Church Knowle Parish Council - May Meetings

There were three meetings in May. The Annual Parish meeting at 6:00pm on Tuesday 9th at the Church Knowle Village Hall, The Annual Parish Council meeting at 6:30pm on Tuesday 9th at the Church Knowle Village Hall and a Parish Council Meeting at 6:30pm on Tuesday 16th to complete the agenda carried over from the 9th May meeting that was adjourned by the Chairman.

The meetings on 9th May were attended by the full Parish Council of nine members, with Cllr Evans in chair, and four members of the public. The meeting on the 16th May was attended by three Parish Councillors, two members of the public and the Dorset Councillor.

The Parish Meeting – 6-00pm 9th May

Every Parish has to have an annual Parish Meeting which is separate from the Parish Council but is chaired by the Chairman of the Parish Council. This gives a report to the parish of the activities of the Parish Council, a report on the finances of the parish and any organisations or voluntary groups can also give reports. Electors can make statements or ask questions.

The Chairman of the parish council gave a report. All of the assets of the Parish managed by the Council are in good order. The Neighbourhood Plan is progressing well and should be complete this year and ready to be put before the parish. The key themes that have been identified are:

- Preserving the local environment
- Infrastructure and energy sustainability
- Housing needs
- Access and transport
- Supporting farming and local businesses

The clerk of the parish council reported that the finances of the parish were in good order, that the precept is set to balance the out goings, mainly the clerk's salary, maintenance of the playing field, the cemetery and other parish assets, phone boxes, sign posts, footpaths etc. All of these are kept in good order and thanks is due to the contractors and others that do this. The current precept does not have reserves for any contingencies and this may be addressed in the future.

There were no questions from parishioners or reports from other organisations.

The Annual Parish Council Meeting – adjourned - 6-30pm 9th May.

The Annual Parish Council Meeting which took place at 6:30pm after the Annual Parish Meeting has the elections of the Chairman, other officers, committees etc. for the year as the first item on its agenda. The Chairman from the April meeting, Cllr Evans presided and opened the meeting.

It had been resolved at the April meeting to ensure that all Councillors had been legally qualified under section 79 of the Local Government Act 1972 to join the Council at the time of their co-option or election. The Chair moved this to the head of the agenda and all Councillors verified that they had been qualified at the time of taking office.

The next agenda item was the election of the Chairman. There was no-one willing to stand for the full year but it was advised that Chairman once elected was not under obligation to stand for the full term and could resign at any time. Cllr Pippa Edwards was then proposed and her appointment was unanimously approved. Cllr Burt was elected as vice-chairman.

Cllr Pippa Edwards then resigned and the meeting was adjourned by Cllr Evans who had retained the Chair as it had become disorderly. In order to complete the agenda another meeting of the Parish Council was scheduled for the following week at the same time.

During the intervening week three resignations and an additional vacancy owing to an unforeseen difficulty with LGA1972 s83 occurred. This leaves the Council with five members and there are now four vacancies.

The May Parish Council Meeting – resumed – 6-30pm 16th May

At this meeting which resumed the agenda from the adjourned meeting there were three councillors, the Dorset Councillor and two members of the public. Cllr Parker took the Chair and Cllr Wilson the Vice-chair.

The main items of interest in the meeting were:

Planning

The Council resolved to have No Objection to the application (P/FUL/2023/01811) to convert an outbuilding to a small dwelling provided it was subject to the same environmental standards required by Natural England for the Withy Lakes development.

Highways







News from The Castle

June 2023, how time flies! ... Still, the nights are short, and the days are long, so let's make the most of it. As we roll into summer, it's starting to get busy in the garden again.

It's that time again when we are offering summer jobs, so, old or young, if you want to earn some extra cash, give us a ring or call in for a chat.

It is really a lovely time of year with the flowers starting to bloom, days are longer and that lovely scent in the air with promise of long hot lazy days. So why not come and enjoy a cool glass of wine with a bowl of mussels, or just pop in and enjoy the garden.

Friday nights are still Fish nights. So, if you fancy a crab salad or local hand dived scallops not to mention the mouth-watering fish dishes, on offer. Sunday June 18th is that special day, the chance to spoil all the Dads. (Let's face it, they do deserve it). Please remember to book, so we help, to make them feel even more special.

Whatever you are all doing in June have fun, and hopefully that lovely yellow thing in the sky, will shine to make it even better

Where are the bodies buried?

In the 17th century, with few forms of entertainment, there were opportunities to be very nosy about your neighbours. You could be named and shamed in church for your misdemeanours and, when you died, two men came and took an inventory of all your goods and chattels and totted them up to see how much you were worth, so everyone knew exactly what you'd got. Some of the wills of the 1600s also list where they wanted to be buried. Of the wills that have survived for the prerogative court of St Edwards, most were happy to be buried in the churchyard, but some wanted to be buried inside St Edwards and stated where they were to be placed.

