## NOVEMBER AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

Mr John Hole, a farmer in the Parish, is against the proposal to create National Park status for Purbeck and addressed the Councill on that basis. In his opinion, any comparison with the recently created South Downs National Park was unhelpful as this area already receives many visitors with little opportunity to improve the infrastructure. He suggested many perceived benefits that were being put forward such as helping local communities were not actually high on Park priorities compared to other targets such as Tourism. Also, that National Park status provided no greater protection against imposed housing targets than Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) status which the area already enjoys. Further, he thought Park funding post 'Brexit' would not be maintained at current levels. As for other benefits such as agricultural schemes, these were already in place in Purbeck. He has visited National Parks such as the Brecon Beacons and the Yorkshire Dales and was dismayed at the damage to footpaths and road verges there.
This Council has taken no position on the proposal for a National Park and will continue to monitor the situation.
Mr lan Welsh from Kimmeridge addressed the Council on the benefits of a defbrillater oftherwise known as an AED (automatic external defibrillater). He provided a practical demonstration of the use of such a device for the benefit of all present and emphasised how no training was required in order to use one. He was keen for the Council to organise the availability of at least one AED to be made avalable 24 hours per day. seven days a week basis in a heated cabinet for public use. The Parish Council was impressed by the presentation and will be investigating the possibility of funding more than one AED and cabinet so that both Corfe Castle and Kingston can be adequately provisioned.
The Parish Council made financial contributions to the Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance, the Corfe Valley News, the Dubber, the Dorset Citivens Advice Bureau. Litter-Free Purbeck and the Purbeck Youth a Community Foundation.
The Parish Council considers al planning applications and submits comments to the District Council. The Parish Council had no objection to the following proposals: The installation of a new staircase to the second floor involving removal of an existing ladder access at Woolgarston Cottage, 1 Sandy Hill Lane, Woolgarston, Corfe Castle. The non-material amendment to planning permission 6/2015/0568 (The erection of a replacement pitched-roofed side extension with roof lights and habitable accommodation in the roof) to provide an additional window, to change a
window to a door and change the style of the entrance canopy at Chapel Cottage, Kingston. The creation of an en-suite bathroom to a bedruom on the first floor and the installation of an extractor fan to the front at 2 East Street, Corfe Castie. The formation of a new vehicular access and hard standing for use as car parking at 4 Mead Road, Corfe Castle.

## NEWS FHOU CHURCH KNOWLE PARISH COUNCIL

Cl Page was in the Chair for the November meeting at the Church Knowe Preading Room. 18 parishioners, phblic and Parish Councilors squeezed into the room and heard, amongst other things, from the Purbeck Faly organisation who would like to donate funds to the Parish so that a cardiac defibilator unit could be made availatle to Church Krowle. The Purbeck Fally was celebrating its $44^{\text {th }}$ anniversary and the meeting heard that it had started behind the New Inn at Chuich Knowle. The cost would be approximately $£ 1,500$ and the annual cost of electricity to run it would be about 51.00 p . By dialling 999, South West Amtbtance would provide a code to open the unit and would at the same time send out an emergency care practitioner. Members agreed, unanimoushy, that such an offer was magnificent and would attend the presentation of the unit en $25^{\text {h }}$ Novernber at Furcebrook Vilage Hall. There was then discussion as to where to put the box, the old 'phone box and the New Inn being suggested Members would sit down and thirk hard on this matter.

Next in the putlic discussion period was the subject of the proposed national park. One of the Parishioners, a famer, informed the meeting that the there was a "big repart" about the subject on the internet and it would appear some of the features and benefits cited originally were, in his visw, apparently not necessarily of benefit to this area. He went on to question some of the reasons for designation. Throughout the report there appeared to be mention of protection of habitat and it does recognise some other elements. He felt, however, there is ctuplication of some of them which would appeared are already in place and he opined there wery little to be gained? The Parishioner voiced his concems and disinclination to see this introduced. The acting Chaiman said no decision could be made at the meeting is it would have to be "locked into". It would appear presentations have been made to other parlies i.e. Arne Parish Council and business in Weymouth. In general terms, the mexting did not appear to wholly embrace the concept and clearly were not in a position to make concrete decisions at this stage. The meeting was reminded that at a previous the Parish Council had voted to slpport PDCs deciaion to investigate the national park proposition and when PDC's report came out, they would decide their policy then. The report referred to by the Parishioner could be found at the East Dorset and Devon national park web site.

