

CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

APRIL AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

In April the Parish Council found itself in the extraordinary and unprecedented situation that they were unable to hold a meeting. The Government swiftly issued temporary legislation stating that Parish Councils do not need to meet at specific times and do not need to hold an Annual Meeting which usually takes place in May. Councils are also now permitted to meet virtually online and the public too can join these meetings. The Council hope to meet this way on May 11th and details will be posted on our website as they become available should you wish to join.

The Council was greeted with an overwhelming response to their request for volunteers to help others in the parish through the coronavirus crisis, the number to date is and 54 and we are working closely with the surgery to deliver prescriptions and provide other services across the parish. Many, many individuals have reached out to their neighbours and offered assistance in a time when so many of us cannot act independently and must rely on the help of others and businesses are going above and beyond to deliver to the community. There is a fantastic network at work and the community response is testament to what an amazing place Corfe is.

If you need any assistance, collecting a prescription or accessing food or services please, please stay at home and phone a neighbour, a friend or the Clerk (01929 426125) who can help. The Parish Council website www.corfecastlepc.org.uk is being regularly updated with links to provisions and other useful information.

In the absence of an April meeting the Council was able to conduct some business via email following a resolution to suspend standing orders which was made at the March meeting.

The Council resolved to formally say THANK YOU to the wonderful team of volunteers, to neighbours who are quietly running errands for those next door and phoning others to say hello, to the many local businesses who are working their socks off to help those in the Parish delivering food and services, to the surgery and all the NHS, to keyworkers, thank you! You are all brilliant.

In response to Government guidance the **Parish Council closed the playground and public toilets early in March**. They hoped that shutting the toilets would deter visitors and notices were placed in all areas. The PC did receive a request to close the West Street car park which they referred to Dorset Council who own the car park. A Councillor has been monitoring use of the West Street car park and reports it to be very low.

CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

The Council resolved to continue to contract the local business which cleans the toilets. at a reduced rate. The service carried out by the contractor is excellent and the Council hope that this will help to support their business through the crisis. The contractor will still be making regular visits to the toilets to check the facilities and clean as required.

The Council was asked by Defend Dorset NHS to write to support Swanage Town Council in opposing a proposal to remove the Swanage Rapid Response Ambulance Car from service. The Council promptly received subsequent information advising the car would remain in Swanage for at least a further 8 weeks, and subsequently through the duration of the crisis. The Council resolved that they would write a letter opposing the proposal of any future removal of the Swanage Ambulance car.

The Sandbanks ferry company proposed in February a 25p increase in the one way fare, which at 5.5% is less than the rate of inflation since the last increase and to limit increases in future years to 3%. Of good news for local passengers is that bulk ticket prices will be frozen until at least 2021. The company has pledged not to take any dividends and instead to build up the replacement fund. The implementation date is not mentioned on the website. Like all businesses the ferry company must have experienced a huge drop in demand since February as leisure traffic is currently banned. The Council had campaigned against the last proposal which was in turn rejected by the Secretary of State following a public inquiry. It was recommended by the chairman that the Council do not oppose the increase on the basis that a formal objection and public enquiry to a modest increase for casual visitors would create additional difficulties for the company. This vote went in favour of making no objection to the proposals.

The Council resolved not to implement a planned increase to a higher rate for a local business impacted by the coronavirus crisis for parking spaces currently rented in the West Street reserved car-park. The decision was made to support the local business owner and does not apply to permits used by holiday properties or those whose sole residence is not in the village.

Dorset Council have painted **double yellow lines outside of Gods Acre Cemetery**. These address a historical problem raised by residents. Parking there forced pedestrians exiting the Car Park out into the lane. The Council had initially requested bollards be placed outside of the cemetery which were not deemed suitable by Dorset Council and double yellow lines were suggested as an alternative.

CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

On planning matters, the Parish Council had no objection to 1- Internal alterations to kitchen and bathroom to install new kitchen windows and French doors to bathroom, to replace rear door with window, to roof alterations and a new Patio area at 74 East Street Corfe Castle. 2-To replace patio doors to rear including repairs to associated stonework & lintel & removal of existing render to replace with a lime mortar render and to replace render on gable (south) elevation at 160 East Street, Corfe Castle. 3-To Install a flue to front elevation at 73 West Street, Corfe Castle.

