JULY AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

David Brown, National Trust ecologist for the Purbeck Estate presented the NT's conservation agenda to the Council. At present there are two National Nature reserves in the vicinity of the parish, Studland and Godlingston Heath, and Hartland Moor and Stoborough Heath. Over the last 20 years the heathland has been restored and moving forward **landowners are working coherently to form one large area that will be declared a single National Nature reserve encompassing the existing reserves, along with Arne, Rempstone, Creech and Grange Heaths and Brownsea Island.** Landowners will manage their areas individually. They have three key aims for the landscape; looking after nature, supporting science and research and providing access for people.

James Gould, local operations manager at the National Trust reported that **the goat path on the East side of the Castle is in need of restoration and the Trust are seeking the Council's support in a bid to gain funding from Dorset Council.** The Parish Council consider the path valuable to the community and will write a letter of support to that effect. Cllr Fooks asked could James look into the possibility of **an alternative to the two kissing gates onto the Halves at Halves Cottages.** They prevent access for buggies and those with mobility scooters or wheelchairs. Is there anything that can be done?

National Trust Ranger Becky Eddy has been bracken rolling on the common. Reducing the bracken cover should encourage wild flowers to grow.

The National Trust will be installing signs to **promote their offer to the public to refill drinking water bottles in the tea-rooms and Visitors Center,** this was welcomed by the Council.

There was a lengthy discussion regarding a **recent incident involving cows and walkers on West Hill.** Cllr Spicer Short is particularly concerned about the incident and has approached the tenant farmer to enquire if he would consider a permissive footpath in an adjacent field. He is willing to consider this with the Council and the NT's support. The Council recognised that grazing and recreational use of the countryside will always be conflicting but that safe access to paths and bridleways needs to be addressed.

The Clerk confirmed Dorset Council's guidance on road-side advertising; signage that promotes local small scale charitable or non-for-

profit events are permitted for 14 days in advance of an event and must be removed 48 hours after the event, however, this does not include signage that is erected for commercial purposes e.g. those displaying commercial company logos as these advertise a business.

The Council spent some time on a **workshop aimed at setting the agenda** for their five year term. The Council created a list of items they hope address. In addition to **parking in village** and **climate and environment issues,** both of which had got off the ground at the June meeting, the following items were noted; **lack of affordable market housing and the impact of second homes, traffic through village, Swanworth Quarry application, play facilities, cycling in Purbeck, keeping Corfe beautiful and ensuring Kingston, Rempstone and other outlying areas of the Parish are represented.**

The Council considered if another Parish Survey would be beneficial? They reflected on the 2004 Parish Plan and the scope of the work it involved. The Council agreed that at this time they would focus on the agenda items highlighted rather than on a survey at this stage.

The Council were invited to respond to Dorset Council proposals for consultation on a new Local Plan. The Council resolved to respond stating that **the proposed means of consultation were not adequate** and do not offer a platform for genuine engagement with the Dorset Council.

The Council considered how to tackle **anti-social behaviour in the youth shelter in the playground.** The shelter is for the youth of the community to enjoy but some people have been using it inappropriately, at the detriment of others. It was requested that discussing possible solutions be put on the August agenda.

On **planning matters,** the planning committee reported their decision on the erection of barn at Little Woolgarston Farmhouse, Woolgarston. The Council objected to the plan on several grounds and asked it be referred to the planning committee so that the applicant may respond to the issues raised. The Parish Council submitted no objection to sub-divide existing cottage to create 2 self-contained cottages at 32 East Street, Corfe Castle, on the condition that the overlooking window is fixed shut and frosted as stipulated in the plans. The Council had no objection to plans to extend and convert a rural building to a dwelling, with associated parking and access at



The Parish Council met at Furzebrook village hall for the second time this summer. Cllr Tony Higgens was elected Chairman for the meeting and Cllr Hazel Parker was Vice. The meeting was just quorate; apologies having been received because of illness and vacation.