A Parishioner from East Greech was concerned that there was a proposal by PDC to reduce the size of the East Creech conservation area. He had received a copy of a keaflet advertising a consultation period regaring it.

It would appear the street plan has not altered since $18^{\text {b }}$ Century and now the suggestion is to reduce the area. The meeting was tokd that there is an extensive report on the intemet. One of the Parish Councillors indicated this includes Geeech Barrow and gave an owerview of historical changes in the landscape, The document advises what can and cannot be done and paragraphs were read out diectly from the docmment. Concems were addressed about the current $3000+$ bormes proposals for the district and potential to cause further angst in the Pubeck parishes. It was suggested that clarification should be sought on how it might affect villaxeshameets that had thei conservation areas reduced. The acting Chairman suggested this be aired at the next meeting to give opportunity for a full detate and this was agreed.

There was a "folkw-up" regarding car parking at the CK Church which had been raised at the October meeting and put back to this Novermber full meeting. An update was given on the Chairman and the ckerk having spoken to the Pector who wil speak to the bride, and groom prior to the wedding and to their ushers regarding the parking. The view was that there being only 2 or 3 weddings per year wedding guests would be "advised on parking" (in the nicest possible way) but only the constabulary could demand vehiceses be removed, neither the Parish Councian nor the clergy have the authority to order the removal of vehickes causing an obstruction. The other alternative is to seek the support of the Police with potentially some form of "bollards" to control temporary parking. The parishioner who brought the matter up sought clarification and there was stil question mark hanging over the, matter as it was felt a resolution had not been secured but only time will tell. One of the Councillows commented the wedding parly ushers should be charged with drecting the grests appropriately.

The business meeting then began with the usual stuff regarding declarations of interest - of which there were, none -, approval of the last meeting's minutes, matters arising and postponements of items until a later meeting.

A planning application from the animal sanctuary to demolish some buildings and buld new ones ( 620160619 ) was presented and after examination and discussion it was felt that although the proposed buikfing is stightily higher than existing and there were some questions about drainage through the centre of the building, the proposal brings everything together (B stables, isolation unit and a workshop) in effectively one unit The council had no objections to the proposal.

During "Reports on Highways overgrowths in parish from Conncillors", concern was raised about the condion of the grassed "triangle" at East Creech by the sign; a parishioner had also raised comecris about the state of the near-by dich. Cles will have a look at both.

Overgrowth clearances in Church Krowie haxd apparently still not been effectively cleared by Raglan Housing Assn ard their hedge at Long Ground was sticking out at head height to horse riders. It was thought some mathirery has been in the locality but it was not clear if this has been rectified. There is also the issue of debis keft by the cutters which will doubtess end $1 p$ with further discussion later in the year when drains are blocked The Dorset County Courncillor present suggested if aryone rings up Dorset Highways, they should tell him so he could be made aware and potentially "influence the matter". He said that he has never been made aware of the problems but this was "countered' by Cllis present who commented that he had been present at previous meetings when discussions regarding the matter had taken place

East Creech won an award this year which attracted a certificate and e50. Ore of the comncillors had consulted the community for ideas on how to spend the award One thing which is apparent, wild flowers are popotar with the public and he wondered if it was worth taking this $\varphi$ at Creech. As a result, he received pledges and support from parishioners approaching E500. Some of the area has been seeded

The monthly accounts were examined and found to be in good order. The Paish Commil's bark accounts were healthy and inwoices were paid. The meeting also heard that DAPTC has processed the application for money to assist in CKPC's furking of its magrificent website which allows the big wide world and beyond to be aware of our existence and what we do.

Members decided that that the certificate for a prize worl by Church Knowle in the Dorset Best Kept Villages competition should be displayed in the Reading Raoms, that for East Creech already having been put up in East Creech.

