

#### **DECEMBER 2023 FOR CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL**

If you are or know a Carpenter, please read on. Local work opportunity available.

**Precept:** After a constructive discussion Corfe Castle Parish Council have agreed to request from Dorset Council a Precept of £55,179, which is an increase of 4.77% from last year. Due to the increase in our tax base this increase represents a 4.23% increase per household, meaning the equivalent Band D Tax band will pay an extra 27pence per month per household towards the Parish Council portion of your Council Tax.

Become a Parish Councillor. It can be very rewarding being a councillor – having the chance to make a real contribution to your community. You do not have to hold certain qualifications for be experienced in a specific role, you just need to be passionate about representing the community you live or work in. If you think you may be interest pop along to the next Parish Council meeting and listen in, or call the clerk for more details.

**Play Park:** Exciting times are ahead. Recently the Parish Council were informed that several items within the playpark needed replacing, due to varying safe usage time left, (from 6 months to 5 years). Due to the safety concerns raised, the Parish Council have decided to replace the Seesaw, Rocking Horse, and Toddler cradle swing within the next couple of months. It is expected the remaining older units will last 5+ years and this will allow us time to build up a reserve to be able to invest in Adult Fitness Equipment before needing to replace any further play park units.

**Noticeboards:** The Parish Council have three noticeboards around the Parish, and all need replacing. If you are a carpenter and could make like for like replacement noticeboards (with magnetic back boards) please contact the Clerk. Alternatively, if you own your own company and wish to sponsor a board, please contact the Clerk.

**Permit Holders Car Park Surface:** It is that time of year again, when potholes are forming, some people love them (jumping up and down in muddy puddles) but most people hate them. The Parish Council have approved a contractor to come and fill in the potholes as soon as possible but this will be weather dependent.

**Highways:** You may recall several months ago, Corfe Castle Parish Council put together a "Wish List" of highways related issues we would like Dorset Council to address. Well, I am pleased to say (although you may have already noticed) Dorset Council have now installed the drop kerbs as requested, which hopefully will help all pedestrians when trying to cross the road. Later this month you should also see

Traffic Regulation Orders being advertised regarding various parking restrictions, keep your fingers crossed, as this hopefully will greatly aid a freer flowing West Street!

# **Environmental Group Update**



#### This month we have a few eco-friendly post-Christmas tips to start 2024 with!

Take any artificial Christmas trees at the end of their life to the tip and ask for advice on where to put it. If the trunk and / or branches are made of metal, some of it may be recyclable. Weighing up the complicated climate pros and cons, for next year a real Christmas tree is a better choice, and there is also the option of buying a Christmas tree in a plant pot meaning you can plant it in your garden after Christmas and possibly reuse it the following year. If you had a cut Christmas tree this year, you can put it in your garden waste bin or take it to the tip for be composted. Several charities will also collect Christmas trees for a donation, but this needs to be pre-booked before Christmas.

Think about re-gifting unwanted presents or donating them to local charities – our local school PTFA have raffles at most events, so is always grateful for suitable prizes.

If your fairy lights are no longer working, LED lights are by the far the best option to replace them with. They use less electricity and last much longer than most other options, saving you money and avoiding carbon emissions and waste.

Reuse wrapping paper either by using it again to wrap gifts next Christmas, or using it to cover boxes or to craft a mosaic or collage with. Or you can put it into your compost pile (not glittery or metallic paper) to provide dry compostable material to layer with moister materials such as kitchen waste or grass clippings.

Cards can also be re-used by cutting them into gift tags.

Use up food leftovers, either freezing them to eat later, or turning them into something else. One of Luke's favourites is to make soup with veggie leftovers; try adding spices for a nice winter warming flavour!

The December meeting of the Church Knowle Parish Council took place in the Furzebrook Village Hall on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> November at 6:30pm. It was attended by five members of the Council (Cllr Burt in the chair) and the Dorset Councillor.

The main items of interest in the meeting were:

#### Vacancies on the Parish Council

There are still two vacancies on the Parish Council which has a full strength of nine and any interested parishioners can apply to clerk@churchknowle-pc.gov.uk. No applications have been received this month.

#### Neighbourhood Plan

The grant for the Neighbourhood Plan has been awarded, the Steering Committee is being reconvened and the process will continue with the consultant.

#### <u>Planning</u>

The Council resolved to have no objection to P/PABA/2023/06746, a new slurry storage facility at Bradle Farm.

#### <u>Highways</u>

Church Knowle Speed Limit. Cllr Brooks said that she had just received notification that the 30mph speed limit through Chuch Knowle Village had been approved and will be put in place when all of the necessary statutory steps had been completed.

**Corfe River Footbridge.** This bridge is in a very poor state and needs to be rebuilt. This is will be an expensive and substantial project which will require a proper design, liaison with several parties and a fundraising campaign. This will be discussed in more detail at the next meeting.

