helen for taking the time to visit. The money was raised specifically by those organisations for the defibrillator project and provides a huge cash boost to the cause. The Council voted unanimously to join the Swanage Defibrillator Partnership who gave a presentation at the Annual Parish Meeting in April. The Partnership have a wealth of experience in the provision, installation and maintenance of defibrillators and will undoubtedly offer excellent guidance in how to best move the project forward. Four volunteers have now offered their time to be 'Guardians' of the defibrillator units and I would like to take the opportunity to thank those people for their response to the Councils appeal. It would be really fantastic to have a larger team so if anyone would still like to volunteer to help service the units, a very simple and quick but invaluable task, we would be delighted to hear from you.

One of the procedures of the AGM is to elect the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Council and both Cllr Stephen Dru Drury and Cllr Michael Bond were re-elected respectively.

## CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

Comments were received at the Annual Parish Meeting in April that the area around the newly renovated public toilets in West Street is looking bare. Trees and larger shrubs were removed during the renovations by Purbeck District Council to prevent people using the rear of the toilets for their business rather than going inside, and it has indeed left it looking rather sparse. The Council is looking into a solution to this and will endeavor to get something in place to improve the aesthetics of the area.

The decision to purchase five litter bins was resolved, replacing some of the more tired looking bins in the Square, West Street and West Street Car Park. The Council has chosen sturdy bins which are able to be refurbished in the future and they aim to have the replacements in situ by the start of the summer season. There is then a rolling programme to replace subsequent bins in the village over the coming years.

Our new District Councillor Cherry Brooks attended to introduce herself and listen to any current matters arising. She advised she was looking forward to seeing the changes and the modernization of services which has been proposed by the newly elected Council. Cherry plans to attend Parish Council meetings to deliver her monthly report so do come along if you would like to hear her.

The National Trust reported they have had an excellent start to the year with a very successful and busy Easter at the Castle. They are working hard to remove rubbish that has accumulated in The Halves over decades and some of you have seen farm machinery and cars emerging! This will soon all be cleared so please don't be alarmed.

The Council considers all planning applications and submits comments to the District Council. The Parish Council had no objection to a proposal for the following: The erection of a single storey side extension in Littlemead, West Street, Corfe Castle.

## NEWS FROM CHURCH KNOWLE PARISH COUNCIL

There were two meetings at Church Knowle village hall on Tuesday 09<sup>th</sup> May; one was the Annual Parish Meeting (APM), at which it is hoped that a large proportion of the Church Knowle parish populace would be present and talk about what they might like to do as Parishioners during the next year and beyond, and the other one was the meeting of the Parish Council which followed on from the Annual Parish Meeting. Suffice it to say that neither meeting attracted hordes of Parishioners and public; in fact the only attendees at the APM were the Parish Councillors and one Parishioner from Cotness. Needless to say, the meeting didn't last long – twenty seven minutes – which was one minute longer than the previous year! During the APM, the retiring Chairman of the Parish Council gave his annual report on what the Parish Council had been up to during his year in office and a vote of thanks was given to him for his work done. The meeting also heard from the Chairman of Kathy Best's retirement from the Parish Council. She had served the community as a Parish Councillor for many years but had decided there was a need for some "new blood" on it. Consequently, there is now a vacancy. The Chairman had thanked Mrs Best for her years of commitment and the meeting noted her resignation and voted to thank her for her service. There was no public discussion and the meeting closed with the hope that more Parishioners might attend next year. The Chairman's annual report can be viewed on CKPC's website.

After 3 minutes and a bit of shuffling around of papers the May meeting of CKPC then began with Cllr Higgins in the Chair. Apologies were given for non-attendance and there was no public discussion of matters. After the Chairman reminded Members of the need to complete their annual declarations of interest he called the meeting to order so that a new Parish Council Chairman could be elected. Unfortunately, as happened last year, no Member was prepared to "take the baton" and there was a lengthy discussion about what to do about the unfortunate situation. The outgoing Chairman had previously informed the Council that he would not stand for the position and, indeed, that position had not changed. Consequently, Church Knowle Parish Council is without a permanent Chairman although one can be elected at the beginning of each meeting for that meeting. The Vice-chairman's position was also open. The Clerk advised the meeting that it had to have a chairman for the evening and, consequently, Colin Page (retiring Vice-Chairman) took the Chair and business continued.

