

NOVEMBER AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

The meeting began with residents of Jubilee Gardens expressing their concerns about an application submitted by Dorset County Council Highways, to 'stop up' an area of the highway at Jubilee Gardens. It was established that the residents did not object to the actual proposal on the table as it would appear not to inhibit access to Jubilee Gardens from the eastern end however they wanted it recorded that they would object to an application should it result in preventing access. Both access points to Jubilee Gardens are used frequently; closing one point of access would make it potentially hazardous to access and exit the unmade road. The parishioner advised that the right of way is listed in the deeds of the properties in Jubilee Gardens and should remain open.

Bridget Downton attended the meeting on behalf of Purbeck District Council's Planning Department. She had come to hear questions from the Council about the shape of the planning process after the local government reorganisation in April.

For parishioners applying for householder applications the process really should be relatively unchanged. Many of the officers who currently deal with delegated householder applications will continue to do so. This addressed concerns that applications would be being dealt with further afield by officers with little local knowledge. Bridget could not be categorical in her answers as until the new Dorset Council comes into being on the 1st May 2019 no one will know exactly how it will be structured.

It was noted that both Parishioners and Councillors are sometimes left frustrated with the planning process because the detail of why some applications result how they do is not always obvious. Bridget explained that all applications are judged within the framework of the National Planning Policy and there are always specific material reasons for which any application will be refused. Bridget advised she is happy to come and discuss specific planning refusals at Parish Council meetings should the Parish Council request it.

Bridget brought details to the meeting of how Councillors and Parishioners can respond to the Pre-Submission Consultation for the Purbeck Local Plan. Details of this will be posted on the Parish Council Website and submissions can be made until the 3rd December.

Cllr Brooks attended the meeting. She is keen to aid the Council in progressing the plans for Norden which is still very much on the Parish Councils Agenda. With growing tourism in the area the Council consider it imperative that cycle ways and footpaths are improved and that the

'masterplan' that was developed several years ago to improve parking and other facilities in the Norden area is carried forward.

District Councillor Dragon reported that the new railway units for The Swanage Railway are anticipated to be ready in spring next year, in time for the trial service from Corfe Castle to Wareham. At present the plans are to keep the new units in Corfe Castle and work is currently underway in the sidings to accommodate the inspection pits. The Cllr has received complaints about drones being operated over the village, further to recent complaints about aircraft noise. He asked the National Trust did they use drones? They confirmed that no they did not but they do echo his concerns and have noted a rise in the amount of drones flying over the castle. The Trusts concerns are that they could injure visitors to the Castle or damage the historic monument.

The National Trust reported that the parking at Uvedale will be barricaded off on Monday the 19th of November. This has been well advertised for some time and notice has been given to residents to explain the reasoning behind the closure. If anyone has any concerns please contact the National Trust. Following comments raised at the last meeting the National Trust are proposing to replace the barrier at Oli Vye's lane to prevent cycling though the lane. There is a garage at the back of Boar Mill which the Trust will be converting into a bat roost and they have designated staff who are working on this. During the October half term the Castle hosted special events over a two week period to accommodate half term visitors from different areas. This was really successful, they received fantastic feedback and welcomed just under 13,000 visitors.

The Parish Council considered and confirmed a response to the Governments call for evidence on National Parks and Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty. This consultation is highly relevant to our area. The Government want to know what you think works well and what could be improved in England's National Parks and Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty. We would encourage parishioners and business owners to have a look at the consultation and submit a response. More detail can be found on the Parish Council Website.

The Council is currently waiting to hear from Purbeck District Council with an update on the heads of terms for the transfer of the West Street Toilets and Car Parking Spaces. The Clerk has been researching the potential short fall that may need addressing in the event that the Parish Council do adopt the assets. In light of the recent budget announcement to grant rate relief to local authorities on public toilets the shortfall will not be as first anticipated.