Because there were insufficient Members present who were at the June meeting, the validation of the Minutes was held over till August when, hopefully, more Members who were present in June would be able to attend. Matters arising from those Minutes were therefore postponed.

June had been pretty quiet from the point of view of planning and July was the same. There were no planning applications to mull over; perhaps the Dorset Council planning department (Purbeck area) might be a bit busier later in July and August. The results of past planning applications were noted

The Council then went on to “Highways Matters” of which there were few. The main topic was the provision of an advisory road sign at Barnston Cross suggesting coaches and caravans, etc., should not use the road to Bradle unless the drivers have a penchant for getting stuck and causing gridlock. The Clerk reported he had been in discussions with Dorset Council about it and had been told the “Sign Shop” was snowed under at present but would soon be able to produce the item. The Clerk also gave a report about the new broken finger at Barnston Cross finger post and Members were pleased to hear that work was in progress to get the thing sorted out. A pot-hole in the Corfe Road is expanding and has been reported to Highways for fixing.

The Parish Council had gone to tender for replacing and repairing the fencing around the cemetery; the lowest tender was accepted and work should start fairly soon.

Finances are in good order and the annual audit figures are with the independent auditor in Wareham for validation before being sent to the government-appointed external auditor. Because the turn-over of the Parish Council is less than £25,000, the Parish is exempt from much of the requirements of the external auditing practice.

The Clerk reported that the Council’s laptop computer had been repaired with the CPU being replaced after overheating due to blocked up airways. The Clerk is not surprised; it’s been pretty hot lately!

The environmental project was again discussed and the Clerk read out a letter sent to the Dorset Wildlife Trust. It is hoped that someone may attend the August meeting. Apart from a few minor bits and pieces that was that for a very quiet July Meeting. Next meeting will be on August 13th. e-mail address is ckpc@gmx.co.uk

Be Kind to Crabs

One of the most popular activities out on our rocky shores is crabbing! It can be great fun trying to catch these nippy little creatures, but it’s important to look after them. Here are our crabbing top tips:

- **Use a net bait bag instead of a hook** – if you have a hooked crab line pop into our visitor centre and we’ll swap it to a net bag for FREE.

- **Don't use wildlife as bait** – please leave the limpets on the rocks; anything smelly like bacon or cheese works well as bait.
- **Catch with care** – if you catch a crab, keep it low as you transfer to your bucket (preferably with a net underneath it) so it won't crack its shell if it falls off the line.
- **Keep them comfortable** – use a large bucket, as full as possible with nice cold sea water and some seaweed so the crabs can keep shaded. Refresh the water regularly.
- **Avoid crab fights** - no more than 3 small crabs per bucket and don't put big crabs in with little ones.
- **Put everything back** - when you're done crabbing, gently return the animals you've caught to the sea.

Our Chair, Alan Clevett, reported on the new primary care networks that have been set up across the county. Dorset Council has drawn up plans for a new clinical hub with GP services on the old Middle School site in Wareham and including increased community care provision.

As you know we are supporting the Purbeck nursing teams in establishing a weekly Purbeck Leg Club at Wareham. The planning is continuing apace to ensure its successful start on Monday September 2nd in Wareham Parish Hall. Volunteers still wanted please!

Also from September the Purbeck Forget Me Not Meeting Centre will be holding regular Monday sessions in Wareham Hospital for those with dementia and their carers. Here in Corfe several members of the PPG were happy to help the Surgery with its annual Carers' Tea Party which was a great success. The weather decided to co-operate apart from the wind blowing the tablecloths off the table at every opportunity! It was a lovely event with lots of cake and talk and was widely enjoyed by everyone.

Our Health Talks, organised by Howard Thomas, are a large part of our programme this year. We were delighted with the good -sized audience and its wide age range that came to Dr Masding's excellent talk in June on diabetes. He explained very clearly how it is best managed and what lifestyle steps we should take to minimise the risk of developing this serious disease.

