Editorial

The weather this year, by the end of August, has been really quite average. We had a good week and then some very unseasonable storms reminiscent of the storms, which hit the Fastnet race in 1976. We have also had to cope with the problems caused by the breakdown of the Sandbanks ferry. Traffic through the village has been unusually heavy and tailbacks have been frequent. It's unlikely the ferry will be back in service until late October, but at least the tailbacks should shorten after the bank holiday. Dorset council are using the temporary traffic lights as a trial to see if there would be any benefit in installing them permanently. All of this will be input as part of the council study into traffic and parking throughout the village.

The new Dorset council has declared a climate emergency and the Parish Council has declared its support. They will be taking this further by holding a public meeting on October 4th to discuss the issues. See page 8 for details. Whether the spell of bad weather we experienced in mid-August is totally due to climate change is of course open to question; however most experts agree it almost certainly is. Moreover what is certain is that long-term change is definitely happening.

AUGUST AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

A lengthy discussion was had on the advisory diversion and traffic lights that are currently in place on the A351. Cllr Brooks reported that the diversion and the traffic lights had been implemented as a result of a meeting between the Parish Councils, Swanage Town Council, the Police, the Coast Guard, the bus company and local businesses. As a result of this meeting, the traffic lights had been suggested as a safety measure by the coastguard and the diversion was promptly implemented by Highways to ease the volume of traffic caused by the ferry closing just prior to one of the busiest weekends in the year. It was emphasised that the ferry is the responsibility of the Secretary of State and not of Dorset Council. Cllr Brooks reported that following some long delays **the lights were recently replaced with intelligent lights which allow two-way traffic and are linked to sat navs which provide data.** The Council raised that the lights cause difficulty to those coming out of the Church Knowle road and have since the meeting received assurance from highways that this flow of traffic is also being monitored. Highways have advised that whilst the traffic is heavier due to the ferry being out of service, the problem of heavy traffic at peak times is not new and they hope the lights will give them data with which they can improve the situation going forward. **The Council concluded that they would request highways stop the diversion from Corfe to Swanage via the B3351 and keep in place the diversion from Studland to Corfe via Swanage.** The Council asked can the need for the lights be reviewed at the end of the school holidays, rather than when the ferry comes back into service which could be as late as October.

The Council were invited to comment on a number of proposed road closures, scheduled to enable Perenco to carry out seismic testing. They raised concerns about access for residents and tourists and about the noise the testing may create. The Council reflected that testing had not caused problems in the past and resolved they would not submit any objection to the proposed closures. Houses in the immediate vicinity will receive notification prior to Perenco commencing work.

Cllr Fooks asked why is the Seismic testing proceeding after a Climate Emergency has been declared by Dorset Council? Cllr Brooks advised that the work of Perenco is licenced by the Secretary of State and the current work is fulfilling licences currently in place. Dorset Council are looking at their own internal policies following their declaration of a climate emergency.

Following discussions at the July meeting the Council have been made aware of further incidents of footpath and bridleway users feeling threatened by cattle. The problem is not just on West Hill where there have recently been two serious incidents but on East and West Common. **A letter from a parishioner highlighted that West Hill was not an isolated incident to be solved and that the problem is much wider.**

The National Trust were present and reported that they had met with the tenant farmer on West Hill to carry out a risk assessment, resulting in a plan to move a feeding trough and cut back foliage to reduce 'pinch points' on the footpath. Some members of the Council were concerned that the matter is not being taken seriously and that a serious incident may occur. The National Trust representatives said they were unaware of the number of the incidents and advised that they need first hand reports from individuals. **The Council would therefore request that if you have experienced or witnessed any problems with cattle on National Trust Land please report it to the National Trust or to the Clerk. This will enable them to assess the extent of the problem.**

The Council still have concerns that **the youth shelter is being misused.** The shelter was built specifically as a place for young people to meet and to enjoy. The Council agreed that if the situation does not improve, they will have to consider removing the shelter, which would be a shame for others. **If your children use the shelter, or if you are young person using the shelter, please do so with respect and leave it clean for others.**

The Council approved the recently formed Environment working group's Terms of Reference. The role of the group is to look at ways in which the Council can reduce their impact on the environment. **At 7.30pm on October 4th the Council will be holding a meeting in the village hall for residents and business owners to learn more about the Council's environmental agenda. It will be an informal evening with guest speakers who'll advise on what small steps you can take that will make a big difference to the environment. Please do come along.**

On numerous occasions the **dog bins and the rubbish bin at the entrance to Ollie Vye's Lane has been left overflowing.** The Council approved a suggestion from Cllr Dragon to relocate the Council's current bins to increase the capacity in the centre of the village. The damaged dog bin in the playground and the dilapidated dog bin in Ollie Vye's Lane will be removed.

CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

Councillor Haywood reported that three of the Gods Acre Trustees have now resigned and that there is an **urgent need to find trustees who are able to take over the management and admin.** See the advertisement on page 9.

The Council confirmed its support for double yellow lines on the road outside God's Acre which have been proposed by Dorset Council

On **planning matters**, the planning committee deferred a decision on a retrospective application at the Dorset Waterpark, Arfleet Mill Lakes for more consultation with highways, the AONB, and neighbours. They had no objection to the installation of a limestone louvre and extractor fan on the rear elevation at 50 West Street, Corfe Castle and to Erect a single storey extension at The Carhouse, Tabbits Hill Lane, Corfe Castle. An objection was made to an alcohol licence at 16 West St, Kingston.

They will also be expected to present the annual accounts to the Parish Council and hold 4 meetings of the trustees a year one of which is a site inspection.

An honorary stipend is provided by the Parish Council (details from the Parish Clerk).

The board of trustees was set up in 1924 and the Parish Council was appointed the burial authority in 1972. There are approximately 7 burials and 6 internments of ashes each year. The Trustees used to consist of the Rector, 2 Parish Councillors, 2 members of the Parochial Church Council and 2 Non-Conformists.

Back to “good old” Church Knowle Reading Room for August’s meeting. Only one Member was unable to attend and his apologies were accepted. There were no other Parishioners present but our Dorset Council representative, Cllr Cherry Brooks, came along to give Dorset’s view on matters and update the Parish Council on the “goings-on” in what was County Hall and other places in which the new Dorset Council is ensconced.

Matters which were postponed from July’s meeting – including authorisation of June’s minutes – were discussed and voted on. During the Public Discussion period the condition of the playing field goal posts and nets was brought up and discussed at length. It was thought that the matter of repair etc., before the winter season takes hold was pretty urgent and Councillors decided that paint should be bought and new nets procured and fitted. Who knows, “Church Knowle Kick & Rush Athletic” might someday get into to the Premier League; which Premier League is anyone’s guess, but after the work has been done by CKPC’s merrie band of volunteers the playing field will be “premier”!

Next up in Public Discussion came the closure of the Studland-Sandbanks ferry and the associated traffic problems to Church Knowlers caused by Dorset Council’s erection of traffic lights at the A351 junction to Studland. One of the Councillors mentioned that turning right onto the road from the Church Knowle road was “a nightmare” and at times one would have to wait the best part of 20 minutes before a kind driver would let a Church Knowler onto the main road. This concern was reiterated by other Members and Cllr Brooks was asked why a filter traffic light array for Church Knowle traffic had not been put up. Further discussion ensued and eventually Cllr Brooks offered to take the matter back to the Dorset Highways engineer who planned the lights for discussion and action as needed. Apparently, one of the ideas mooted at Highways was for a mini-roundabout to be built while the ferry was out of action but satellite-controlled lights were the “preferred choice”.

The Parish Council then went on to elect a new Vice-chairman for the month following the resignation of Cllr Wilson from the post. The new Vice-chairman took the Chair and the main meeting went ahead. The June minutes were duly read and formally approved. Nothing arose. On to the July minutes and those, too, were formally approved.

Some items on the Agenda were postponed for discussion until September; these included some legal matters relating to the parish cemetery. And off went the meeting at high speed since there were no new planning applications

and the results of past planning applications were noted. The Grange Road planning saga continued with the Dorset Councillor explaining that the planning officer would act if written reports were made to him by complainants. Councillors explained that reports from the Parish Council had been made in the past and that planning officers had visited the site concerned and that to hold onto complaints before collating them into a report could be counter-productive. It would be second hand information. Members were told that the signage would be investigated by “Highways” and their comments sent to the Parish Council.

