#### FEBRUARY FOR CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

Annual Parish Meeting format: Over the last couple of years attendance to the Annual Parish Meeting has been modest! This either means we are doing a great job(!) or the event is not what you want it to be.

We are thinking this year, we will try something a bit different, possible have an informal session with local organisations / groups invited to have a table, so you can talk to whomever you wish, followed by a short presentation from the Parish Council on future plans.

**National Trust:** The National Trust have given warning of possible Highways disruption from March 4<sup>th</sup> for three weeks, whilst the roof to the Old Stables on the A351 hill leading up to the Square is replaced.

BBC Springwatch from Corfe Castle! Watch out for live coverage of the two existing peregrine nest sites within the Castle.

**Playground:** You will have noticed by now there has been a few new ideas within the playground. It was with sadness the old rocking horse had to go, but the Parish Council acknowledges everything has a safe usable life span and unfortunately after approx. 30 years the rocking horse had to go to pastures new! The new equipment seems to be well received by young and old alike, as when I visited just the other day, there was a family on the new 4-seater see-saw and 2 children taking it in turns to bounce on the trampoline.

**Armed Forces Covenant:** Corfe Castle Parish Council have agreed to support the Armed Forces Covenant. It is appreciated that although there is not much physically the Parish Council can offer, but what we can offer is our support and acknowledgement to all those brave men and women within our parish who have served to help keep us safe.

**No Mow Area:** The Parish Council have supported a request from the Environment group to once again this year have a "No Mow Area" running along the Eastern boundary of the playing field. Individual access routes to the rear of the properties bordering the field will be maintained for access.

Gods Acre Prohibited items: New rules and regulations for Gods Acre have now been in place for just over a year. They have been displayed both on the website and on the cemetery gates. We stated we would start to enforce the rules once everyone had had a chance to read and adhere to them. From 1<sup>st</sup> March 2024 to 1<sup>st</sup> March 2025, prohibited items will be removed. Broken items will be disposed of, and items not broken will be re-located into the shed for safe keeping. Owners can call 01202

670105 to arrange collection. After the 1<sup>st</sup> March 2025 all items unclaimed or prohibited will be discarded.

20mph Consultation: As project lead, Cllr Blinkhorn has written a separate report explaining the results of the survey and the Parish Council's decisions.

For example: What play equipment should we have; and should we apply for a 20mph limited? Along with so many other projects across the parish. If you are thinking you could be a Councillor, why not attend the March meeting and see what a difference you could make.

#### **20mph Survey Results**

As you may be aware CCPC recently conducted a survey to determine whether there was sufficient support within the parish for the introduction of a 20mph speed limit.

The council would like to thank all those who responded, and from a total of 252 responses received the results were as follows:

The results show that there were more responders against a 20mph speed limit than for it, consequently the council has decided that it is not currently viable to apply to Dorset Council for a speed reduction.

Amongst the survey returns were many recurring traffic related concerns voiced by both 'for' and 'against' groups. Amongst these were:

- Improved enforcement of the existing 30mph speed limit.
- Speed cameras at various locations in Corfe Castle village.
- Some form of controlled crossing point at the southern end of East Street.
- Improving the visibility of the current Zebra crossing.

CCPC has formed a working group to investigate the concerns raised and results will be reported back to council at the earliest opportunity.

If you would like to discuss the outcome of the survey and what CCPC is doing to try and manage traffic speed through Corfe Castle, there will be an opportunity during the next Annual Parish Meeting.

#### **Church Knowle Parish Council - February Meeting**

The February meeting of the Church Knowle Parish Council took place in the Furzebrook Village Hall on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> February 2024 at 6:30pm. It was attended by four members of the Council (Cllr Burt in the chair) and six members of the public

The main items of interest in the meeting were:

#### Public Discussion

The topics raised included:

- A speed limit for Furzebrook Road.
- Flooding on Furzebrook road owing to the inadequacy of the under road culvert.
- Vehicle collisions with deer on Furzebrook Road provision of deer road signs.
- The road barriers at the Furzebrook Road railway bridge should be checked for compliance with current standards.