The next meeting will be held virtually on the 11th May 2020 at 7pm in various kitchens, sitting rooms and other locations across the parish. Please contact the Clerk if you need details of how to join as the Clerk will need to open the website up for you to reduce the risk of hacking. *





Arrange now to plan your help: Contact family, friends and neighbours about supporting each other: take each other's phone numbers and e-mails so they are easy to find.

For those who are not vulnerable Is there any one you know who doesn't have regular visitors e.g. those new to the area, those who live on their own? Please make contact and offer support/exchange numbers etc.

If one of your links has to self isolate ring each other every day to ask if something needs collecting (milk and food, newspapers etc) and to see how they are.

NEWS FROM CHURCH KNOWLE PARISH COUNCIL

There's not much, really, to report as far as "news" is concerned from the Parish Council. Indeed, if one reads the newspapers or watches TV or listens to the wireless or, indeed, listens to the latest gossip in and around the Parish there's not much news at all except, of course, the Covid-19/Coronavirus pandemic. Because of the national "lockdown", the Parish Council could not hold its monthly meeting as meetings of over 2 people not of the same family are currently banned. But in any case because many of the Members of the Council are either over 70 or have underlying medical conditions which means they have to "self-isolate" for at least the next 3 months, it would be nigh impossible to have a quorum for any meeting. It is possible that if the current pandemic continues as it is at present, the "lockdown" will be extended and the May Annual Parish Meeting will have to be postponed. The parish clerks of councils around the country are currently going bald pulling their hair out trying to work out how to retain local democracy in these times of severe crisis. A computer program designed for "virtual" business and committee meetings called Zoom is being looked at by the Clerk so that "virtual" meetings of the Parish Council can be held, but the main problem with this is that Parish Councils must be open and unless all Parishioners can be linked into Zoom the meeting would not be fully open to the public. Don't worry, though, we're sure something will turn up.

In these dreadful times members of the community of the Parish have been very busy giving support to those less fortunate at being able to weather the storm. Thanks are due to Matt Estop and staff at the New Inn in Church Knowle for providing take-aways and a Meals on Wheels service for village and Parish residents. The Church Knowle Support Group has also been busy making sure that there is some form of normality in the Parish and village. Thanks are also due to our new playing field and playground "groundsman" for carrying on the hard work done by our late Les Bugler. And finally, thank you all for not using the playground and field while they are closed thereby helping to save lives and protecting the NHS with your behaviour.

One matter which has caused concern is that it has been reported that several "weekend" cottages and holiday homes appear to be in habitation. Of course, this is completely against the government guidelines and, indeed, what is now the law if they became "inhabited" after the "lockdown" began ~ please see the CKPC website for the parish council's notice. It's worth pointing out, historically the Great Plague escalated from "epidemic" to "pandemic" status during the 16th century when people left the cities for the countryside hoping to get away from the Black Death. Even then, with limited transport and communication, it didn't work as those people also managed to spread the *Yersinia pestis* micro-organism around the country resulting in millions of deaths. Anyway, that's that for this month and the Parish Council would like to wish all readers well in the hope that we all come out the other side of this dreadful episode for Humanity.



Also cancelled is this year's Murder Walk in the castle.


As our May auditions for the November **Wizard of Oz** production have also bitten the dust there is clearly doubt about that happening, in spite of the old adage 'the show must go on!'

That being said, if you are concerned at all about a child who is unwell the NHS 'Healthier Together' initiative at www.what0-18.nhs.uk offers useful and practical help, as well as the usual pathways such as ourselves, 111 and- in the event of an emergency- 999 or A&E.

A reminder to anybody who owns holiday property that you must reside in your primary address and not visit second homes. Those with property to rent should have cancelled all bookings for the foreseeable future until current restrictions are lifted. A reminder that 'non-essential' travel is not permitted under any circumstance so as to avoid the spread of Covid-19 to other areas of the country; despite feeling well in yourself you could still be carrying the virus.