Parenco intends making loud noises and bumps from September onwards in an attempt to find more oil. They will have to close roads throughout the Parish and adjoining ones and Dorset Council has provided a l-o-n-g list of the closures and when they will occur. DC Cllr Brooks explained how the closures will be done and did not expect closures to last more than two hours at a time. She also said that the noise would not be any louder than that of tank firing at Lulworth and was also at pains to tell the meeting that the work was not associated with fracking. Members, whilst concerned about the individual advanced notice of closure periods, were relieved that fracking was not on the cards and that closures would only be for a couple of hours at a time.

Studland Ferry’s closure was again discussed and Members were advised that the local MP and one of Poole’s MPs had been in discussion with the Secretary of State whose responsibility it was for licensing the ferry company’s operations. A couple of Members thought it seemed rather of a coincidence that the ferry had been closed for varying reasons following the company’s failure to get a ferry fare increase.

The Meeting heard that some of the new fingers were missing from the fingerposts. Discussion then ensued about the structure of the brackets etc., and the Clerk advised he had been in discussion with the maker about having them fixed. The Clerk also advised he had received an e-mail from a Parishioner regarding the spelling of Cotnes(s) on the finger at East Creech. This led to discussion about what was the correct spelling with historical evidence pointing to Cotnes and the OS definitive map referring to Cotness. It was decided that the word on any new/repared sign should read “Cotness” On the subject of road signage, there was further discussion about the proposed advisory sign at Barnston Cross which would discourage coaches and caravans from using the Bradle road. The Clerk advised Members on the legality of various wording and the Dorset councillor reiterated his advice. She volunteered to visit the site with the senior highways engineer to see what could be done and added that it could take upto five years to impose a traffic prohibition for particular vehicles.

The Parish Council then went on to hear a report on the environmental project and coppicing at East Creech. Several members of Dorset Wildlife Trust had been “moved sideways” from the project and a new manager was in charge. The Clerk advised he had been in further contact with DWT and had been told that a senior manager could probably attend the September Parish Council meeting. Two articles regarding DWT published in the Purbeck Gazette were read out by one of the Councillors and all Members were in agreement with what the writer had written.

Next came Finance. The July-August accounts were approved as were invoices. Bills were paid. Then the Clerk presented the Annual Accounts which were approved. They had been examined by a Chartered Accountant (FCA) and the Annual Governance Statement signed. The Annual Return and Certificate of Exemption were approved and the Clerk advised that they would be sent to the government-appointed external auditors for verification. They would then be posted on the Council’s website for public inspection.

Councillors then went on to discuss what to do with the archives. Our dear reader will recall that there were ideas of getting hold of a used container as found on container ships and sometimes floating about in the Atlantic Ocean when washed overboard. With the likelihood of an old shipping container washing up on Studland beach and finding its way to Church Knowle village hall’s car-park being somewhat miniscule, it was decided that further price and quality research be done and the matter was adjourned till September. The Clerk advised that they could cost between £1,300 and £2,500 depending on how they could be altered; delivery was extra.

Apart from a few minor bits and pieces that was that for the August Meeting. Next meeting will be on 10th September.

The technique derived from cross country skiing, is easy to learn, affordable and suitable for all ages and abilities.

The lively local group, Dorset Nordic Walking offers over 35 walks for all levels every week and all are led by qualified rehabilitation and fitness experts. They work with local venues such as RSPB Arne, Durlston Country Park and Holton Lee to provide inspirational but safe exercise for everyone. This ‘Movement is Medicine’ approach now includes accessible walks and dementia walks as well as the usual longer Purbeck walks for those who like to push themselves. From September they will be including walks for folk without poles too, so check out their iconic Dorset series which include the Cerne Abbas Giant, The Portland Circuit and other stunning walks which are open to all. In last month's article we wrote about our involvement in Dynamic Dunescapes, a nationwide initiative to improve dune landscapes like that at Studland Bay for nature and people.

Since then the project has attracted the interest of the local press with an article appearing in the Daily Echo on 4 August.

While most of the article is accurate it is important to remember that Dynamic Dunescapes is a nationwide partnership of conservationists and landowners and that each site is unique.

For instance, there are no plans to encourage rabbit grazing at Studland, as mentioned in the article, or to create depressions that can be flooded.