#### Other Business

The Parish Council thanks the Wareham Men's Shed for the excellent repairs to the East Creech notice board.

#### <u>Tenders</u>

The recent Playing Field inspection recommended that the wooden elements be treated with preservative. Tenders are therefore being sought for treating all of the timber at the playing field with an approved preservative. The timber will have to be sanded to remove any splinters first. Apply to the Clerk at clerk@churchknowle-pc.gov.uk for details.

The December meeting finished at 7:30 pm. The next meeting of the Church Knowle Parish Council will be at the Church Knowle Village Hall at 6:30 on 9<sup>th</sup> January 2024.

#### A MESSAGE FROM...

We want to apologise to all the parents of local children who did not receive a present from Father Christmas when he arrived in the square on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> December.

After receiving feedback, and having discussed In several groups, we believe that there were 4 common themes to the issues raised:



- Too many people and difficult crowd management
- 2. Position of Santa's Sleigh and the process of gift distribution
- 3. Not enough gifts and gifts not wrapped
- 4. Event too widely advertised and not "local"

This event is intended to be local, and we obviously grossly underestimated the effect on numbers of the Castle being open on the same night. Whilst many of the problems experienced can be traced back to there being too many people in attendance, safety issues with position of the sleigh and too few gifts being the main ones exacerbated by the numbers, we intend to make improvements to crowd organisation and supplies to ensure we do much better from next year.

Several suggestions have been put forward and we will be able to adopt some, but of course not all. We realise that it is impossible to make everybody 100% happy, but hope that we do enough to regain confidence, especially of the parents of village children. Our volunteers give up a lot of time with their own families at this special time of year, and in the months leading up to it, to put up the lights and organise/run the event, and they all want it to be a safe and happy occasion.

Some of the steps to be taken include:

- Ensuring that this event is not combined with any other, keeping it as local as
  possible
- Reviewing the process for the arrival of Father Christmas
- Introducing a voucher system, and organised queuing, for children to receive
  a gift
- Keeping the advertising to village only via Corfe Valley News and banners in the square (and we rely on the CVN readers to take care if sharing on social media)

We hope you are enjoying the Christmas lights. The weather has caused us a few problems, but the lights team have done a great job as always.





#### **Reverend Anne Bond writes**

I don't know about you, but I tend to think about January as a New Start. A fresh beginning, a second chance to Get it Right. Whatever 'it' is. Going for a brisk walk first thing in the morning? Getting to the bottom of my mending pile? Winning the Lottery? *I wish* ... 'you must be in it to win it' but only fools gamble. It's so *so* tempting. People do win it – why not me? Or you? The answer is easy: because the odds against are so *so* enormous the winner can only be the result of chance.

Perhaps it's time for New Year's Resolutions. I resolve to lose a stone in weight before Easter. Not to ignore the Big Issue Sellers. Not to use my car unnecessarily even though it's small and hybrid and only uses a teeny-tiny amount of petrol.

But what's so different about January? It's just a month like any other month, just another stretch of time. Same old, same old. Grrrr.

Do I really feel like that?

Well ... only very occasionally. Everyone does sometime.

What I do *really* feel for most of the time is profound gratitude. I'm alive! I'm able to experience affection – given and received. I can see moonlight from my bedroom window. I can hear owls at night. OK, I'm no longer in the first flush of youth now - but I can do most things. I'm not very good at picking up dropped spoons on the floor; I need to lean against some inadvertent prop and concentrate on not falling over. But hey! As some wise person said: "Old age is a *privilege*." And it is – if you think about it.

Perhaps what it boils down to is the willingness (or not) to experience new things. When we are young everything is new and exciting. In middle life, time tends to race by, and we don't think about it, it just happens. However, in our declining years we face previously unimagined new experiences that are often not at all welcome. But all of it is part-and-parcel of the great, multicoloured, wide-lensed, over-view of the life that has been granted us by whoever-it-is who is the source of it all, the one most of us call God.

(He really does have the most vivid imagination, doesn't he? The duck-billed-platypus. All those horrible viruses. And the indescribable beauty of music ...)

So let us this year resolve to be grateful for whatever comes our way, however difficult it may be - knowing that the effort to endure does not go unnoticed by the Creator. Why does God allow disease? I wish I knew. But I do know that God draws closest to those who are suffering, and very often gives them a peace of mind incomprehensible to those standing by.

Eventually we will all go through the process of dying. As a new experience, it is one most of us would rather do without. *Or is it?* When living becomes almost too difficult and painful to bear, to die may well seem a relief, a surrender to whatever comes next bringing with it comfortable acceptance, a fascinated curiosity, and a sense of going forward to something infinitely better.

