CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

APRIL AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

There were three members of the public present at the April meeting. The Council had received notice from the District Council that the Corfe Castle Parish Council Election had been uncontested and that there would be nine Councillors elected on the second of May, two of whom will be new to the Council. If you were considering standing to be a Parish Councillor but did not complete the nomination paper there is still an opportunity for you to be on the Council. With nine of eleven seats filled at the forthcoming election the Council will still have two vacant seats into which they can co-opt two Councillors. If you are interested in being a Parish Councillor please do put your name forward to the Clerk. It is valuable for the Council to be full and representing a wide demographic of the Parish. You need to be enthusiastic, have an active interest in your local community and a concern for it. The Council would be very pleased to hear from you if you think you could fill one of the vacant seats.

The April meeting was the first meeting of the Parish Council since Purbeck District Council and Dorset County Council had been replaced with the new unitary Dorset Council. Cllr Dragon said that there was not much news to report from the Shadow Council but that he could update the Council on the Dorset Water Park which he had raised in March. The park have been given until the end of April to submit a retrospective planning application; should they not submit an application it is thought an enforcement might come into effect. The AONB have not yet made any comment as they are not in a position to do so until the application has been submitted.

Cllr Brooks advised that there had been closing down ceremonies of both Purbeck District and Dorset County Council. The officers are largely working in the same locations and they anticipate this to be the case for the next two to five years; both the Council and Parishioners are unlikely to notice any significant change. One difference will be the planning board which is represented by members from Purbeck and across East Dorset. There will therefore be Councillors that are not local on the planning board.

Cllr Brooks was invited to comment on a complaint made to Highways about the surface of the road outside of 41-43 East Street. She advised that she was not happy with the response that the PC had received and would be taking it further.

National Trust Operations Manager James Gould reported that the Robing room restoration work would commence on the 6th September 2019, with an estimated timescale of six weeks. Skips will be required and James will ensure they meet all the necessary regulations and requirements to be placed on the highway adjacent to the robbing room.

CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

The Trust are installing litter bins around the castle gates and will be doing litter picking patrols to help keep the village clean and tidy. The Trust will take full responsibility for removing rubbish from any of the bins that they install.

James had been asked to comment on a Parishioners letter regarding difficulties in accessing an allotment. She had been advised none were free, and that the Trust do not operate a waiting list. James put these points forward to his Rural Surveyor but had received no response. It was raised that one allotment had not been tended for years and an allotment tenant said it was part of the lease to manage the land.

The PC have requested James take this forward and try to get some answers. Why are these plots not being re-leased and can they consider a change of terms of licence if this would help? James has also been asked to find out why the Trust do not operate a waiting list.

The Council had received confirmation that the proposed scheme to create a cycle path and footpath from Norden to Castle View has potentially qualified for funding of £200,000 but that the project still needs much work to get it off the ground; seeking landowner consent being one of them. The Council proposed that a working group is formed within the new Council to drive this project forward and to work with the new Unitary Councillor. All Councillors were in favour of this and the Norden cycle path and footpath will be a rolling agenda item for the foreseeable future.

The Parish Council considers all planning applications. They had no objection to Internal and external alterations at Little Marlings, Higher Filbank, to internal and external alterations at Scotland Farm, Corfe Castle, to demolish rear conservatory and erect two storey side extension with room in the roof and attached carport at 10 Halves Cottages, Corfe Castle and to a single storey side & rear extensions and amendments at 7 Mead Road, Corfe Castle.

Corfe Castle Community Land Trust - 1st quarter 2019 update

The chairman gave a brief description of our aims and activities at the annual Parish Council meeting at the Village Hall on Monday 25 March. We remain intent on providing affordable homes exclusively for people with strong local connections and have established a housing needs plan which ensures this priority.

We meet monthly and have been focusing on two further previously identified shortlisted sites since the plans for the original West Street site fell through.