#### Vacancies on the Parish Council

There are still two vacancies on the Parish Council which has a full strength of nine and any interested parishioners can apply to clerk@churchknowle-pc.gov.uk. A member of the public at the meeting undertook to submit an application for consideration at the next meeting.

#### Neighbourhood Plan

The Steering Committee is reviewing the draft plan to ensure that there is emphasis on issues raised by parishioners. There will be a public forum in the second week in April. Parishioners are invited to join the steering group and can contact the clerk (clerk@churchknowle-pc.gov.uk) or Cllr Carl Grice (carlgrice@yahoo.com) for more information. The Neighbourhood Plan carries statutory weight under the Localism Act 2011 and this is an opportunity for the parish to take advantage of this.

#### <u>Planning</u>

The Council resolved to have no objection to P/FUL/2023/07201. Construct a new tennis court on agricultural land at The Old Rectory.

The Council resolved to object to P/FUL/2024/00337. Create a new access to the mushroom field from Furzebrook Road.

#### **Highways**

**Corfe River Footbridge.** An experienced local civil engineering company has visited the site of the Orchard Bridge and is preparing a proposal with initial estimate that will enable the Council to investigate grants and external funding.

#### Furzebrook Phone Box

This was decommissioned by BT and adopted by the Parish Council over a year ago and is available for new role. Suggestions for a use for this box are sought. Pease contact the clerk and these will be put to the Parish Council to be implemented.

#### Tenders

The recent Playing Field inspection recommended that the wooden elements be treated with preservative. Tenders are therefore being sought for treating all of the timber at the playing field with an approved preservative. The timber will have to be sanded to remove any splinters first. Apply to the Clerk at clerk@churchknowle-pc.gov.uk for details.

#### Love is in the ... pond!

It's that time of year when our ponds and wetlands become the stage for the amorous activities of frogs! Common frogs return to the water to spawn from January to March. You might hear males



croaking as they try to attract females. When they find a mate, the males grasp the females in a tight embrace, and fertilise the eggs as she lays them. Tadpoles hatch up to four weeks later, then four months later, tiny froglets emerge.

Corfe Common is a perfect place to watch these frolicking frogs. But like many of our 'common' species, frogs are in decline due to habitat loss, pollution

#### Leaky log dams

As part of our wetland restoration project, log dams have been placed in the waterways on Big East Common in Corfe. They are designed to 'slow the flow' in these channels, allowing some

of the water to

overflow and soak into the surrounding soils.

This will help to create a soggy wetland area which is great for wildlife, including the beautiful and rare southern damselfly. It also helps prevent flooding downstream. The dams were tested in the heavy rains we've had recently – and are proving that they're up to the job!



#### **Castle Leaze Farm**




In 1775, the Castle Leaze farmlands, including West Mill, looked like this — no different from today. The land was described as 'very good' according to William Woodward who surveyed this map. The Vineyard is shown separately as it was occasionally leased out independently. Most of the land was given to William the Conqueror by the Abbess of Shaftesbury and, in 1585, it totalled 124 acres. According to the survey of 1775 however, it was just over 119 acres which included the Castle Hill and the ruins.

In 1698 a list was drawn up to decide who could vote in the town's elections. It noted that Robert Gentle, a yeoman of Corfe, had taken a plot of ground out of the farmlands which he was not entitled to do. Nothing seems to mention where this plot lay or how much had been taken and a later survey of 1724 also noted that the acres are fewer than on the old survey (presumably that of 1585 - the 124 acres). It can only be presumed that the land was reclaimed. Boundary lines could be a bit flexible sometimes.

The customs of the manor permitted a horse to be stabled on the farm for the use of the mayor. It was thought this had been granted by the Constable of the castle so that the mayor could attend him whilst out stag hunting; by 1728 this practice had ceased. The mayor was also permitted to keep one lamb in Castle Close (No. 5 on the 1775 map).