One of the Councillors declared a pecuniary interest (family member) in a planning application to be discussed later. This was noted.

It was decided that the item of appointment of Members to positions of lead responsibility (e.g. planning matters, tree preservation, highways & rights of way, playground, etc., etc.) be held over for discussion till next month.

## NEWS FROM CHURCH KNOWLE PARISH COUNCIL

April's minutes were read and several matters arose from them. Cars are still being parked in an obstructive and thoughtless manner on the pavement and verges in Church Knowle village despite the request made in last month's CVN for car owners to have a little more thought for those pedestrians, wheel chair users and mums, etc., with baby buggies. Those who park vehicles on the verge by the entrance to the playground obstructing the view could help cause the death or serious injury to a child hit by a car or lorry when coming out from behind a parked car. It was decided the Clerk should contact Dorset Police to find out the criteria for unlawful parking before further action is taken. The Council is also looking at who owns the verge with the possibility of getting permanent, and aesthetically attractive, bollards installed to prevent such parking. Afterall, there is a parking lay-by immediately opposite and another just along the road on the same side for householders adjacent to the lay-bys.

Also discussed was what Members felt the ridiculous situation whereby a second planning application had to be put in to PDC because another rotten lintel behind an existing one, for which listed building consent had been previously granted for replacement, at Barnston Manor. The Clerk would be formally contacting PDC to express its concerns. The PDC councillor attending the meeting would also be enquiring and would report to a subsequent meeting. (He had arrived at this point in the meeting).

Two planning applications were examined and discussed; 6/2016/0203 – "Carefree Cottage", Furzebrook and 6/2017/0211 – "The Bungalow", Grange Road, Creech. Cllr Edwards, who had previously declared an interest in the first application left the meeting and only returned after the discussions and the decision of the Council, in this case to support the application, had been made.

Members then examined the second application and following long discussion it decided to object to the development on the grounds that the building was too high and would unacceptably impinge on the landscape and the "stables" did not appear to be sufficient for their intended use as animal housing as designed. It was also commented that entrance gates had been erected without planning permission.

The broadband junction box outside Knowle Cottage was again discussed and the Clerk reported on discussions he had with BT, PDC and Dorset County Council. An e-mail had been received from the broadband "organiser" at Dorset Broadband which in the Meeting's opinion was a completely unsatisfactory response to CKPC's concerns. It was decided to invite the writer to a CKPC meeting where the Council's concerns would be vigorously voiced to him; a bit like a US Senate grilling of a White House miscreant!

Members were given updates on dead trees clearances and on an ever-deepening pothole outside Imerys' yard in Furzebrook.

## NEWS FROM CHURCH KNOWLE PARISH COUNCIL

Now that our fingerpost on Grange Road is back in splendour after its refit Members decided last month that others in the Parish needed a "sort out". A survey has been done and the Parish Council which, apparently, now has responsibility for fixing them – thanks a bunch DCC - is now looking at how to bring them back up to a good standard. Finger posts are a historic and attractive part of the rural Dorset countryside and the Meeting felt they should be preserved. The Grange Road fingerpost shows what can be done, but at a cost.

The accounts were accepted as being in good order and invoices paid. Indeed, at the end of the fiscal year it would appear the Council finances were in a small surplus. However, there will be extra costs this year – already accounted for – due to DCC no longer doing their "non-core" highway functions such as gully emptying etc., which is now being given to parish councils to do and absorb the costs. Mmm, a good way of reducing county council costs but, unfortunately, the parish councils now have to find the money which eventually has to be paid by increasing the precept. So there's no money saved, is there? A ring-fenced account for "highways" will be discussed at the next meeting.

The Clerk reported that a Parishioner had very kindly donated £500 to be spent on the playground/playing field and this had been put into the Playground Account. Members thanked the Parishioner for her kindness and the past Chairman advised he had written in thanks to her.

The accounts are being audited by the independent financial examiner before being sent to the external auditor appointed by government, as happens with every parish council, and the Clerk reported on progress.