We are currently researching land titles and discussing potential plans with architects in the hope that we will then be able to progress detailed discussions with the landowners. We will provide further updates from time to time.

Church Knowle Reading Room was the venue for the Parish Council's April "mini"- meeting, which actually lasted a bit longer than one would have expected for a "mini"-meeting partly because of concerns regarding the cutting down of mature trees by the Dorset Wildlife Trust (DWT) in the conservation area of East Creech which is also within the Dorset Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty; but more of that later.

Five Parish Councillors were in attendance for the last meeting of the Parish Council before the May Local Government Elections. Our Dorset Council "Shadow Councillor" also attended along with five Parishioners and members of the public. Before the Public Discussion Period, two Members declared "pecuniary interests" in planning matters to be discussed later in the meeting and agreed to leave whenever their applications were discussed, and that included anything which might turn up during "public discussion".

During the Public Discussion, two Parishioners expressed their concern about the felling of trees by DWT. This had been going on for some time and it gave the impression of commercial logging. Noise pollution had been considerable and it also appeared that little concern had been paid to the effect on nesting birds. The Chairman noted that DWT rarely (if ever) communicated with the Parish Council when they were going to carry out work and discussion continued about the "coppicing" by DWT. The Chairman explained that a report would be presented later in the meeting and no doubt further information would be given then during which there would also be further discussion and the Parish Council's response on the matter would be formed.

Also during the public discussion period a representative of the Margaret Green sanctuary introduced himself and said he would be happy to explain the reasons behind the Trust's planning application. The Chairman invited the Parishioners, etc., present to comment - if they wished - on the applications to be discussed. The two Councillors with interests then left the meeting.

With regard to the Margaret Green application a resident and neighbour of the animal sanctuary commented that whilst the new building proposed would be 0.9m higher than the current old building which is very dilapidated and the proposed new building would certainly be an improvement and far more in keeping with the area. The Parishioner also commented on App No 6/2019/0133 relating to the construction of a porch at Dairy House, Bradle. He described the new building and felt that it would provide more storage facilities for the property's inhabitants and also that it was in keeping with the existing building and surroundings. The same Parishioner commented on the planning application submitted for development at Bucknowle Farm (6/2019/0172); and there was then some discussion about all the applications. The Chairman then brought the meeting to order and Cllrs Parker and Ellwood returned to the Meeting.

At that point, the Chairman retired and there then had to be an election, as had been the case at each meeting during the year, for a Chairman of

Meeting. This was done and Cllr Higgens took the Chair. There was no Vice-chairman elected.

The Minutes for March's Parish Council meeting were read and after some errors were fixed they were duly approved. Under "Matters Arising" The Barnston Cross finger post missing fingers were discussed and the Meeting heard that the firm making the fingers would be erecting them imminently. Also, the Clerk reported on the progress of an advisory sign suggesting that the road to Puddlemill and Bradle was unsuitable for HGVs. It was pointed out by the Chairman that, originally, it had been suggested the sign should state that it was unsuitable for coaches and caravans. The Clerk was asked to contact Dorset Highways regarding suitable signage together with a request to campsite owners in Kimmeridge and the Etches Museum that their directions to those venues should be prefaced with "Do not use Satnav" as many vehicles are being directed along the Bradle road by their Satnavs. There was then some discussion about the fact that only licenced coaches were permitted along the road through Church Knowle anyway, but the Clerk advised he would discuss this with the Dorset Council highways engineer. The Clerk informed the Council he received e-mails from "Highways" advising him of the dates and identity of organisers concerned. He would ask "Highways" to also give him the names of the coach companies and that way any coach operating miscreants could be identified and reported to the "appropriate authority" (police/Dorset Council).

During "Matters Arising", it was reported that one of the Parish Councillors had noted that most of the work being carried out by DWT on the Corfe River project seemed to be done by volunteers. That being the case, she wondered where all the money allocated by the Environment Agency to this project, which had been originally thought up by the Parish Council, was being spent. The Meeting found this of considerable interest and felt this needed to be looked into.