Later, part of the meeting had to be held "in camera' as there were to be discussions which could affect a possible case irmolving a local business which has to be kept secret at present (A bit like Ms May's Brexit' discussions!). Unfortunately, we can't report the outcome yet but it could result in a kat of emvironmental benefit to the Parish ard some of its neignovouning ones. Watth this space.

DCC has brought out a "Consultative Document' entitited Working together Highways'. This was given initial discussion ard it was decided to look into this further.

The acting-Chainman outined the issue of long meetings which haxd previoushy been agreed as planning and finance only. It was agreed apologies,
declarations of interest, previous minutes, planning and france would suffice for such "mini meetings" and other items carried over to the following month.

During the end of meeting discussion period, Cllr Bames of PDC gave a report about the proposals to bild a large quantity of houses in Purbeck. Apparently, surpise, surprise, $98 \%$ of those questioned were not happy with proposals for building the houses in such mumbers. There had been requests to review and reduce the numbers. Also during the discussion period there was concern about light polhtion emanating from a bam at East Creech. Members decided to discuss this at the next meeting and take action as necessary.

Following all that, the acting-Chairman closed the meeting and that was that until we all meet again at the Church Knowle Reading Roam on 13 ${ }^{\text {h }}$ December. Mince pies all round, eh?

-I had no idea I haxd such a delightfid spot in my kingdorn" wote the Prince Regent in 1818 of Brownsea Istand. Athrught which was perfectly illustrated by John Eastwood in his vibrant talk. He explained that all the istand's 'natural' features are manmade. Henry VIII built a gun battery which still exists in the basement of the castie. In the second half of the 19 century Colonel William Waugh built a china ctay factory, village for workers, church, tarms, castle and raiwry. He drained land to create pasture. Although Colonel Whaugh's business failed and his tactory crumbled, much of his legacy remains today.
In 1901 Charles van Raalte amived, a weality man for whorn Brownsea was an idylic alternative to his London life. A pace where his family could enjoy a privikeged life of pheasant shooting and golf, feasting on the produce from lavish kitchen gardens and orchards. After Mr van Raaite's death his wife developed a very successful daffod farm.
In 1927 Mrs Mary Bonham-Christie becarne Brownsed's last pivate owner, briging a very different vision for the island. She wished for a private retreat for therseir and the wikd crealmes, and thuss stme evided all the villagers. Brownsea enjoyed yeas of benign negket, becoming overgrown with nettles and brambles. When Ms Bonham-Cnristie died, aged 96 in 1962 her heir gave Brownsea to the Treasury in beu of death dulies and it, in tum, transfened the istand to the National Trust Huge furnds were needed for restoration and marragement: Dorset Wildlife Trust and John Lewis stepped into the breach. ## From the Reverend Ian Jackson

As this magaine is being prepared we move on from Remembrance time to Christmas celebrations beginning in eamest.
Chnistmas too is about remembering. It is about the handing on (the meaning of the word "tradition") of a great variety of traditions in families and larger communities, nations themselves. Some of these will seem relatively minor for example, when are presents opened on Christmas Day (it depends on your age and outlook if this is minor); what is on the menu at particular times during the festivities - there can be considerable variation here, not every Christmas dinner has turkey on the menu. Such matters can even be a cause of debate and discussion, if not more serious conflict.

For Christian people and communities Christmas is about handing on our beliefs about God and his presence in the world; there can be considerable debate and tension here too. We do this best by telling again the story of the nativity, the birth of Jesus. There are differences here too-do you include the visit of the wise men? Where actullly did the birth of Jesus take place? Look at the New Testament itself. Only Mathew and Luke of the four pospel witers tell us about Jesus' birth and their accounts vary. And then there's the question of how will be Mary and who will be Joseph this year.

So the celebration of Christmas, not surprisingly, is a reflection of life itself tensions, debates, etc.-. At best it is a time when through all this - if you like, the raw material of human life - we remind ouselves that God is with us in all of this (the meaning of the word 'Emmanuel') and works to draw all people to himself and each other to enjoy the gift of life and creation.

Whatever your particular traditions at Chistmas time may it be a time of blessing.
