### **CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL**

#### JUNE AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

The first item on the agenda was the consideration of applications received to fill the two vacant seats on the Council following the recent election. The Council duly co-opted Cllr David Grinsted who previously served as a Councillor in the last term and Cllr Mandy Platts. Welcome to both new Councillors.

During the public half hour David Walker expressed his concerns and those of his neighbours about traffic in West Street. David stressed the increased volume of traffic is created by things beneficial to the village; the surgery, the sports pavilion and local businesses. Nevertheless, traffic is a problem and he noted blind bends, inconsiderate parking, excessive speed, delivery vans and poor signage as some of the problems. David suspects little can practically be done but asked the Parish Council to consider his comments when considering any future plans to build in or off West Street. Jonathan Kershaw, Chair of the Commons Committee, reported on the structure and constitution of the Committee. He invited the PC and parishioners to attend the AGM in July and to raise any queries they have regarding the common or the committee. Paul Jobbling spoke on behalf of the Chamber of Trade and Commerce and reported that there is a renewed enthusiasm in the community for the Chamber of Trade; business owners are stepping forward to take active roles and they aim to promote the village through social and digital media.

James Gould, **National Trust** Operations Manager, reported the Castle had received 17,000 visitors over the half term, 3000 of which had attended the May Fair which had been a huge success. The National Trust plan to put more robust barriers in place as a further measure to prevent parking adjacent to the old garage at Uvedale.

The Council have requested updates from **The Corfe Castle Community Land Trust**. The Council do not have any prior knowledge of potential sites for development until they are presented to the village, nor have they intent to do so, but they would welcome regular updates of general news.

Following the Easter bank holiday rave the Council had resolved to write to both Dorset Police and Dorset Council to ask what powers they had in place to prevent future events occurring and what resources they had to exercise any powers. Cllr Clarke has received a response from Mike Rogers at Dorset Police. He reported that they do have the power to issue a rave prohibition order, but this can only be activated when music has started which in practice is often too late. The Police advised that the local authorities do not have powers to stop events. Cllr Clarke has requested Mike seeks to

lobby for greater powers which can prevent a rave at the planning stage. The Police ask the public to tell them using 101 as soon as a rave is suspected.

The Council debated advertising in the village which had been highlighted as a problem. There are concerns about businesses placing illegal signage on roundabouts, roadsides and in the Square. In the past Dorset County Council Highways guidance looked favourably on charity advertising providing it was taken down promptly but discouraged business advertising. The Council had in the past adopted this guidance. They were interested to know what legislation the new Dorset Council were issuing on the subject and the Council will be making enquires with the County Councillor prior to asking her to discuss the subject with local businesses.

Following Dorset Council's recent declaration recognising that there is a **Climate Emergency** the Council was approached with a request to declare an emergency themselves. They considered a motion and resolved to declare; 'Corfe Castle Parish Council recognise that climate change is happening and support the declaration of a climate emergency by Dorset Council'. They have established a group to focus on ways in which the Parish Council can take positive practical action.

Parking at the end of Webbers Close has been a reoccurring problem. Offending cars reduce visibility, posing a hazard to those pulling out of the close. The Parish Council have composed a letter and have distributed it to residents in Webbers Close who have kindly agreed to put them on offending cars.

The Council **formed a working group to focus on parking in the village.** Several items were noted to be considered by the group; West Street traffic, the lack of disabled parking, parking in the Square and parking in Station Road. The Chair proposed Cllr Dru Drury organise the group. The first meeting will be pooling ideas to address the problems identified. The group plan to invite the NT and the County Councillor to subsequent meetings. Comments and suggestions from parishioners are welcome.

In financial matters the Council approved the quote for services provided by Purbeck Youth and Community Foundation (PYCF) for the provision of staff for the Youth Club under the same arrangement agreed in previous years; that they would ask the Youth Club to raise some funds themselves to contribute to the fees. The Council completed the annual governance statement for the external audit. They approved the internal audit, the asset register and the accounting statement for the 2018/19 accounts. These documents can be inspected by the public in accordance with the *Accounts and Audit regulations 2015 Exercise of Public Rights* and they have been published on the Parish Council website and notice boards.