The Revd. Hutchins mentions various chest tombs inside St Edwards - William Miller and Robert Abbott's tombs lay in the north aisle; in the south aisle lay the tombs of John Uvedale (possibly) and William Bonfeild. The only remnant of a chest tomb now is a small piece of marble inserted in a doorway in the chapel now used for flowers. This belonged to Robert Abbott who died in 1620 and was considered important enough for it to be inscribed in 1689. He was a great benefactor of the Corfe Castle Charities.



William Bondfield's tomb lay at the upper end of the southern aisle and although not inscribed, Hutchins recorded that he had left enough money to provide bread for 24 poor people every Sunday forever. This is not the actual tomb of the William who benefitted the poor as he had died in Essex in 1600. It is the tomb of his father, and this is where his son wished the bread to be doled out.

The bottom half of a child's coffin still survives in the Chapel of the Holy Spirit (a bit worse for wear as it was moved out into the churchyard for several years). It is dated to the 12th century and lay in the southern corner of the church originally.



The numbers interred inside the church that are recorded in the 1600s by the court are:

The south aisle -2The north aisle -1The chancel -4 Near to their seat in church -1In the porch -3No specific place inside -5

One asked to be near her sister, one near her husband but it was Thomas Seward of Woolgarston who was different and wanted to be buried near his seat in church. Sadly, I don't know where that was as he died in 1631 prior to the Civil War and because the Cromwellian troops caused a bit of damage inside the church, the seating had to be altered by 1646. The layout of St Edwards has slightly changed too as the chancel was extended eastwards in the early 1940s. Originally it would have been where the choir sits now. The porch has not changed though from the church's very beginnings in the 12th century.

The Reverend Anne Bond writes

I don't know about you, but on 6th May I was transfixed by the television viewing of the Coronation of King Charles III. Despite Britain's Lords and Ladies being asked not to wear ermine and coronets, the procession being a fraction of that for the late Queen Elizabeth's funeral, and the King sporting as low-brow robes as he could get away with, it was a spectacle of stunning magnificence. We Brits do pomp and circumstance better than anyone else, and in the doing, broadcast to the world at large that we are still a force to be reckoned with.

But there are many among us who think of the financial implications of such an occasion - and shudder. How many hospitals could have been built for the millions spent on crowning our new King? How many houses constructed for the homeless, carers funded for old peoples' homes or food banks stocked?

At the risk of being considered 'political' (outside my remit) rather than 'spiritual' (what I'm supposed to be), it seems to me these concerns are valid. However, the matter is considerably bigger than that. When during a dinner party held in his honour Jesus was accused of condoning heedless extravagance by allowing his feet to be anointed with expensive oil instead of the money the oil cost being given to the poor, his response was "you will always have the poor among you, but you will not always have me". (John 12:1-11) Like so much of what Jesus said, this deceptively simple answer has many layers.

Essentially, what Jesus was condoning was the giving of the best with no thought of reciprocal gain. King Charles' mother, the late Queen Elizabeth II, at her Coronation took for her own personal ruling principle the Christian value of Royal Majesty equating selfless service rather than selfish gain. Her son and heir has followed her example, throughout his life as well as when he was being made King. It was explicitly spelled out at his Coronation, in the pattern and words of the formal shape of the ceremony, in the Archbishop of Canterbury's sermon, and in the attitude of those taking part.

A Coronation is a rare occurrence in this 21st century. Spending the millions it undoubtedly cost (especially at a time of international world-wide financial difficulty) resulted in an outpouring of the best for the edification and joy of everyone of all languages who attended it, in the Abbey and lining the route of the procession and all over the world watching it with such enjoyment on TV. Funding medical care, providing accommodation for everyone, and so on, is for our political shakers and movers - no less important, and incidentally something we must take extremely seriously next year when there will be a general election; but the provision of so deeply morally significant a spectacle as the widely broadcast Coronation of a good, honest, environmentally aware and spiritual man as our new King is rare and precious and not to be taken lightly. The sick and homeless will always be among us, in every generation – but the relentless march of time ensures that our moral influencers need to leave something behind by which to remember them. If Jesus' often repeated commandment to 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength, and love your neighbour as yourself' came across via the whole vast spectacle of the Coronation to the millions watching as it did to me, the millions it cost will have been well spent.

LIVING WITH LOSS

We, in this Church have recently experienced loss, the death of a much-loved member. There is nothing like a funeral to concentrate the mind. We know that death will come to us all, sooner or later. It is the inescapable certainty in life!

Are you ready for it? Our beloved member was ready. Many, many years ago she had come into a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus. She had not (I hasten to add) 'got religion' as some people like to say.

What a difference this made to the funeral and memorial service! What a difference it has made for her dear family, now having to live with loss. Yes, the sadness, sorrow, anguish and emptiness are the same for us all when we lose a loved one, yet.... We use that word 'Loss' too easily! – Is something lost when you know where it is?