#### **Purbeck Youth Music**

On November 30th Andrew Lloyd Webber again wrote about the importance of music education, this time in a letter to politicians. He and other signatories, who include Coldplay, Katherine Jenkins, Nicola Benedetti, the Kanneh-Mason family, Ed Sheeran and Dua Lipa, have written to Rishi Sunak and Kier Starmer.

He writes "....in a world that feels more divided than at any point in my lifetime, and with conflict raging around the world with incalculable consequences, music has the unique ability to unite. It is a universal language that can transcend borders, cultures, and differences and bring people together."

Lloyd Webber's Music in Secondary School Trust (MISST) provides instruments, lessons as part of the curriculum and music programs for years 7, 8 and 9. Such things are no longer deemed an essential part of a child's education and not usually on the curriculum.

Purbeck Youth Music is currently providing almost the same thing but in the primary schools of Purbeck. It is so important to start learning an instrument in the early years, and actually often easier than when you're older. The Purbeck Instrument Loan Scheme is now an integral part of PYM with over 70 instruments out on loan for a minimal donation per annum.

On the day Lloyd Webber's letter went to the Times, 37 of our local Purbeck primary school children performed in an informal concert in Swanage for friends and family. There were solos, as well as woodwind and string groups. All the children performed with confidence, bowing graciously afterwards. It is wonderful to see how they listen to each other play and applaud happily. Then during the St Aldhelm's Christmas Tree Festival some of the same children came to play for the visitors. The Brass group played as well as the woodwinds and on the day after Shane McGowan died there was a moving performance of his famous song 'Fairytale of New York' by Martha Harwood and Oscar Brady.

Our newest endeavour is the Singing Schools Project led by Susannah Nettleton. This has proved very popular with teachers and pupils alike. Singing is the way in to music making for so many and its importance in the early years is vital. Three schools out of nine have taken part so far and three more will be doing so next term.

With support from the community, PYM continues to arrange demonstrations and performances in schools and where there is a need, financial help with try - out sessions.

Many local organisations have been fundraising at concerts for the work of PYM and we have received funds from Swanage Rotary and PAW for which we are most grateful as well as generous individuals.





#### The Rambling Gardener

2024. I hope you all have enjoyed New Year's Eve and are looking forward to the coming year in the garden. I wonder what weather 2024 will bring as all the weather patterns are changing. It is impossible to know how to plan for the future, though I am sure we will all have to change. The price of everything is rising, nothing ever goes down! There is so much sad news on TV not only about the ongoing wars but there is so much loss of life from earthquakes, hurricanes, droughts and floods.

Back in the eighties I was in the USA with my husband visiting his university at Dartmouth. We met his friend, an Indian Chief who was very sad that the young were not respecting the land that the USA had given them as a reserve. He had hoped it would be respected but the boys were just using it as a playground, churning up the grass and leaving rubbish everywhere. He gave me this very lovely Lakota Indian prayer translated into English many years before. I love it and get strength from it - learn to take time to notice every leaf, flower, and make your life learning and listening:

O Great Spirit,
Whose voice I hear in the winds,
and whose breath gives life to all the world. Hear me.
I am small and weak.
I need your strength and wisdom.

Let me walk in beauty and make my eyes
ever hold the red and purple sunset.

Make my hands respect the things you have made
and my ears sharp to hear your voice.

Make me wise so that I may understand
the things you have taught my people.

Let me learn the lessons you have hidden
in every leaf and rock.

I seek strength, not to be superior to my brother. So, when life fades, as the fading sunset, My spirit may come to you without shame.

I will suggest things to do in January. Order any plants you want; most trees and shrubs can be ordered as bare rooted (grow on better) and delivered up to the end of March. Water them in well and mulch with leaf mold, sheep's wool or a thick layer of pebbles. They will need watering in dry weather. Choose

small shrubs so they will need little pruning, and make sure to choose plants that will like your soil and will take the local weather. I have lots of plants that need dividing and would love anyone to come and get some. They are all plants that do well here in Purbeck as I do not keep or divide any plants that are not doing well in my garden.

Do a bit of hibernating! January and February are not the time for working outside in England. I am going away for 2 short breaks hoping to get some sunshine. I know the damage done by aeroplanes so am going by bus and ship.

Check that you have all the seeds you need for this year, it is so cheap to buy seeds and plants grow best if started in the soil they are going to grow/crop in. Try growing something new each year. Start growing in January and February on a windowsill to be ready for sowing outside from March onwards. It is best to have the seeds ready for sowing as there are lots of different variety's (different planting dates) but, it is important to grow what you like.

In the flower borders I am planting a lot of small shrubs (with attractive leaves), to save on watering, and many of them give colour and shape all year round with very little work. As I wish to grow all my own food, I need the flower borders to be easy care, wildlife friendly and to give beauty and nectar for the bees and insects. Cutting back the size of the lawns (less work) leaving paths around the borders.

Good luck to everyone in the coming year.