Then came "Planning". Planning application 6/2019/0133 which related to the building of a porch at The Dairy House, Bradle was examined and the comments made during Public Discussion were taken into account; Members decided that the comments were valid and that the proposal was "making good" a poor existing structure and that the new porch would be an improvement. They, therefore, voted they would have no objection to the proposal. Next up came the Margaret Green Animal Sanctuary application No 6/2019/0111 to replace an existing building with a new, more in keeping one which would be of a permanent nature rather than the continuing temporary one there at present. Councillors voted that they had no objections to the proposals.

At this point, the two Councillors who had previously left the meeting during "Public Discussion" braced themselves for the cold again as they left the meeting while their applications were discussed. First up came application 6/2019/0123 which was for the replacement of the thatched roof and associated timbers, etc., at 2 Cotness (previously known as "Periwinkles" - so

that there's no confusion, of course). Members examined the plans and application and found no reason to object to it. They then examined application 6/2019/0122 which related to building a new barn and covered yard at Bucknowle Farm. Again, they voted that they had no objection to the development. Luckily, there were five Members in attendance at the meeting otherwise when the two "interested" Councillors temporarily left, the meeting would have been inquorate and their applications could not have been considered. This, dear reader is why the Parish Council is desperate to fill its vacant positions. The two Councillors then returned to the fold and everything carried on to the next item.

Under "Unlawful Developments", there was discussion about "Grange Café" and another pop-up food outlet which appeared to have been set up in the Old Blacksmith's complex in Grange Road. The Clerk advised he would contact Dorset Council and would report back to Members at the next meeting.

The accounts were presented and the finances appeared in good order. Invoices were paid and the Clerk reported that whilst the precept had been agreed by Dorset, the money had still not appeared in the Parish Council's bank account. The budget headings for 2019-2020 were put over till the May meeting for discussion.

The curating of the archives, an absolutely mammoth job, was well underway and planning applications going back years were being collated and made more accessible for enquiries.

Next up came a report on the felling of trees by DWT at the unique Ash coppice of Furlongs Coppice. DWT and Natural England had been in discussion with the Parish Council's Tree Officer who was extremely concerned about what was being done. He described the concerns about a very rare orchid, the Twayblade, which grows in the area and could be at risk from the "deforestation". The noise pollution, at weekends and bank holidays, was such that residents' peace was being badly affected. There appeared to be complete lack of communication from the DWT to CKPC and local residents. Tree felling was also taking place after the recommended cut-off date of February 28th after which farmers and other lesser mortals are not supposed to carry out "tree work" because that's when most birds start trying to build nests in trees and bushes. But, of course, according to Natural England, DWT etc., are "exempt". Members discussed the report and it was suggested that representatives of DWT should attend a Parish Council meeting to explain to Parishioners what they are trying to do. The Clerk would try and arrange this for the June meeting.

The meeting then heard from Dorset Cllr Brookes what has been happening at the new council in Dorchester since it officially came into being on April Fools' Day and how the work of the Parish Council will continue as usual.

And that was that for April. The next meeting will be on 14th May following the Annual Parish Meeting at Church Knowle Reading Room. The Annual Parish Meeting will begin at 7:00pm.





From the Reverend Ian Jackson:

The words following are an extract from the sermon the Bishop of Salisbury preached in the Cathedral on the morning of Maundy Thursday. This is an occasion when ministers and others from throughout the Diocese gather.

The Bishop introduces words he is developing about what is important in our current times. I think they will be helpful. We may or may not agree with everything. What is important is that we consider these matters carefully.

Part of the Sermon preached by the Bishop of Salisbury in the Cathedral on the morning of Maundy Thursday.

The sorts of things that matter in these difficult times that are ours in Christ are worth setting out both for our own sakes and for the sake of the world God loves so much that he sent his Son Jesus Christ among us. I have had a few goes at doing this recently. Here's a start of the sort of things you might want to develop and make your own.