A rental account of 1507 shows that Castle Leaze, together with the castle mill, brought in £6 13s. 4d. annually. It was rented by the then bailiff, John Bonvyle. Sir John Bankes leased the property to William and Henry Cullyford in 1631 and the 1635 rental accounts show that William Cullyford paid £20 p.a. excluding West Mill. Sir John did not actually purchase the castle until 1635 so I am a little mystified by this earlier date. He could have been leasing the property prior to purchase.

Castle Leaze was granted by Elizabeth I to Sir Christopher Hatton in July 1572. He extended his holdings and purchased 8 ½ acres at No. 1 (now Gods Acre) in 1577. He also acquired the land of about 5 acres on the eastern boundary of North Castle.



The dotted lines on the 1585 map show the extra land purchased by Sir Christopher Hatton.

The farmhouse was never included in the total quantity of land owned. It stood where the current allotments are on the east side of West Street. A cart shed still stood there in 1910 but the farmhouse had long gone.



#### The Reverend Anne Bond writes

They say 'March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb' referring, one assumes, to the weather. The transition from February to March is often wet, stormy, noisy with thunderstorms and raining cats and dogs (why 'cats and dogs'?); but March to April's weather transition tends to be soft and tender, sweet with the fragrance of primroses and blossoming fruit trees, and garden flowers opening their buds and promising beauty to come.

So March is a 'waiting' month.

As children, weren't we told "wait and see"? And the waiting for whatever-it-was seemed endless, everlasting, out of sight, over the horizon ... then, suddenly, there it was, the longed-for something, the more precious for having been expected with hope and longing for such ages. Did it lose any of

its marvellousness during the waiting? Or was it the more valued *because* of the long wait for it?

In these 21<sup>st</sup> century days instant gratification seems to be the predominant mindset. You know what you wanna wanna want ... and *when* d'you want it? NOW!

That's OK. It's completely understandable, particularly if you stand back and take the long view. The 20<sup>th</sup> century's two world wars left in their wake a gulf of human need terrible in intensity. We tend to measure time by the length of our own lifetimes. It became imperative to find cures for broken bodies and scrambled minds, to find solutions for impossibly difficult political situations, to explore new venues in which to carve out satisfying and comfortable places to live, and in the doing to cast off the values and behaviours of our predecessors – our grandparents and great-grandparents, perhaps even our parents – because, evidently, they had proved to be not fit for purpose.

In many brilliant and inspired ways, post-world-war successes have exceeded expectations. In the medical field antibiotics see off previously incurable infections, surgery achieves undreamt-of miracles, and research uncovers the secret workings of the human body. Racial prejudice is universally frowned on. Social status is levelling out. Wealth is still a measure of success and probably always will be, the gap between rich and poor still needs attention, as does our multiplying world population. And we need to learn how best to regard Artificial Intelligence.

Now, what the world needs more than anything else, is PEACE. PEACE between peoples of different nationalities and faith systems, coupled with universal acknowledgement that war is simply wrong, never an answer to perceived injustice however profound. Somehow all national governments and all faith communities must find ways to settle differences and agree that to wreak devastation, destruction and death upon uninvolved innocent people peacefully living ordinary family lives, is criminal ... tantamount to murder most foul.

I don't believe any of us want to 'wait and see' while the hot breath of Armageddon creeps closer. Would we not vastly prefer the sweet breezes of Spring heralding the rebirth of nature, new births of wildlife, and all humanity resolved on universal PEACE based on loving God and neighbour, no matter what?

Thanks to the limitless imaginings of our brains we humans are the most powerful living beings on this planet. No way is it beyond our capability to achieve worldwide PEACE. We just have to wanna wanna want it enough to work out how to do it.

The PEACE of God which passes all understanding keep our hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God – and may his Spirit be amongst us, informing and guiding us.