Jesus speaks of the believer being 'with Him' at death. The earthly body (spoken of as a tent by Simon Peter) certainly does die, but the person who has been living in the tent does not. Jesus said 'He that believes in Me, though he were dead, yet shall he live, and He that believes in Me shall never die.'

You may claim to be one who 'doesn't believe'. Are you so sure of your disbelief that you are prepared to face death with it?

Whatever you believe or do not believe will not alter the facts of the case. The important thing is to believe the truth. Jesus said 'I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me' Paul said: 'I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord'

That's the type of loss one CAN live with!

You may have recently lost someone you dearly loved. It may have been a spouse of many years, a child of only a few months, a loving father, or a trusted friend. No matter what the relationship, the separation has been painfully agonizing and it feels like a hole has been torn in your soul that cannot be mended. God can be with us in our most lonely moments. We will

discover there is a safe haven of rest in the midst of a painful world. People who can hear God say 'I will never leave you or forsake you' are those who can then say 'The Lord is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?' The Bible tells us that there is a pathway through difficult times in our lives that leads to higher ground. It is the perilous path of the valley of the shadow of death that David spoke of in Psalm 23:4. 'Yes, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil for you are with me. Your rod and staff they comfort me'

David was talking about the times when God walks with us through our dark valley experiences – Grief is one of those valley experiences.

In the valley of grief, where the way is torturous and we are so unsure of ourselves, we learn to trust God. Trust enables us to maintain perspective by 'walking by faith, not by sight'; (2 Cor 5:7) as we go through the experience. Otherwise, we will lose our way and get hopelessly lost in despair.

We need a trusted guide to lead us when we've lost sight of where we're headed. Only one Guide is reliable enough to lead us. The Guide is Jesus Christ. He really is,

'The Way, the Truth, and the Life' (John 14:6)



Dear Friends

This year's Loneliness Awareness Week will take place between the 12th – 18th June. As such the Growing compassionate Communities charity will be playing an active role in raising awareness of loneliness. I believe that Loneliness and isolation in our communities is one of the most significant challenges facing people and communities currently.

So, let's talk about loneliness. In this month's Pioneer view, I want to explore this theme of loneliness in more depth.

What is Loneliness? A definition:" Loneliness is a perceived mismatch between the quality or quantity of social connections that a person has and what they would like to have". Perlman, Daniel, and L. Anne Peplau (1981)

Let's now explore what impact loneliness has on our lives. Research has linked social isolation and loneliness to higher risks for a variety of physical and mental health conditions: Such as, high blood pressure, heart disease, obesity, anxiety, depression, memory problem's, various forms of dementia and even death.

People who find themselves unexpectedly alone due to the death of a spouse or partner, separation from friends or family, retirement, loss of mobility, and lack of transportation are at particular risk.

However, what about a remedy? It is suggested that engagement in meaningful, productive activities with others tend to live longer, boost their mood, and have a sense of purpose. These activities seem to help maintain their well-being and may improve their cognitive function.

Reducing loneliness and isolation sits at the core of the Growing Compassionate Communities charity's mission and vision.

In all that we seek to do through our groups and activities is to reduce loneliness and isolation and promote and facilitate wellbeing in all the communities we serve. During loneliness awareness week, we will be a running a campaign to raise awareness of loneliness and isolation in the communities we serve as well ass launching an information leaflet.

Latest news from Kimmeridge Bay

It's been a busy couple of months since we re-opened the centre in April. The Easter weekend was early this year and the crowds arrived as expected. The Kimmeridge snorkel trail was put out in late April, which was a little earlier than usual. Waterproof guides, masks and snorkels can be purchased at the centre, and masks and snorkels are available for hire. For tide times, visibility and safety information ring the number below.

Dorset Seal Project

Grey seals have been observed in the bay as well since the centre re-opened, with a very obliging individual photographed (from a respectful distance) on 12th April. Two species of seal are native to UK waters, grey seals and common (or harbour) seals, both of which can be encountered in Dorset. The UK is important for both species, being home to almost 40% of the global grey seal population and around 30% of the European subspecies of the common seal population. Although seals do not have any natural predators in Dorset, they face increasing pressures from environmental and human-based sources. Dorset Wildlife Trust staff (based at Kimmeridge) run the Dorset Seal Project and more information on seals can be found here... https://www.dorsetwildlifetrust.org.uk/what-we-do/protect-wildlife-and-wild-places/dorset-seals

This includes an online recording form for your sightings, and advice on how to watch seals responsibly. As well as Kimmeridge seals are regularly recorded in Poole Harbour and around Weymouth and Portland, so keep your eyes peeled when you are at any of Dorset's beaches.

Eyes to the skies!

My husband Pat also had a first for his Kimmeridge list, on one of his early morning walks around the bay when he spotted an unexpected pair of Garganey ducks in with a flock of herring gulls off washing ledge Happy birding, Rose
