#### **CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL**

#### DECEMBER AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

A member of the public came to address the Council with their concerns about the proposed merger of the Saturn Trust who manage the village Primary School. The parishioner raised a number of concerns involving the leadership within the Trust and the short time given to consultation on the merger.

Cllr Haywood spoke as a member of the public to advise the Council that an anonymous beneficiary wishes to grant the parish £2000 and is seeking ideas from the Parish Council about how it could be best spent. The Council resolved it would invite suggestions from Parishioners which can be addressed to the Clerk.

James Gould from the National Trust wanted to clarify the Trust's position on the **proposed cycle path from Norden to Caste View** and into the village. He asserted the Trust are fully supportive of the implementation of the first stage of the plan; to get cyclists and walkers from Norden to Castle View. They have reservations about phase two of the plan which would direct cyclists along the permissive footpath running parallel to the Corfe River. The path does not have the width to accommodate a cycle path and moving it into the neighbouring tenanted field would create obvious problems.

Cllr Dru Drury said he believes the bollards installed by the Trust on the Arne road are making the road impassable and are not doing a good job. This had been raised before with the Trust. James will take this back to Mark Singleton.

Cllr Fooks advised she had been liaising with ranger Jonathan Kerhshaw about **levelling the ground around a gate accessing the halves**; at present it is not flat enough for a mobility scooter to access and Jonathan is looking at improving this. This is unconnected to the request to make the kissing gates on the halves more accessible. The area at West Mill is currently fenced off. James said the land is unstable and they are not yet sure if it will require archaeological surveys or if it can simply be repaired. He will keep the Council updated.

The Council asked James was there any update on the archaeological dig that was planned at the site of the old tannery? There is no progress to date.

The Council considered their draft budget which proposed an increase to the precept of 1.08%. The precept was set at £30800. The adopted budget will be soon be published on the Parish Council website should you wish to view it.

Cllr Fooks reported that she has received 21 responses to the survey that was circulated asking what parishioners would like to see in the Middle

Halves play area. Many people asked for the same things and the following were noted; a zip wire, a sandpit, a bucket swing, a natural play area, a running track, a trampoline, a hard surface around the basketball ring, equipment for older children and for toddlers, a witches hat, balancing apparatus, seating area within the fenced playground, a bike riding trail. She emphasised this is very much a 'wish list' but hopes some of it will be achievable. Cllr Fooks is initially consulting the landowner to see what is considered acceptable to go into the space and to find out potentially how much of the Middle Halves play area could be used. There would also be a requirement to consult the National Trust and the rights holders of the middle halves. The Council resolved that the next step would be for the playground working group to convene and to decide on a plan, this can then be presented for consultation to the landowners neighbours and the parish.

The Environment Group's Draft Action Plan was approved and the Council approved monthly meetings which will take place on the third Thursday of each month. The public are welcome so do come along and join in. Details of meetings can be found on the Parish Council website <a href="https://www.corfecastlepc.org.uk/corfe-castle-parish-council-environment-working-group">https://www.corfecastlepc.org.uk/corfe-castle-parish-council-environment-working-group</a>/ or contact the Clerk for details.

The Council discussed the merger proposed by the Saturn Trust to merge Corfe Castle Primary School with a newly created much larger trust, the Coastal Learning Partnership. Concerns were raised that the promises being made by the Trust may not materialise and that the needs of a village school may not be recognised as the other schools were generally large urban schools. After a lengthy discussion it was resolved that a letter be written to the Trust summarising the discussion.

On planning matters the Council had no objection to erect a conservatory to rear elevation at 1 Mead Road Corfe Castle, to reconstruct existing flat roof, replacement ground floor window, reduce height of north boundary wall. Internal alterations to include a new staircase at 41 East Street, Corfe Castle and to alterations to existing access at 2 The Lane Kingston. The Council had no objection to the renovation of cottage and barns as a single dwelling with single storey link extensions at Old Dairy Cottage, Woolgarston but did ask the planners take note of neighbour comments and wished to emphasise that there should be no separate habitation in the development. The council had raised an objection to a premises licence at 18A East Street on the ground of preventing crime and disorder. The application will now progress to a hearing at which the details can be discussed with the applicant.

#### The EU Settlement Scheme: Status of European Nationals living in the <u>UK</u>

If you are an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen, you and your family members will need to apply to the EU Settlement Scheme (EUSS) to continue living in the UK.

You will need to complete a short online application form with three key steps:

- Prove your identity
- Show that you live in the UK
- Declare any criminal convictions

Would you find it challenging to apply online? Do you know people who are too vulnerable to do it by themselves? Are you concerned about what happens if you have a criminal conviction? What if you struggle to provide evidence of residency, don't speak or read English or have a complicated family situation? **Yourself, or colleagues friends & families you know may need assistance** to get the immigration status needed to continue to live, work or study in the UK, and be eligible for public services and public funds.

The Home Office is working with a range of local organisations to make sure the EUSS is accessible to all and capable of handling vulnerable applicants with flexibility and sensitivity.

A small team of engagement and case officers, based within Citizens Advice BCP, Citizens Advice in Dorset and Dorset Race Equality Council are here to

help, inform and more importantly **provide support to anyone who is finding any aspect of the application challenging.** 

Time may be running short. It is best to confirm your status now. If you know of any European nationals within your networks and communities who may need advice and help in their application, do not hesitate to raise awareness of the scheme and of the free help available.