Finally, we would like to make a plea for everyone to be patient with our dispensary staff who have been working flat out to ensure your medication is available to you despite the challenging circumstances which has led to a huge increase in demand and issues with our supply chain.

On behalf of all the staff at the surgery we wish you a safe and happy bank holiday.



Ian Jackson writes:

In April I wrote at the point when church services were no longer to take place but the church buildings were remaining open. That changed fairly soon afterwards, along with many other aspects of our lives. This time I am writing just as the lockdown has been extended for a further 3 weeks.

Our thoughts and emotions, I'm sure, are varied and changing. There is certainly a prevailing sense of gratitude for all the help and support that is available: not least from our local businesses, the surgery, parish councils and volunteers, friends and neighbours. I have had several telephone conversations where we have expressed this, as well as real appreciation of living in this part of the country with uplifting views, walks and fresh air for many. (I realise air quality has improved in most places; the air here seems even fresher than usual.)

At the same time, we are also increasingly aware of the many challenges being faced; we think of those who have been ill, those who have died and those who mourn them; we think of those working so hard in the NHS and other emergency and essential services. We think too of those finding it very hard not being able to go out and to meet others, especially when they live on their own. We think of each other – no doubt, all having some times that are less uplifting than others.

We could all add to the above – much to be grateful for; many to think of, help if possible, and pray for, and not least the Government and other authorities making decisions, and the people with specialist knowledge advising and

guiding. And, of course, we cannot be clear how it will be in the coming weeks and months.

Life has changed for us all. We continue to be in touch, but are discovering different ways of being so. It is the same with the worshipping life of the church. I have come across people taking part in 'zoomed' services, others following on line services from the Cathedral in Salisbury (with shots of the cathedral itself and readings and addresses from the homes of those taking part) and then others appreciating the services on television, in particular those from St Peter's in Rome. Different again, but no less appropriate was the service on Easter Day with the Archbishop in his kitchen in Canterbury.

Elsewhere in the magazine you will find information about help that is available. The email newsletter which John and Dawn Lindsay are circulating contains a lot of such information as well as messages from myself, Anne Bond and John Andrews, and prayers for each Sunday from those who lead the prayers in our services. (Send an email to jwlindsay2@gmail.com if you want to be on this email list.) Usually, the information and material in the email is also displayed in the church porch at Corfe Castle.

I seek to join my own thoughts and prayers with so many others around the world, as we all support and encourage each other.

You will see there are more readings than usual. As well as the epistle and gospel readings we have included the psalm for each Sunday and during the Easter season a reading from the Acts of the Apostles. For Trinity Sunday there is an Old Testament reading.

You may find these readings helpful for use at home when we cannot meet in church. It may be you use them all together or over several days. Sometimes just a few verses will be helpful. There is no right way.



The library building may be closed but this doesn't mean you cannot borrow ebooks and digital audiobooks or read digital versions of magazines and newspapers. It's all free as long as you are member of the library (which is also free). If you are not already a member you can join online now and gain access to the online resources (and come into the library after the crisis has passed with some form of ID to remain a member – the time limit for this has been extended from four weeks to four months).

All you need to access these services is web access, your library number (on your card) and your pin number (the one you use to take books out at the self-service machine in the library). It's all available through four different on-line services:

• Magazines: RB Digital Magazines

Ebooks: *cloudLibrary*Audiobooks: *BorrowBox*Newspapers: *Newsbank*.

The resources can be downloaded to a variety of devices: iPad, Windows tablet, laptop or desktop PC, Mac, iPhone, iPod Touch, Android Phone, Kindle Fire.

The magazines available include popular titles such as Good Housekeeping, The Economist, National Geographic, the BBC magazines (Gardening, Wildlife, History, etc.), New Scientist, Health and Fitness magazines, Ideal Home, Hello, Radio Times, TV times, Vogue, Cosmopolitan. There were over 130 titles at the last count, you are almost guaranteed to find something of interest.

Cathedral Window Restored

Senior conservator Sam Kelly said water had been pouring through the window.