#### The Resurrection of Christ

Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word, I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born. 1 Corinthians 15:1-8

Q: Why Jesus Christ is willing to sacrifice and die for me, an ordinary person and for us all: to self-righteous and sinners, young and old, rich and poor, unprivileged like me?

Why he cares even to his death? Does it really matter?

A. "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16

"But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Romans 5:8

"Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends." John 15:13

The divine love of God is eternal and there is life after death. He doesn't want us to perish because he loved us so much. However, the reality matters, that the wages of sin is death but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ. (Romans 3:23; Romans 6:23)

The tenet of Christian faith is centred on the atonement of Jesus Christ on the Cross of Calvary more than 2000 years ago and his resurrection speaks volumes through his disciples.

## "And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith.

More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God, for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised.

For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either.

And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins."

## Dorset's volunteer digital champions help record number of people

Dorset Council's volunteer digital champions service had its busiest year in 2023 with more than 2,000 face-to-face appointments.

The volunteer scheme, which also celebrated its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary last year, held 2,063 appointments and saw more than 1,800 people.

In previous years, the volunteers held on average between 1,000 and 1,500 sessions.

Dorset Council has 45 volunteers based at libraries, community centres, GP surgeries and even at a café in Wareham.

Dorset Council's volunteer digital champions service had its busiest year in 2023 with more than 2,000 face-to-face appointments.

The volunteer scheme, which also celebrated its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary last year, held 2,063 appointments and saw more than 1,800 people.

In previous years, the volunteers held on average between 1,000 and 1,500 sessions.

Community groups can also book a volunteer digital champion to speak to their members.

The volunteers help with things like online shopping, Zoom meetings, comparison sites, apps, GP booking appointment systems and getting to grips with new devices like smart phones, tablets and laptops.

They also provide help over the phone via the Digital Hotline  $-01305\ 221048$  which was set up during the Covid pandemic.

Volunteer digital champion, Mike Watson, said: "I am delighted that so many people know about the service we offer and are coming to see us.

"We are a very friendly bunch and will aim to help with any digital issue someone may have – and if we can't help there and then, we will go away and research and come back with a solution.

"Some people only need to come and see us once, for example if they just need a bit of guidance on how to use a new device.

"While others will keep coming back to us as they want to keep on learning and become more confident using digital.

"Whatever advice is needed, we are ready and waiting to help – no problem is too big or too small."

#### New Partnership Launched to Help Residents who Fear Losing their



Dorset Council and national charities Shelter and Citizens Advice have joined forces for the first time to prevent homelessness in the county.

The new partnership is supporting Dorset residents who are experiencing a range of housing

issues by providing a free, confidential and non-judgemental one-stop-shop for anyone with housing cost concerns.

Experts can assist with many areas of housing, such as giving legal and debt advice, help finding a new home due to eviction and in some circumstances facilitate financial assistance to enable residents to remain in their accommodation.

The Housing Advice Line is open to anyone who:

- has a mortgage
- rents privately
- has a social landlord or
- are landlords themselves.

The service is also open to lettings agents, so they can share information with landlords and their clients.

When people call the Housing Advice Line on 01305 221000, their enquiry will be triaged and passed on to the most relevant team or organisation to progress.

The collaboration was formed to make it easier for people to access help if they have concerns or worries about losing their home, by having only one point of contact to get help.

Every local authority has a statutory duty to provide advice to everyone who is experiencing housing issues. Our data from 2023 shows we:

- took approximately 8,000 calls on housing issues via our Housing phone line.
- answered more than 25,000 emails about housing related topics.
- managed around 350 referrals from professionals from both our internal and external partners.
- took more than 4,000 enquiries through our dedicated online portal a rise of 6% from 2022.

Residents can also access the Housing Advice service by emailing housinghelp@dorsetcouncil.gov.uk or visiting the webpage Are you struggling with housing costs or worried about losing your home? - Dorset Council- for more information.