National Trust

Dozens of rare silver studded blue butterflies have found a new home on Studland Heath in an early success for a National Trust-backed partnership using fire to boost conservation. Swaling — using controlled burning to reduce scrub and improve habitats — is the focus of a Purbeck-wide partnership between the Trust, RSPB, Forestry Commission and Kingston Maurward College near Dorchester, a centre for conservation studies. The team carried out its first series of burns last winter, and just months later the results are plain to see in an area of Studland Heath between Ferry Road and Little Sea.

The area was chosen because a controlled burn eight years ago seemed to have encouraged the return of the silver studded blue, a nationally rare heathland butterfly seen as a priority species locally.

"I visited the burn site to see if I could locate any," said Lead Ranger Paul Bradley, who is the Trust representative on the swaling team.

"I gave up counting after two dozen or so".

"The swaling team is a great example of working cooperatively to provide resources, build up skills and bring people together for conservation in Purbeck," said National Trust Countryside Manager Mark Singleton. Controlled burning has also taken place on Hartland Moor near Corfe Castle and elsewhere. Key species to have benefited so far include the Purbeck mason wasp, a very rare insect only found on a few sites in Purbeck.

Burning only takes place in the winter and will resume later this year.

We led our first puffin event for Langton residents this year on 27 June and were rewarded with the sight of nine puffins. Puffins were once abundant on the cliffs of Purbeck, according to the Purbeck Society in 1855. After The First World War numbers started to drop and there have been just a handful of breeding pairs present for the last 10 years. This year it appears that we've had a (very) mini boom. Apart from the nine we spotted, staff at Durlston Country Park reported seeing 16 from one of their boat trips in early June, though obviously the same birds may well be included in both counts. Puffins are a north Atlantic species, and down here they are at the very southern end of their range (there are some colonies on the Channel Islands and northern Brittany). They eat sand eels and it is assumed that a changing climate has resulted in less food for puffins as the fish have gone elsewhere. Other nearby colonies have experienced similar declines. However, it is possible that other factors have impacted the puffins. Disturbance can be an issue (the puffins will abandon nests if they feel under threat). Working with local climbers and activity companies we have exclusion zones between Dancing Ledge and Hedbury during the

breeding season, to reduce the chance that human action is causing the puffins direct harm.

Another threat could be predation by rats. The puffins nest in a clay seam half way up the cliff and it could be that rats are eating the chicks (the seam runs all the way along from Dancing Ledge). We have installed cameras on the cliffs to watch over the nesting area and are monitoring the situation.

So this year has been a good year, and we are doing what we can to give the colony every chance of being here in the future.

We'd love the puffin events to be annual, so make a note in your diaries now: The Big Langton Puffin Count 2020, Thursday 25 June 2020. Details to follow next year!

Over the next four years the National Trust will be working with Natural England and other partners to improve the dune habitats around Studland for nature and people as part of the nationwide Dynamic Dunescapes project. Sand dunes are listed as the habitat most at risk in Europe. The main cause of their decline in the UK is that vegetation is growing on them faster than ever before. A combination of longer growing seasons and increased atmospheric nitrogen deposition means that they have mostly become covered with grasses, heather, scrub and trees. Many of the species that need open, sandy habitats have declined as a result.

Studland is a good example of this. The dunes here were 30-40 per cent bare sand in the 1930s; now it is around two per cent bare sand. Studies by Cyril Diver in the 1930s showed rare and specialist dune insects, plants and reptiles to be present throughout the dunes; our recent surveys have shown that many of these species have been squeezed out, and are now only found in the very youngest dunes and on the bare ground created by footpaths.

The conservation work planned for Studland involves restoring patches of open ground in the locations where they will most benefit wildlife, in both the dry sandy areas and in the wetter marshes.

We will be reintroducing cattle grazing into the heart of the dunes, but not in the areas most visited by people.

Cattle were always present on the dunes until the Second World War, and they are still the best way of keeping the dunes from becoming covered with scrub again in the future.