"When we put up the scaffolding, we discovered that the top was hanging out and could have fallen out," he said. During the 16th century a huge amount of glazing and blacksmithing was being done and most of the bar work of the nave windows was 16th century. However, the bars above the 16th century ones were medieval and this explained why water was pouring in: in

One of Salisbury Cathedral's magnificent stained glass windows has been restored, thanks to fundraising by its Friends association.

The money was raised at the Friends' 2019 open gardens event and matched by the sales of paintings and a book by Salisbury Florilegium Society.

A group of the Friends visited the cathedral's glaziers' workshop earlier this year to learn about the restoration process. The window, one of 12 by Clayton & Bell, was erected by 'grateful patients and friends' in memory of William Martin Coates in 1886.

medieval times handmade blacksmith's nails would have been used and when these fail, the bars that held the glass in place also fail, letting in water. He explained that when a window is brought to the workshop, two rubbings are made of it and all the details of the work to be done are marked on the rubbings: the one on brown paper is the working document and the one on white paper is kept forever to enable future glaziers to know what materials had been used.

"After this is done, we strip the old leadwork out and re-lead," he said. "We take it apart and lay it out like a jigsaw. Everything has to fit to the bar work.

"It is impurities that make bars rust, so the more it is worked, the more impurities are worked out of the metal.

"Nowadays stainless steel is used – we cannot afford to have bars blacksmithmade!

"Every light has at least a couple of bars on it to hold it totally in place."

The window was returned to the south nave aisle during March, just before the cathedral was closed to visitors due to the coronavirus pandemic.


Easter at Kimmeridge

Master of the pooliverse

When this appears we may still be having to spend more time at home than we might want. I imagine that if you have a garden it will be looking better cared for than it has for years. You may even have turned the whole lot over to

growing fruit and veg. But if you have a bit that is not under potatoes you might consider another project - digging a garden pond.

Ten years or so ago, I took the plunge and dug a pond in my garden. It's been a source of interest ever since. Some purists advise not adding any plants or animals so a new pond is colonised naturally, but I cheated and planted a variety of native water plants like flag iris, water mint, water soldiers and some others that add oxygen to the water. However, I did not knowingly add any animals – and it was amazing how fast pondlife appeared. Tiny water fleas appeared almost immediately and they helped to clear the water which turned soupy at first. They were followed by water beetles, water snails, water lice, water scorpions, water boatmen and pond skaters. The most charismatic pond-dwellers are the damselflies and dragonflies and even my small pond has been home to seven species including the impressively large Southern hawkers and Emperor dragonflies.

The adult damselflies and dragonflies lay their eggs in or at the edge of the pond and after up to two years of eating anything smaller than they are the nymphs emerge to turn into adults. This is an amazing business. The nymphs come to the surface and climb out of the water onto stems of pond plants, usually just after dark, and when about a foot or so above the waterline will start to struggle out from their old skin and emerge as crumple-winged adults. They then have to pump up their wings and wait for them to dry before they can fly. I assumed they also had to be warmed by the morning sun so when I first went out to check in the early morning and found them all gone I thought the birds had had them all. So, the next night I snipped off all the plant stems with new nymphs attached and stuck them in the greenhouse for safe-keeping overnight. Before sun up next morning I found the greenhouse already swarming with darting Emperor dragonflies.

Obviously they can warm themselves up by shivering just like moths do. I ushered them all out of the door.

And its not just invertebrates that benefit from a new pond. Any sized pond will be used by newts and probably also frogs. My pond had frogs for years but then they disappeared. I am not sure why — maybe the water chemistry has changed with all the tree leaves that have now fallen in, maybe frogs can't move between gardens now separated by solid fences, or (and I do have some evidence here) maybe they have all been scoffed by grass snakes. Several times in the heat of the summer noonday sun I have found big frogs hopping down the garden path as fast as they could go and wondered why — only to find a grass snake in the pond — once in the act of having its lunch!

Now, all of that is just the pondlife you can see with the naked eye. If you take a drop or two of the water and look at it through a microscope – you find another whole world of mini-beasties in there – a veritable pooliverse of your own creation.