They had no objection to proposals for the following: External repairs to roof, to renew valley to front in lead and replace 3 existing rooflights with 3 conservation rooflights at Bartholomews, The Square, Corfe Castle. A non material amendment to planning permission 6/2018/0057, to replace clay plain tiles on garden store roof with cedar shingles at Sandy Hills Farm. Sandy Hill Lane. To changes to existing doors & windows in rear lean to extension, to insert new first floor landing window, to replace flue in existing chimney stack and new clay pot and internal alterations including replacement staircase at Woolgarston Cottage 1 Sandy Hill Lane, Woolgarston. To the change of use of outbuilding to holiday accommodation at Woolgarston Cottage, 1 Sandy Hill Lane, Woolgarston. To a Power Generation Project at Wytch Farm, Corfe Castle. To demolish an existing lean-to and erect a single storey rear extension at 54 East Street. Corfe Castle. To erect an external staircase to provide access to first floor, to install a door in the north elevation at first floor level at The Old Cart Shed. Woolgarston.

The Parish Council objected to the erection of a shed at Corfe Castle Model Village, The Square, Corfe Castle on the grounds the proposed shed is too big for the area, too obtrusive and out of context in its surroundings



NEWS FROM CHURCH KNOWLE PARISH COUNCIL

The first of the winter meetings was held at the Church Knowle Reading Room with Cllr Higgens succeeding Cllr Burt as Chairman for the month until the December meeting. Five Parish Councillors, together with five members of the public & Parishioners also attended and took part in the public discussion period. The DCC and PDC councillors also arrived and contributed to the meeting.

November's meeting was a "Mini-meeting" and our reader will probably recall that this means that it deals primarily with planning and finance matters. And this, indeed, is what happened. Public discussion was taken up mainly with concerns about a planning application submitted for No 3 Tynham Road, Church Knowle and reports of what might be unlawful use of a property at The Old Blacksmiths complex in Grange Road. The Parishioners and public certainly made their feelings known, and during the "Planning Matters" section of the business meeting Councillors sought further information from them.

Following the legal "stuff" required of all meetings, including approval of minutes of the September and October meetings, declarations of interest, etc., the November meeting quickly moved on to "Planning Matters". The concerns about the proposed development at No 3 Tynham Road were looked at in greater depth during examination of the plans. There was a considerable discussion about the proposals and the Parish Council voted to object to the development as submitted to Purbeck District Council. The plans and CKPC's objection can be viewed on the dorsetforyou.com website.

The possibility of unlawful use of property at the Old Blacksmith's complex in Grange Road was then discussed and the Clerk advised that he had received a letter and telephone calls alleging use of a commercial/industrial building for habitation. Contact had been made with Purbeck District Council by several concerned residents and it was reported that a building control officer had recently visited the property. Members wondered why a planning enforcement officer had not visited and they decided that formal contact be made with PDC requiring such investigation. Church Knowle's PDC councillor asked for more information so he could take the matter up with the Head of Department of PDC's planning services.

Apart from a few minor matters, that was that and the meeting closed at 9:35pm.



We're going to be trying out some new management methods for Corfe Common over the coming winter in an effort to improve this species-rich area for the wildlife that depends on it.

A decline in grazing on the common has affected the delicate balance built up over centuries by allowing bramble and young gorse to thrive in some areas at the expense of the acid grassland it is famous for.

To counter this, in recent years we've been cutting back the emerging scrub every couple of years, but this method leaves a 'thatch' of dead material in place.

After discussions with residents and the Corfe Common Management Committee, this winter we will be trying out some alternative methods:

- Cut and collect, where the material is taken away after cutting,
- Burning in small areas, which would have been a traditional method of managing the common alongside grazing,
- Making up the material collected into bales so it can be used for animal bedding or biomass fuel.

Only emerging scrub will be targeted in this way: more mature gorse will be left in place to maintain a balance between scrub and open grassland which is good for birds.

This work is due to start in the New Year and be complete by the end of February. The effects will be monitored by our ecology team and the aim of the trial is to find a sustainable management technique which can be scaled up to make a real difference to the ecosystem.

Meanwhile, we are taking steps to encourage more grazing by increasing

permitted stock numbers and looking at ways to make boundaries more secure.

Residents can comment on plans to restore a former quarrying site at Acton to grazed farmland at a parish council meeting on 13 December, or by contacting the parish clerk in advance. The meeting at Langton Matravers Village Hall takes place at 7pm.

It follows a meeting for

residents in July when a number of issues were discussed, including fencing off the former quarrying site to allow grazing by sheep and cattle. December's meeting will be the last opportunity for residents to comment on the proposed fencing project, which is due to take place in January.