Love God and love your neighbour as yourself. I am not the centre of my own story. Don't forget that everyone is our neighbour. Churches are among the very few places in our community that exist not for themselves but for others. So people can gather across all sorts of divisions. Our purpose is worship and loving service so that God's kingdom of justice, peace and love is seen to be very near.

Love begins at home but it does not stop at home. What we learn in our family, community, country, teaches us to love more generally. The world does not divide between people who live somewhere and those who could live anywhere. Love everywhere has to begin somewhere.

That's why patriotism matters. Love of country teaches us love of world. Charity begins at home but does not stop at home. And so on.

As church we are global. Every church is the world's local church. If we choose to, we have the capacity to live as people who know what is happening in our world and not be overwhelmed by it but by the grace of God respond creatively to it.

Be reverent with creation. Use it well. Give thanks for everything. This is a fragile earth, love the gift God has given us and take good care of it both for itself alone and for the sake of others, including those who come after us.

Be kind to and about one another and recognise the importance of forgiveness in your own and other people's lives. Be generous because God has been generous to you.

In this world of alternative facts it is difficult to know the truth but be a people who are about the truth and are willing to be accountable to it because we know the truth will set us free.

What strikes me every time I say the Eucharistic prayer, is how the actions of breaking bread and drinking wine, carry us in every circumstance, wounded and blessed, broken and thankful. The healing is in God's presence. The miracle is in being renewed, and in being able to give thanks for everything.



Harman’s Cross Movie Night

On Tuesday 14 May we’re showing Vice at 7.30 in Harman’s Cross Village Hall. This follow-up to The Big Short, from director Adam McKay, is another dark satirical comedy. Vice is a biopic of Dick Cheney, spanning fifty years from his drink-driving conviction at the age of 21 to his heart transplant at 71. After introducing its central figure as a callow, boozy drop-out, the film moves into the immediate aftermath of the September 11th attacks, with the middle-aged Cheney, played by Christian Bale, barking orders on the President’s behalf. Vice pins the current disarray in Washington squarely on Cheney who,

the film suggests, had an outsize influence in reshaping the right wing in America after Nixon’s resignation. He was Secretary for defence under the late George H.W. Bush. Then, during the Clinton presidency was CEO of energy giant Halliburton, before the naive young Dubya called him back as vice-president – a job he effectively reconfigured as power behind the throne, and in front of it. Cheney was in charge, and set about replacing coherent conservative ideology with the pursuit of power for power’s sake. This film is angry, educational and clever in many ways. Tickets £5 on the door, which will open, along with the bar, at 7pm.

Langton Arthouse Cinema

In June we’re screening Even When I Fall on Wednesday 5 at 7.30 in Langton Matravers’ Village Hall. This film is the incredible true story of Nepal’s first circus set up by survivors of human trafficking. It traces Saraswoti and Sheetal’s journey after being sold to corrupt Indian circuses. Over six years they confront the families that sold them, seek acceptance within their own country and begin to build a future. They struggle against the odds and without education, but these girls were left with a secret weapon by their captors - their breath-taking skills as circus artists. With eleven other young trafficking survivors, they form Circus Kathmandu. As they take the bold step of bringing an unrecognised art form to the stages of Nepal, they simultaneously challenge the deep-seated stigma against trafficked women. They discover the courage to perform in front of growing crowds and the strength to address their past. We travel with them in the rich beauty of the Kathmandu Valley, through the poverty-stricken border towns of the Terai plains and finally to the Big Top at Glastonbury Festival. Through this journey they use the crowd’s rapt attention to spread a message – to educate against modern slavery. A film that is both heart breaking and, unexpectedly uplifting. In Nepali with English subtitles. Tickets £5 on the door, which will open at 7pm. Glasses will be supplied should you wish to bring your own drink with you. Therefore, let's be people who choose to walk in anther persons shoes.