### **CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL**

New planning procedures implemented by the Dorset Council have resulted in the Parish Council only being allowed 21 days in which to submit comments on planning applications, as opposed to the 28 previously allowed This will mean that some applications may not get published on the planning agenda and the notice boards prior to the Councils comments being submitted, nor will these applications get discussed at the meeting. Instead the submitted decision will be reported at the meeting. The Council have written to try to challenge the new policy as it will effect public participation in the planning process and increase administration for Parish and Town Councils. We would therefor ask that residents look out for planning notices (which are usually yellow and displayed outside of site proposed for development). If an application affects you and you wish to comment or ask questions, please make representation to the Clerk or a Councillor.

The Parish Council had no objection to works to a single story kitchen extension at 4 Townsend Road, Corfe Castle, Wareham. The Council have requested an extension to submit comments on the erection of a barn at Little Woolgarston Farmhouse, Corfe Castle. The extension will allow the committee to see submitted comments from the AONB, from neighbours and from Highways prior to submitting their decision.



### **NEWS FROM CHURCH KNOWLE PARISH COUNCIL**

For the first time in several months the Parish Council met at Furzebrook Village Hall; albeit in a small corner of the main hall. It felt a bit like being in the empty hold of a rather large cargo ship before container ships were invented. Four Councillors were able to attend, the others having to apologise due to serious illness and work commitments. As our dear reader will know, the Council is two Members short of a "full house" and this can lead to difficulties when Members are ill or are unable to attend for other reasons. Anyway, to business.

Firstly, Cllr Ellwood declared an interest in a "Past Planning" matter which he thought might be discussed later and this was noted.

Dorset Wildlife Trust had been invited to the meeting to give an update and answer questions about their work in managing the "Corfe River Project" and at Furlong Coppice, Kilwood & Stonehill. Unfortunately, no-one was able to attend so there was some disappointment. Never mind, the new Police Community Support Office from Dorset Police stepped in and gave a report on the activities of miscreants in the community in the last three months which included thefts of a new "mini"-digger, a bicycle and a car parked in Tyneham car-park. She also commented on the theft of a yacht, but it was difficult to see how that could have occurred in Church Knowle parish unless it had been parked in the Blue Pool, Green Pond or the small bit of water by Church Knowle village green. Mind you, it might have been parked in someone's garden or boat park at the time but the PCSO didn't really expand on that. What did come out was that in the Parish itself, the amount of crime was pretty low. The main concern was with sheep rustling and poaching. One of your Councillors explained that the attitude of the "non-emergency" telephone team at Dorset Police's "Force Control Centre" was far from satisfactory when a particular high value theft was reported, ie the answer was, 'There's not much we can do about it, the digger's probably in Poland by now'. Well, really! The PCSO suggested that there were several ways to reduce risk of theft and that "trackers" could be cheaply fitted to equipment whereby the constabulary could easily follow a stolen item and catch the crooks "banged to right". There was general discussion following and the Chairman thanked the PCSO for her visit and fruitful presentation.

The Chairman (Cllr Ed Ellwood) then resigned and Cllr Parker took the Chair. The meeting then continued. As this was "Mini-meeting", there was not really very much on the Agenda. The minutes for the May meeting were accepted and the only matter arising was that the pot-hole and road collapse at East Creech had been fixed. No new planning application consultations had been

requested by the Dorset Council planners and the meeting quickly went on to note the results of planning application on which the Council had previously commented. Cllr Ellwood then again declared an interest, but as the application had been discussed at a previous meeting and do decision was going to be made on it, Cllr Ellwood's interest was noted and the Clerk suggested no further action was necessary.

The monthly accounts were presented and found to be in good order. Invoices were paid and the Clerk reported on the current audit of the 2018-2019 Annual Accounts.

The curating of the Council archives is just about complete and they are now looking for a new home. It was suggested that a small, secure Portakabin<sup>®</sup> of the type used by a site gatekeeper be purchased second hand a [possibly sited at Church Knowle village hall – that is if the village hall committee agree. Full discussion will take place next month.

Cemetery access, etc., was adjourned until the next meeting. The Clerk had approached three fencing contractors for quotes to repair and renew the cemetery fencing and it was also reported that a contractor had agreed as part of his quote to remove the dead tree gratis. When the formal quotes are received they will be discussed and the award of contract made, most likely at the July meeting.