The cardiac defibrillator has now found a permanent site in Church Knowle village and should be in position by the time this edition of CVN is published. The Council is going to arrange an information session for Parishioners and all interested so that if needs be it can be used effectively.

The past Chairman reported he had sent CKPC's response on rural housing to the National Association of Local Councils and hoped they would take note.

Other items discussed during the closure period included recent burglaries in the area often associated with a white Transit-type van being nearby and incidents of a suspicious male in a green car "mooching about" and on being challenged on land advising the occupier he was "looking for scrap cars".

There was then general discussion about how PDC is dealing with CKPC's comments on the East Creech conservation area. The meeting was then closed by the acting Chairman. Next meeting at Furzebrook Village Hall – 7.30pm on 13<sup>th</sup> June.

The National Trust has promised to maintain public access to former quarrying land at Acton which is being restored for agriculture.

The Trust meanwhile welcomed calls for a meeting to discuss its plans and has asked Langton Matravers Parish Council to help organise it.

Land near the Acton service areas is being returned to agricultural use following the end of quarrying there.

The aim is to improve public access and conservation, and is in line with planning conditions imposed when permission to quarry the area was originally granted.

The land is initially being fenced off to allow grazing to take place and the Trust will look at replacing the fences with permanent dry stone walls in due course.

The Trust discussed its plans with Langton Matravers Parish Council 18 months ago when the current programme of work began.

However, some local residents have recently expressed fears they could lose access to what they see as common land.

Lead Ranger Jonathan Kershaw reassured residents that this was not the case.

“Our aim is to restore the traditional grazing which gives south Purbeck much of its character and conservation interest,” he said.

“In doing so we will improve and maintain access for local people and visitors alike.”

“All the existing rights of way have been kept open throughout this process and we will also be creating additional access points as the work progress.”

“Though many people think of The Highlands as common land, in fact it has always been subject to restrictions over its use. However, public access, alongside conservation, is at the heart of what we do as a charity and is something we want to promote at Acton as we do on all the land we look after.”

At the June meeting of Langton Matravers Parish Council, the Trust will be asking councillors to help facilitate an independently chaired public meeting to discuss the plans and to take part in a quarry restoration working group.

This group would report back to the local community through the parish council.


# CHURCH OF ENGLAND

**The Reverend Ian Jackson writes:**

When you read this the national ‘Thy kingdom come’ prayer programme will be over and the General Election will be days away.

‘Thy kingdom come ’ is an initiative taken by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York calling for nationwide prayer for God to renew his presence among us. This is the second year of such an initiative and Christians of all denominations and none will have taken part. The time of prayer has been between Ascension Day and Pentecost – a time when, traditionally, we ask god for a fresh outpouring of His Holy Spirit among us.

There will be those who consider that the time after an election is the time for prayer. I well remember one bishop saying during the debate concerning the ordination of women to the priesthood, in 1992, that prayer is as important, if not more so, after a decision has been made, than beforehand.

Basically, people of faith, sense the call to prayer at all times. There is a strong emphasis in the tradition of the eastern orthodox Christian churches that we pray at all times, and without ceasing. There is much that is helpful in this and other Christian traditions about this. Obviously, there are times we concentrate on what are doing at any given time and prayer is in the background. Equally, different ways of praying will be more helpful and suitable for some than others; with God, and perhaps some sort of guide, we discover the way god has given each of us.

We hope the Archbishops’ initiative will have been a time of growth and blessing in prayer and our following of Jesus; so much so that we continue in prayer day by day.

Just a few weeks ago, Chris and I were visiting friends in Castle Cary. After lunch, when we were about to go out for a walk, I realised that Chris was having a stroke. There was a lack of coordination and a speech defect. Two days ago, having just completed a Bible Study on two of Jesus' healings, a lady turned up at the Chapel, asking if there was somebody who would be willing to pray for her, in particular, a prayer for the healing of a painful back problem. This morning, our youngest daughter was on the telephone to tell us that Joanne, our eldest daughter, had been admitted to hospital because of her reaction to the chemo therapy that she is receiving because of her cancer.