#### Together" campaign to bolster school attendance

To assist families facing challenges getting their children to school, Dorset Council has launched the "In This Together" school attendance campaign.

The campaign aims to provide support and guidance to those needing help by ensuring their children attend school regularly.

Amid national concerns about school attendance, worsened by the pandemic, both locally and nationally, there has been a significant drop in young people going to school over the past few years.

Studies show a direct link between how often children go to school and their future opportunities in life.

However, we know many families face hurdles in supporting their children to attend regularly, with anxiety often being a big obstacle.

Dorset Council suggests that if families are worried about school attendance, they should start by talking to their child's school.

Experienced advisers are available to provide support about a wide range of issues including, debt, energy advice, employment, benefits and housing. There is a range of support available particularly to low income households which many residents may not know about.

#### Sealing wax and wings.

The time has come, the Walrus said, to talk of many things, such as sealing wax and wings.

A few years ago, I planted a guelder rose bush in my garden in the (so far unfulfilled) hope that its red berries would attract some berry eating birds in winter. One species I was especially keen to

attract was the waxwing. However, I had no real expectation that waxwings would appear because they are very infrequent winter visitors to Britain, turning up in numbers only every few years when they cross the North Sea from Scandinavia in search of berries to eat. I can count on one hand the times I have seen waxwings. The first time was in 1971 in central Glasgow – when I did this drawing. I knew it would come in handy one day, although I admit it contains some slight inaccuracies! The last time was on a freezing January morning in 2010 at Gretna service station on the M6. That's the type of place they seem to like. I had never seen a waxwing in Dorset. So, when local birders reported a flock of eight waxwings in Upton in early February, it was time to leave my comfort zone in Corfe Castle and brave a trip into Poole.

Tracking down rare birds can sometimes be a challenge but the waxwings could not have been more obliging – sitting in plain view in the bare branches of two large trees. Although waxwings are about the same size and shape as starlings, and flock in much the same way, they could scarcely look more different. They have the silkiest-looking, pinkish-buff plumage, a black bib and mask, a punky crest, a chestnut-coloured bottom, and a black and yellow tail. However, their most striking feature is their wings which are boldly patterned in black, white, and yellow. The finishing touch is the bright red spiky tips to some of their wing feathers which look like drops of old-fashioned sealing wax – from which they get their name.

To my surprise these birds were not eating bright red berries but the white berries of the mistletoe which was growing in abundance on the two trees. Quite what goodness the birds were extracting from these berries was hard to see as they seemed to be coming out the back end as fast as they went in the front end.

In fact, what came out looked most indigestible - long sticky strings of a glue-like substance containing the undigested mistletoe seeds — which stuck to the branches of the trees where the seeds will now germinate — as nature intended.

Needless to say, there were more birders watching and photographing than there were waxwings – but that is not surprising because they are such spectacular looking and rare birds.

Once they have finished the mistletoe berries the waxwings will wander off in search of more berries. I doubt they will come to the Corfe valley but you never know! I appreciate that this is not really Corfe Valley news but the trees were growing in Dacombe Drive in Upton. Dacombe is a name with a long connection with Corfe Castle, William Dacombe built the house in East Street now known as Mortons Manor.

#### The Rambling Gardener.

With longer days spring is on the way, yeah! I have blue crocus, large pink Cameilla, multi coloured Tulips, lots of different Daffodils and yellow Hypericum Rolacy what else do you have? There, is change every day in March, and no one knows what we will get, hot, cold, gales or still, snow and/or ice, but with the longer days some plants will start growing while others will depend on temperature. Deciduous plants coming into leaf in many differing shades of green. The mixture of colours changing as the leaves reach maturity, fascinating to watch, (the leaves turn red/yellow if to cold or to dry), yet more variation.

Birds are looking their best in beautiful colours for courting, singing for their mates or to proclaim their territory. There are a lot of different species in my garden, 12 come to the bird table and as many can be seen on the wing. I open the window early in the morning and listen to the clear notes of the song thrush. Or, download bird sound app to learn bird song/singers.