The Council then went on to discuss the Environmental Project. The Parish Council's lead councillor had attended a meeting with Imerys on 23<sup>rd</sup> May and had asked for the costings from Dorset Wildlife Trust. She reported she had been promised the accounts for the Church Knowle part of the project but was a bit disappointed that nothing else was available for CKPC to look at considering this was "public money" that was being spent by a charity and considering that many of the workers were volunteers she felt that more transparency on the way the money was being spent was urgently required. All the Councillors agreed and again they expressed their disappointment that noone from DWT was present to be "grilled" at the June meeting. It was suggested that a letter to the Chief Executive of DWT be sent inviting him rather than his subordinates to the August meeting. This was agreed and the Clerk told all he would draft a letter for agreement of Members and then send it.

And, apart from a few bits and pieces that was that for June. July's meeting will be at the Church Knowle Reading Room at 7.30pm on Tuesday the 09<sup>th</sup>.



### **Shingles vaccination**

Shingles is a common disease that can cause long-lasting, severe pain. It occurs more frequently in those over 70 who are also more likely to have worse symptoms and it has been known to cause permanent disability.

The vaccine significantly reduces the number of cases of shingles and will reduce the severity of symptoms in vaccinated people if they develop the disease. The vaccine cannot cause shingles in healthy people.

As soon as you turn 70 you are eligible for the shingles vaccine. Anyone born on or after 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1942 and those aged 78 or 79 are also eligible for the shingles vaccine.

Cattle have grazed Purbeck's heathland for centuries, but today's high-tech herds have joined the digital age with National Trust graziers using smartphones and satellite technology to track their movements and improve conservation.

**Trust**Red Devon cattle help maintain the natural balance at several
National Trust nature reserves, including Studland and Godlingston Heaths and

Hartland Moor near Corfe Castle.

The herds are descendants of cattle which did the same job for landowner Ralph Bankes, who donated his entire estate to the Trust following his death in 1981.

The red Devons have always spent much of their time wandering freely in search of the best grazing, but the difference today is that graziers can see where they are in real time thanks to a phone app.

The app is linked via GPS satellite to electronic collars worn by members of each herd which report their position every 30 minutes.

The collars also record body temperature and how much individual cattle move around, so their health can be monitored.

Not only does this mean less time and money is spent keeping an eye on them, it also provides valuable information for conservationists.

Conservation grazing is one of the main tools used to protect the heathland ecology by preventing grasses from becoming too dominant and opening up areas of bare ground which are important for species such as basking lizards.

The cattle also have a role in helping plants colonise new areas by moving seeds around.

Data from the collars will be used to monitor how effective they are being and target priority areas for grazing.

*In the future, it could also play a part in allowing the cattle to live a more* 'natural' lifestyle with less human intervention.

There is evidence that the closer grazing animals can mimic the behaviour of wild herds, the greater the benefits for biodiversity, said National Trust Ecologist David Brown.

"Grazing is at the heart of our efforts to create a more dynamic landscape full of wildlife", he added.

"Cows with GPS collars may seem nothing to do with conservation, but are another step forward for nature in Dorset."

Our speaker for June was Alison Kemp, daughter of Chris and David, to whom she attributes her love and respect for nature and the environment. She is now a Waste Consultant in Cardiff, advising on a range of environmental issues.

Ali brought along a range of waste materials and tested members' awareness by asking whether or not they could be recycled. She also showed examples of the end results of various recycled materials such as fleeces, pens, pencils and much more. Members interacted enthusiastically with her presentation, asking questions and referring to examples such as swimsuits made from recycled plastic and plastic bottles stuffed with small plastic bags which can be used as building blocks.

Landfill waste is now taxed by the tonne and additionally councils now have to meet recycling targets. The UK target is 50% by next year; we may be pleased to know that Dorset manages to recycle 59%, well above the 46% currently achieved across England as a whole, though falling short of East Yorkshire's 65%!

Ali explained the multi-level process of sorting waste when it reaches the depot. It passes along conveyor belts and is separated into different categories with the aid of magnets, sieves and optical sorters with real people still a vital part of the process. Some types of waste are very easily re-used; paper can be pulped and made into more paper; glass can be re-used an unlimited number of times. It is far better to re-use materials than to rely on production from new raw materials – better economically as well as environmentally. Let's keep up the effort and continue to improve Dorset's recycling record!