#### **NEWS FROM CHURCH KNOWLE PARISH COUNCIL**

The December meeting of the Parish Council was once again held at Furzebrook village hall. Unfortunately two Parish Councillors were unable to attend neither was our Dorset councillor nor the Clerk to the Parish Council, all having given their apologies beforehand; however the remaining three councillors were present and so we were quorate and the meeting could go ahead with one councillor taking notes in lieu of Minutes. Fortunately the numbers in the village hall were increased with the attendance of four parishioners although a representative from the company replacing the finger posts had also apologised as not being able to attend.

The Meeting commenced with the Public Discussion Period during which two parishioners voiced their concerns and objection to a proposed re-routing of a public footpath which would cross their garden; one parishioner requested information on planning applications and one parishioner expressed an interest in becoming a councillor. With regards to the proposed re-routing of the footpath CKPC had suggested an alternative easier route across a field at the November meeting which the parishioners believed to have been the original historical route since the late 18th century. Councillors agreed the parish council records would be made available to search for evidence; CKPC would support their case and speak with our elected Dorset Councillor on their behalf. The request for information on Planning Applications was also discussed with the suggestion of a pre-planning application being discussed with the Purbeck Planning Officer; it was also recommended the parishioner has his architect attend that meeting. Finally the councillors were delighted by the parishioner who expressed an interest in joining CKPC; in the absence of the Clerk it was pointed out the necessity to apply in writing with a 2 weeks' notice being given and published before being co-opted onto the parish council (there being 4 vacancies an election would not be necessary).

The Chairman and Vice-Chairman agreed to continue in their roles until the January 2020 meeting. The Minutes of the November meeting were approved with the proviso of checking the length of time given to the council by Dorset Council to respond to Planning Applications. Under Matters Arising the single street lamp in Church Knowle was discussed and it was decided to have it adopted by Dorset Council who would then install and maintain LED lighting. It was requested by one of the parishioners present if LED lighting was used could it be angled so that pedestrians and drivers were not blinded by it. The discussion of the finger posts and the Corfe River environmental project were postponed until the January meeting as was the matter of maintenance of the playing field and its equipment. The store for the council archives had arrived having been collected and transported by a parishioner; it has been sited behind the village hall with some additional work to be completed.

Only 2 Planning Applications had been received both of which were for tree works within the Conservation Area (TWA/2019/250 and TWA/2019/256). Following the recommendation by the council's designated Tree Officer, the Parish Council had no objection to the work proposed.

Under Highways and Rights of Way it was reported the blocked gulley/culvert at East Creech had been "jetted" by Dorset Council and the local farmer would be contacted to seek his co-operation in clearing the adjoining ditch so hopefully resolving the problem with flooding. The Corfe Castle BOAT (Byway Open to All Traffic) came up for discussion once again with damage being caused to West Hill by 4x4 vehicles using an unauthorised route. Whilst the Green Lane Association (GLASS) has issued a notice warning of possible closure of the route if recreational drivers are abusing the system there are difficulties in obtaining the evidence and identity of the culprits.

Councillors then went on to consider the Church Knowle Cemetery and rights of access. A letter from the Diocese had been received giving comprehensive details about seeking a formal Right of Way or alternatively an "Easement". The latter could provide a permanent agreement for a right of access across the churchyard (owned by the Diocese) to the consecrated cemetery (owned by the Parish Council). This could be to the benefit of all concerned. Discussion continued on the potential legal costs which might be incurred in drawing up an appropriate agreement and how these might be met in cooperation with the Church.

Finances: to quote previous reports in the CVN "The Parish finances were reported on, found to be in good order and bills were paid"!

Following the sad and untimely death of Cllr Les Bugler who had voluntarily maintained the playing field and equipment in such pristine order for so many years, the Parish Council must look to its future maintenance. Discussion ranged from having a rota of volunteers to using professional contractors. All were unanimous in ensuring the playing field was maintained to the same standard as set by Les. With the "growing season" starting perhaps as early as February the Council decided to explore the possibilities as a matter of some urgency.

There being no other items for the reduced number of councillors being able to consider, the December Meeting was closed at 8.30. Seasonal mince pies etc were then enjoyed by all. Next meeting ~ Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2020 in the main hall, Furzebrook village hall.

Wishing all our parishioners a Happy Christmas and a healthy and peaceful New Year. Oh yes, there are still vacancies on the Parish Council should anyone wish to become a councillor. 2020 could be the year of opportunity!!

Patients who use the service are asked to make a contribution to cover the mileage undertaken for each journey and the drivers are reimbursed twice a year on a pro rata basis.

Surplus funds are used to provide items for the benefit of patients and this year we have provided funding to purchase a piece of equipment for the new minor surgery unit at Corfe Castle Surgery.

The Home Library Service brings books to people who can no longer get to a library. It operates from most libraries in Dorset, Poole and Bournemouth.

Volunteers deliver books and share their love of reading with the people they visit. They are a friendly face and a regular visitor to those whose mobility and social interactions are limited, and they provide a useful check on the safety and well-being of their readers, too.

One of our readers commented: "It is an excellent service; it's a real delight when it is hard to get to the library oneself. The volunteer is so friendly, they may be the only person I shall see all day." Maria Jacobson, service manager for Dorset Home Library Service, says, "For people who enjoy reading or listening to an audio recording but find getting out of the house challenging, this service offers a vital link to the local library. The service enables them to carry on doing something they've always enjoyed and helps alleviate feelings of isolation and loneliness." The Home Library Service is delivered free of charge; it is not only for older people, but for anybody who finds getting to the library difficult, including carers.