The project will also enable us to carry on with the restoration of Little Sea by removing the carp that were illegally introduced a few years ago, and which are the likely cause of the dramatic decline in bird numbers on the lake since 2010.

But it's not just wildlife which will benefit because Dynamic Dunescapes is also about people.

As well as being better for nature, a dune system with more open sandy ground is a nicer place to visit, and we want everybody to feel welcome there.

We will be appointing a full time outreach officer who will aim to build a greater understanding and appreciation of sand dunes with people of all ages.

Specifically, they will be:

- Creating opportunities for everybody to explore, be inspired by and help look after our dunes,
- Improving safe, family-friendly access into some areas of the dunes,
- Running a citizen science programme, working with hundreds of volunteers and children, to help monitor wildlife and how the sand dune systems are changing,
- Running a skills development programme for individuals and organisations. This will include sand dune management training and research projects.

Studland is one of nine dune landscapes taking part in Dynamic Dunescapes nationwide.

The project is funded by the European Union through the LIFE Nature programme and by the National Lottery Heritage Fund. It will involve work to restore nearly 7,000 hectares of sand dunes, roughly 35 per cent of the total in England and Wales.



Coastwatch was the topic at the July meeting, presented by Mike Revans who gave us lots of interesting information laced with his own style of wit and humour.

The National Coastwatch Institution, NCI, is a charity bearing the tag line "Eyes along the Coast" and this is indeed its main function. It came into being in 1994 in response to the closure of many small coastguard stations around the UK coastline. The trigger was the tragic loss of two lives when a fishing boat overturned within sight of one of the recently closed stations.

Volunteers from all walks of life, both male and female, man strategically located watch stations in daylight hours and monitor everything that moves on the sea, using powerful binoculars in addition to their eyes, with VHF radios to monitor local activity on the water. The aim is to spot, monitor, log and, if appropriate, report and by so doing many lives have been saved. In 2018 546 serious incidents were reported to the Coastguard.

54 Coastwatch stations currently operate, many of them along the south coast.

The 2,514 volunteers keep watch in buildings of varying types, from a Martello tower to former gun emplacements by way of an old shed! We have two in Purbeck of course, at Peveril Point and St Aldhelm's Head.

Every aspect of NCI depends upon voluntary financial support, average running costs for a typical station totalling £5,000. The service needs our support to continue and increase its extremely valuable work.

Can't believe it is August already! The patio and garden are looking beautiful, flowers blooming, and the grapevines are growing.


It is business as normal and looking forward to a busy August. Hopefully the sun will continue to shine.







CHURCH OF ENGLAND

The Reverend Ian Jackson writes:

Historically, the Church of England has had a responsibility to offer the church's ministry to all in each and every parish in England; everywhere in England is in such a parish. We all know that often we have fallen short in this task and in our own day, as at other times, it is a struggle to fulfil this responsibility.

We are not alone in this task – Christians and churches of other denominations play their part.

Also, if we think of the 7 parishes in our own benefice, the new Benefice of St Aldhelm, there are those who will remember when there was a resident priest at Church Knowle (with responsibility for Steeple and Tyneham) and Kingston (looking after Worth also). There are less full-time clergy than in the earlier and middle part of the twentieth century. However, we have discovered, that all Christians share in parish ministry in a variety of ways.

Parish ministry is rightly focussed on particular local places but, hopefully, not in a 'parochial' sense – when that word is understood to mean a narrow and restricted vision.

Recently we have been very fortunate to have two people share in the life of the parishes of the benefice as part of their training for and during the early part of ordained ministry. Nick Webb from Swanage spent time during May and June in the Corfe Valley parishes. Nick is training on the course based at Sarum College in Salisbury and will be ordained next Summer to serve as a non-stipendiary minister alongside his existing gardening business.