### Time to celebrate!

As of the 31st of May 2019, 41 new Marine Conservation Zones (MCZs) around the British coast were announced, six of which are in Dorset! These include; Albert Field, Southbourne Rough, South of Portland, Studland Bay, West of Wight Barfleur and Purbeck Coast. The six sites in Dorset are designated for different species and habitats. The Purbeck Coast MCZ and the other five sites should improve conservation of Dorset's seas for present and future generations.

### **Purbeck Coast Marine Conservation Zone**

The Purbeck Coast MCZ stretches from Ringstead Bay in the west to Swanage Bay in the east along the Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site, covering an area of 282 km<sup>2</sup>. Although this site is mostly made up of seabed below the low tide mark, it also includes a small area of seashore in Kimmeridge Bay.

### **Importance**

The new MCZs together with other types of marine protected areas, form a network throughout British seas as part of the UK's international agreement. The Purbeck Coast MCZ supports a variety of rocky and sediment habitats and is an important nesting area for Black Bream, a fish that excavates large nests on the seabed for its eggs. The male Black Bream guards the eggs and tends them until they hatch. Additionally, the seashore section provides a critical habitat for the Peacock's tail seaweed, a warmer water species that is rare in England but found in the rock pools of Kimmeridge Bay. The rock pools also provide a home to Stalked jellyfish which use their 'stalk' to attach onto seaweeds. Rare and unusual seaweeds found in Kimmeridge Bay include the tamarisk weed, which 'magically' changes colour from brown when out of water, to an iridescent blue colour when underwater! This area is also important for some unusual rock pool fish, including the Montagu's blenny, Connemara and Shore clingfish.

#### The Reverend Anne Bond writes:

At the end of April, I was without wi-fi, internet, broadband, email, *everything* that makes communication with people via laptop-computer possible, for almost a month ... and I was startled by the sense of helplessness and frustration I experienced. How did we exist before these modern miracles were invented? I suppose we just tolerated the leisurely process of snail-mail and picked up the telephone if it was really urgent.

Did you know that Humanity is the only species in the world to have the physiological equipment for verbal communication? Isn't that extraordinary? I have read somewhere that in other creatures there is a valve far back in the throat that closes when food is taken in to prevent it going down the wrong tube and into the lungs. Apparently, humans don't have this valve, and it is this lack that has allowed the development of speech. The price we pay for this privilege is that absence of the valve allows us to choke, occasionally to death.

I can't help wondering if brain development led to eventual elimination of the valve, or if we never had it in the first place. Did the Almighty make us in the beginning with the ability to speak? Or did our brains decide that intelligible speech was preferable to grunts and squeaks, and evolution obliged?

In other words, is the ability to communicate with others of our species via the spoken word a unique God-given facility that He intends us to use to further His purposes? Those purposes being the establishment of the Kingdom of God on Earth, a kingdom based on selfless love of God and of neighbour, and all the good things that come from that way of thinking and being. If so, it is quite a responsibility.

Can we regard the *written* word as a sort of speech substitute? Or is it so different from speech, it is a separate talent? Writing comes from the intellect; one searches for the right word to convey the exact meaning; whereas speech is spontaneous and from the heart, and as such is perhaps more truthful. Besides, God didn't *write* the Universe into existence; he *spoke* it into existence ... or so we read ...

But still, I did so badly need to be able to email. I stammered as a child, so the spoken word spelled difficulty to me. The telephone became an instrument of torture; at my worst I couldn't say my own name. Except when I press 'send' by mistake, too soon, to me email seems quite wonderful!

### Living with loss

Death is very real and it's all around us, on the TV, News, online.... We must all reckon with death. Someday we will all confront our own end, but along the way, we will also witness beloved friends and family pass from this life to the next.

Do you feel overwhelmed by grief and sorrow? How do we handle loss?

When a person loses a loved one, everyone reacts differently and this is normal. Whether you are a believer or not, you will feel something, and react a certain way. You may have recently lost someone you dearly loved. It may have been a spouse of many years, a child of only a few months, a loving father or a trusted friend. No matter what the relationship, the separation has been painfully agonizing and it feels like a hole has been torn in your soul that cannot be mended. No sorrow is deeper than the sorrow of loss.