Illness, and the need of healing, is an issue that either affects us personally, or it is something that affects those near and dear to us. Why is the National Health Service continually up for discussion at this time of the General Election? Because it personally affects so many of us. It is not a theoretical subject. It personally affects a large proportion of the population, and therefore it matters.

But before I go any further, let me make it clear what I am talking about, when I am referring to the need for healing. I am referring to the healing of the body, and of the mind, and of the emotions, and of the spirit. For me, every human being is made up of those four aspects, and all four aspects can be healthy, but, it is equally true to say, that all four aspects can be ill, and therefore in need of healing. It is also true to say that when one part of the human being is unwell, that illness can affect the other parts as well. We cannot confine an illness to one part of who we are. It spreads. A headache not only affects our body, it affects our emotions and our ability to think as well.

Would it surprise you to hear that, later this year, if the Church agrees, I am hoping to begin a monthly Healing Service. It won't be on a Sunday; it won't be at 10.30 or 11.00 o'clock; and it won't last an hour. It is even possible that there won't be any hymns. When I was ministering in Plymouth, I held such a service once a month, and I would like to do the same here in Corfe Castle.

Before anybody starts getting the wrong idea, let me explain my thinking

behind such a desire. For the last three Sundays, I have been preaching on some of the healings carried out by Jesus. Two miracles each Sunday for three Sundays. But those six miracles are not the whole story. If you cut out of the four gospels, the healing miracles of Jesus, then the New Testament part of your Bible would be in tatters. The healing miracles form a large part of the Good News about Jesus. But many of those who accept the healing miracles of Jesus, believe that such miracles ended, when the earthly life of Jesus came to an end.

When I return from my holidays, I am going to prove that that isn't true. On the first two Sundays in June, I am going to be preaching on the healing miracles performed, not by Jesus, but by His disciples, and these were while He was still alive. On the last two Sundays in June and the first Sunday in July, I will be preaching on the healing miracles performed by the apostles, when Jesus was no longer with them, physically. We will be looking at what Peter, Philip, and Paul were able to accomplish, with God's help. But even that won't be the end. In week's two and three in July, I will be preaching on what the early Church had to say about asking God to heal those who were ill. As you can see, we have quite a journey ahead of us, before we consider what should be taking place here in Corfe Castle.

This whole theme about what some might call spiritual healing, raises some important questions.

1. If God was able to heal 2,000 years ago, has God changed? Has God become decrepit and feeble in His old age?
2. Because we now know so much more about the human body and mind, has God handed over to the medical profession, what He was once happy to do Himself?
3. Because of the achievements of science and the medical profession in particular, is the need no longer there as it once was?

You won't be surprised to discover that I don't believe in any of the above. For me personally, it is a case of obedience. I do not believe that I have been given a particular gift, or even a particular calling. I want to pray for those who are willing to admit that they have a need for healing, simply because that is what I believe God is commanding me, and wants me to do. What happens after the prayer, that is in God's hands. There is so much that I do not understand about God and His ways, and because of that, I cannot guarantee that healing will take place immediately or even later. Sometimes He says "Yes". Sometimes He says "No". And sometimes He says "Wait". I refuse to play God and give false assurances. The call that I am hearing, is the call to obedience, and then to leave the outcome of our prayers in His hands.

If such a Healing Service were to take place, would you be willing to come? Would you come because you have a need, or would you come because a loved one is in need? I want us, not just me, I want us to pray for those who are present, and for those who can't be with us, for whatever reason. I want us to pray for those with physical illnesses but also for those with mental illnesses. I want us to pray for those who are worried and for those who are afraid; for those who have lost the desire to live, and for those who are scared of death. The needs are huge, but I believe that God loves each one, and cares about each one. I think about what could be and it scares me, but it also excites me.

I believe in a supernatural God, and I believe that He can act supernaturally, for the benefit of His children who live in this part of Dorset. When Jesus was engaged in the work that God had given Him, there were those who mocked and ridiculed what He was seeking to do. It may be the same here. But, if God's will is done, and the ill find health and wholeness, what does that matter?

Watch this space, for more news of what is going to take place here in Corfe Castle.



### Patrick Ward