Whatever the weather enjoy it, and if you only have a patio or a house you can still grow food on a patio in pots. Even strawberries and tomatoes like hanging baskets in the house, so buy a day light bulb (for better cropping) and to also grow salad crops inside.

When growing plants some animals eat/destroy them is very discouraging. Sticks will keep of pigeons off, prickly Holly stops cats and dogs, aphids are best squashed with fingers, washed off or apply organic sprays. If left sometimes nature sorts aphid problems. I keep a few small hens and ducks who work over all the garden eating slugs, snails and green food, my bonus is my very tasty eggs. Planting salvias next to roses discourage black spots, so think about planting some next to your roses, it will save time in the summer. Remember to take time to just enjoy the outdoors.

March is the time for planting nearly all seeds, there are too many to mention. I just suggest, lettuce, radish, peas, carrots, cabbages, roots, (winter squash and peppers need to be sown in heat of  $18^{\circ}-25^{\circ}$ ), do try something you have not grown before. Order any seeds/plants you need, checking they are plants that will put up with adverse weather. If buying dormant plants without soil (bare rooted), it can stop buying in diseases from other gardens.

It is good to grow food from seed but many things take years to grow. Being able to pick food straight from the garden is good for mind and body, growing lots of fruits is easy. Most fruit trees have now been bred to be smaller, so they crop quicker. Apples for example are first grafted onto dwarf rootstock then different 2 to 3 varieties can be grafted on to one tree. In choosing apples

that ripen in different months, fresh apples can span several months. The fruit will have to picked and stored in a cool place for eating when ripe. Yes, it does take time but is so rewarding. Lots of other fruits that have been grafted on to dwarf rootstock and are worth growing, look them up.

Please divert house/shed water pipes to fill containers or water subsoils deeply, save while we can. We might have another dry summer, so be mindful with water. Spain already has severe water shortages in some areas, and it is only early February (at time of writing)!

Enjoy this year, look forward to a good summer and ask if you want me to give you suggestions for your garden. I love showing people around my garden just email rjehelfer@gmail.com.

#### VOLUNTEERS WIN TWO NATIONAL AWARDS FOR AMBITIOUS RESTORATION OF UNIQUE VICTORIAN STEAM LOCOMOTIVE

Dedicated Swanage Railway volunteers are celebrating after winning two prestigious national awards for their six-year restoration of a unique Victorian steam locomotive so it could haul its first passenger train in almost 80 years.

The Swanage Railway Trust's 563 Locomotive Group scooped the Heritage Railway Association Chairman's Special Award and also the Association's Steam Railway Magazine Readers' Award for the ambitious project costing £650,000.

The two Heritage Railway Association awards to the Swanage Railway Trust came just days after the Swanage Railway won the Business of the Year Award, for its contribution to tourism in the Isle of Purbeck, from The Total Guide to Tourism, in the Purbeck Business Awards.

563 Locomotive Group chairman Nathan Au was presented with the two awards by Heritage Railway Association vice-chairman Chris

Price and Steam Railway deputy editor Thomas Bright at a special Heritage Railway Association Annual Awards evening in Brighton, East Sussex, on Saturday, 10 February 2024.

Resplendent in its new lined out 1890s Drummond passenger green livery, the 81-tonne T3 was officially unveiled in a special ceremony at Swanage station in October, 2023, so that it could haul its first passenger train since 1945 when the locomotive was withdrawn by the Southern Railway after having run a total of 1.5 million miles. With the £650,000 cost of the meticulous restoration almost all covered by generous donations from railway enthusiasts, No. 563 hauled its first freight train since 1945 during a special Winter Warm Up weekend on the Swanage Railway in January, 2024.

Built in 1893 to a design by renowned engineer William Adams – and one of the finest express passenger train locomotives of the Victorian era – the non-working T3 No. 563 was donated to the Swanage Railway Trust by the National Railway Museum in 2017.