The Flourish project is a discovery programme where people of widely varying needs learn new skills, build confidence, make relationships and have fun, resulting in greatly enhanced wellbeing. Activities include horticulture, arts and ceramics. woodland therapy, bird watching and accessible camping. There are wheelchair accessible routes and off road trampers for hire. The whole area is open to the public for walking and simple enjoyment.







The Reverend Ian Jackson writes:

I think many would agree that Remembrance time this year had a very special character. As we recalled the events of 100 years' ago there was a strong sense of unity, our common humanity and a desire to continue to strive for peace, as so many did in the years after the First World War. This was true within the nation and between the nations. It was an inspiring time. In Corfe Castle the gathering in the Square for the silence at 11a.m. was a special time with many coming along. Our service at Tyneham, with its own particular circumstances, also had a special character.

And now we've moved on to celebrate Christmas. Even though there'll be moments we're weary with the busyness of it all, this too can be a time when people are drawn together. It is certainly a time when those not able to enjoy the celebrations, or indeed to take part in life fully, are remembered.

Matthew and Luke tell us about the birth of Jesus because they want us to know about the significance of Jesus' life, and to share in all that God makes possible through him. They do this by emphasising God's initiative, and so we hear about heavenly choirs, guiding stars and significant visitors. We've always to work out what the gospel writers are wanting to tell us; we don't have to dismiss the truth of their message because the way they express it is not immediately familiar to us.

Books have been written, music composed, pictures drawn, and great churches built to express the message of Jesus' life; all of these have their place. Hopefully, there'll be opportunities in the coming weeks to ponder the simplicity of God's presence among us - a new born baby, in very basic surroundings; to be reminded of the heart of Christian faith.

There are many ways we are inspired to work for peace and there is never a shortage of opportunities to do so. My prayer and hope is that Christmas will be a good and happy time, and we will know God's presence among us anew. As we share in the song of the angels we will both give glory to God and be drawn again into their message of peace.

Harman's Cross Movie Night

On Tuesday 11 December we're showing Spitfire at 7.30 in Harman's Cross Village Hall. Having recently run Darkest Hour we now look at our finest hour with a documentary about this iconic aircraft. Also from flying ace Tom Neil, also departed, who says, I hated taking off at dawn. Why in God's name couldn't we do it after lunch? Tickets £5 on the door, which will open, along with the bar, at 7pm.

Langton Arthouse Cinema

In January we're screening Journeyman on Wednesday 2 at 7.30 in Langton Matravers' Village Hall. Paddy Considine has written, directed and acted in this film about a boxer. But it's not really a film about boxing. The hero, Matty Burton (Considine), is a world middleweight champion from Sheffield whose prime has recently peaked. We see him in the ring just once, for a hard-won title

defence during which he sustains a grave brain trauma disrupting his entire life. The real fight is Matty's struggle for recovery, where victory is turning him back into a functioning husband to his wife Emma (Jodie Whittaker, our current Doctor Who) and a functioning father to their baby girl Mia. His identity as a lover, provider and local hero has been totally dismantled, and we watch him rebuild his own masculinity – a subject that cinema has never handled well. With honest emotions, without show or sentiment, Journeyman is an exception. Tickets £5 on the door, which will open at 7pm. Glasses will be supplied should you wish to bring your own drink with you. Volunteers are essential in helping to run the Centre - looking after the aquarium, conducting seashore surveys, helping with visiting school groups, and assisting with engaging visitors with Dorset's amazing marine life. If you can spare a couple of days a month and are keen to find out about how you can get involved, please contact the centre directly. No previous marine experience or qualifications are required, just a passion for marine wildlife.

In February there will be an open session at the Centre where you can come along and meet the team, ask questions and find out more about the variety of work we do. We provide monthly training sessions on a variety of Kimmeridge and marine wildlife related topics and organise trips and social events through the year. We're a friendly bunch and would love to welcome like-minded people to our team.

Winter Wild Seas

While the Centre is closed for the winter, opening again from 1st April 2019, life under the sea is as active as ever. At this time of year, some creatures are even thinking about breeding! Seashore limpets, for example, rely on the stormy seas to mix and fertilise their eggs which are released, along with sperm, to float around in the water. The developing larvae spend the winter in the plankton, drifting hither and thither until in early March they begin to settle on the rocks in low shore rockpools, with their conical limpet shells measuring just 1mm in length. They can live for 17 years, changing first into males and then into females as they grow. To look at them you would never think they led such interesting lives!