No matter how deep your pain God can help you find comfort and hope. He gives us peace that the world does not understand. God can be with us in our most lonely moments. There is a safe haven of rest in the midst of a painful world.

### Jesus said... "I will never leave you nor forsake you"

In the valley of grief, where the way is tortuous and we are so unsure of ourselves, we learn to trust God. Trust enables us to maintain perspective by 'walking by faith, not by sight', as we go through the experience. Otherwise we lose our way and get hopelessly lost in despair.

As our good Shepherd, He leads us safely through "the valley of the shadow of death" (Psalm 23:4b) Remember, a shadow indicates that there is a light on the other side! Jesus is our best role model for combining faith and grief, as revealed in Mary and Martha in anguish over the death of their brother Lazarus. He wept and groaned. He still allowed Himself to feel and express the depths of human sorrow. Ecclesiastes 3:1,4 says "To everything there is a season, a time for every purpose under heaven: a time to weep, and a time to laugh: a time to mourn, and a time to dance." The Bible tells us how God comforts His people in times of sorrow and loss.

# AMBITIOUS £350,000 APPEAL LAUNCHED TO RETURN UNIQUE VICTORIAN STEAM LOCOMOTIVE TO FULL WORKING ORDER

An ambitious appeal has been launched to raise £350,000 to return a unique Victorian steam locomotive – that escaped the scrapman's torch thanks to the centenary of London's Waterloo station in 1948 – to full working order so it can again haul trains through the Isle of Purbeck.

The Swanage Railway Trust's 563 Locomotive Group hopes to raise the money needed to return 1893-built London and South Western Railway T3 class 4-4-0 wheel arrangement locomotive No. 563 to steam in two years.

563 Locomotive Group chairman Matt McManus said: "This is one of the most exciting locomotive restoration projects of the last 25 years – a unique project that will bring a locomotive most people thought would never steam again back into life on the railway that it was built for.

The T3-class steam locomotive was donated to the Swanage Railway Trust, a registered charity, by the National Railway Museum in May, 2017.

The decision of the Swanage Railway Trust to return No. 563 to steam for the first time in more than 70 years followed a detailed mechanical inspection of the locomotive at the Flour Mill workshops at Bream near Lydney in Gloucestershire's Forest of Dean.

After No. 563 was stripped down to its component parts, it was found that the locomotive was in a good mechanical condition and that restoring the T3 to full working order could be achieved. Matt McManus explained: "The T3 allows us to go right back to the very start of railways in Dorset. No. 563 enables the Swanage Railway Trust to show how railways connected rural and coastal communities in the Victorian and Edwardian periods.

"The T3 was built in 1893 - just eight years after the Swanage branch line

opened in 1885 – with No. 563 being used to bring express passenger trains from London to Corfe Castle and Swanage which created a legacy of tourism that remains to this day.

"The T3s were known as strong, free steaming and fast locomotives and we expect that No. 563 will be able to handle five-carriage trains on the Swanage

Railway with relative ease," he added.

Swanage Railway Trust chairman Gavin Johns said: "The decision to restore the T3 to full working order – so it can again haul trains in the Isle of Purbeck for the first time in some 90 years – demonstrates the Trust's commitment to creating a living link to the very start of the railway that we have preserved to this day. "The restoration of the No. 563 will allow us to show a period when the branch line railway from Wareham to Corfe Castle and Swanage was an exciting, colourful and modern addition to a rural community.

T3 class No. 563 was withdrawn by the Southern Railway at the end of the Second World War in August, 1945, by which time it had run a total of 1.5 million miles. During its long working life, the T3 class locomotives hauled trains from London on the west of England main line, across Dorset and down to Corfe Castle and Swanage.

Designed in 1890 by William Adams – one of the greatest locomotive designers of the 19th century – for smooth running at up to 80mph, and built at Nine Elms in London, the 81-tonne No. 563 was not scrapped in 1948.

Instead, the unique locomotive – that carried three tonnes of coal and 3,300 gallons of water – was selected for restoration and display at London's Waterloo station centenary celebrations during 1948 in a move that guaranteed the preservation of No. 563.