The Revd. Kevin Martin spent 3 weeks in July with James Mercer and the Purbeck Hills parishes, but he was also able to spend some time meeting people in the Corfe Valley parishes. Kevin is assistant curate in the St Bartholomew's Benefice, which is north-east of Shaftesbury. All curates in Salisbury Diocese spend some time during their curacy in a benefice other than their own.

It has been really good to have Nick and Kevin spending time with us. They have both been able to encourage us and make good, positive and helpful suggestions for us to consider further.

It has been good to hear of the Church of England's life and activity in other places. Our horizons are widened and we can be renewed in our commitment to the places where we – the places we believe god wants us to be. So, I am

very grateful to all Nick and Kevin have given us over recent weeks and hope we can continue to remember them in prayer.

We now know that when Nick is ordained next Summer he will serve as assistant curate in our Benefice of St Aldhelm's. Nick will work closely with James Mercer, who will be his training minister, in the Purbeck Hills parishes; however, Nick will serve the whole benefice and we shall certainly see him in all the parishes. This is really good news.

Having said all the above it is good to remind ourselves that all Christians are called to serve and minister and that, above all, God calls us not so much to focus on the church but on the spread of his kingdom throughout the world and the whole of creation.

I Stand at the Door and Knock

“Here I am, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will go in and eat with him, and he with me.” Revelation 3:20

Have you seen that picture in St. Pauls Cathedral of Jesus Christ outside the door? It is dark, he holds a lamp, the door is closed and tangled up with briars and weeds. Well that picture by Holman Hunt is the setting for our verse this month.

What is the door? Some think that it is the door of the future, because Christ is going to come again. But that is hardly a door that we can open. Others say that it’s the door of the human heart, and that may be nearer the truth. But reading the verse in its context we see Christ is speaking to a whole church. A church where he wasn’t fully present. A church where some knew him personally, and lived in fellowship with him, and some people didn’t know Jesus, and lived their lives with him outside. So, the most obvious answer is that it is the church door (the “Church” is people.)

Why is Jesus outside? We have to go back a bit to answer this one. Just a few verses earlier we read – “You say, ‘I am rich; I have acquired wealth and do not need a thing.’” Jesus was left outside the church door because they felt self-reliant. They had plenty of home comforts with their cars, DVD players and colour TV’s or whatever the 1st century AD equivalent was. “I don’t need a thing,” they said. And that’s why the door was shut. They had become unspiritual, and finished up with Jesus pushed outside their front door.

Why does He knock? If you wanted two words to sum up what the Christian experience was all about, it’s not words like ‘Joy’ and ‘Peace’ that come to mind here. Rather we have the ideas of ‘Friendship’ and ‘Satisfaction’. *“I will go in and eat with him and he with me.”* So many people in this world are dissatisfied today, trying this and that, bored, frustrated and discontented. People’s lives are empty. And why is that? Simply because the door is shut. And while he is outside, we will be empty and lacking spiritual companionship.

How do we open the door? *“If anyone hears my voice and opens the door...”* Not everyone hears Jesus’ voice. We can miss it if we are immersed in self-interest or absorbed in self-love. So, if you read this verse today and feel God speaking to you, challenging you, inviting you, then be grateful because that’s not something everyone hears. But hearing isn’t enough. We have to open the door too.

The door is shut. What will you do? If you hear his voice, you may open it.

“Open the door” he says “and I will come in.

Jesus said....” *I am the Way, and the Truth and the Life. No-one comes to the Father except through Me*”. John 14:6



Our grade 2 listed station building at Corfe is one of the original structures constructed by the London and South Western Railway when the branch from Wareham to Swanage opened during the 1880's. The lines opening brought additional prosperity to the Purbeck area both for the stone and ball clay trade

and also for agriculture. The railway contributed to the success and expansion of Swanage as a popular resort for seaside holidays. Today the Swanage railway carries over 200,000 passengers a year and Corfe Castle is a key location for tourists travelling on the railway.

A grade 2 listed building used so regularly needs plenty of TLC. Just as in your own home the station needs time spent on cleaning and general maintenance including work tending to the gardens. 