While these approaches may be appropriate elsewhere in the country, at Studland we have specific goals, which we will tackle in a way that is suitable for the site.

Grazing is part of the plan, but it will be carried out by our existing herd of

Red Devon cattle and will be limited to the less visited parts of the dune system.

The overall aim is to restore the sort of habitat recorded by pioneering ecologist Cyril Diver in his groundbreaking studies of Studland in the 1930s.

The result will be a more open, less overgrown landscape which will help the specialist wildlife that make the dunes their home as well as creating improved family-friendly access.

Studland is one of nine Dynamic Dunescapes sites nationwide. The project is funded by the European Union through the LIFE Nature programme and by the National Lottery Heritage Fund.

Corfe Castle will be hosting two atmospheric open-air carol evenings this December, on Sunday 8 and Friday 13 December, from 5-7pm.

We would like to offer the opportunity to local choirs, schools and musical groups to perform at these evenings, joined by the local community and open to the public.

The castle lights will be lit throughout the event and the tea-room and shop will be open serving festive winter warmers.





The Reverend Ian Jackson writes:

Both the Three Parishes Fete at Church Knowle and the Corfe Castle Fete, held in the church grounds, a few days later were especially good events this year. They are occasions when those involved enjoy meeting both local people, and those visiting the area.

It is well known that some people arrange their holidays so they are here when it is the fete at Church Knowle. I spoke to several people this year who told me about attending the fete when they were much younger, in the years following the 2nd World War. I don't think we know for certain which year the fete began – one of the people I spoke to had been present in the late 1940s. Can anyone tell us anymore about this?

I don't know that the Corfe fete goes back so many years, although it may well do. Again, perhaps someone may have more information. However, it too has become a feature of people's holidays. Someone bought a ticket for the Whiskey draw and said he had done so for the past 6 years, but had never won. Those around were delighted when, shortly, afterwards, this man's ticket was drawn; photos were promptly taken.

So, the summer fetes are worthwhile and happy occasions. I wanted to emphasise this, and to highlight that none of this is possible without so many people helping with the planning, the preparations, and the events themselves. It is tiring work and at the end of the day the helpers are always looking forward to a relaxing evening. So yet again, thank you to all who helped and supported in such a variety of ways.

I now need to ask for some help with the preparations for Christmas! In recent years we have delivered a card to each house in Corfe Castle with details of the Christmas services in St. Edward's Church. The card has featured a variety of photos including the Christingles, the church and the square lit up at Christmas and the crib in church. We are looking for a suitable design for this year's card. (It doesn't have to be a photo.) Ideally, we would like something which symbolises the message of Christmas. It doesn't have to be specifically religious. We are celebrating the birth of Jesus. And, after all, we believe his life was God's way of telling us of his love for all of his creation, and not by any means just the religious part.

I once quoted here Martin Buber's (Austrian Philosopher 1878 – 1965) words saying that all real living is meeting. He didn't mean 'business meetings' (they

have their role); he was talking about meetings between people. All that makes possible such encounters between people which are good and uplifting is to be encouraged. Our seasonal activities – be it in Summer or Winter – contribute with so many other activities to this building up of relationships and communities. For people of faith we see this as sharing in God's work. We can be very thankful for the good things that have happened around here this summer.

Today the Swanage railway carries over 200,000 passengers a year and Corfe Castle is a key location for tourists travelling on the railway.

A grade 2 listed building used so regularly needs plenty of TLC. Just as in your own home the station needs time spent on cleaning and general maintenance including work tending to the gardens. 8. Report any issues back to the Chair of the Common Committee

To be the key contact for Graziers of animals on the Common. The role of the representative is to report back to the Committee Meetings or direct to the Hayward or Chair of the Common Committee.



Ammonites to Octopods

During August we had some strong winds and big waves in Kimmeridge Bay. Following the rough weather, we set out to explore the strandline to see what natural treasures had washed up. One of our most exciting finds was a 'bunch' of cuttlefish eggs! They wouldn't have survived if we left them on the shore, so they were taken back to the Wild Seas Centre to see if they would hatch. Cuttlefish come inshore in the summer months to lay their grape like eggs where their young will hatch out a couple of months later. Once hatched Cuttlefish can then almost immediately hunt prey, bury themselves in sand and even change the colour of their skin to a range of fascinating patterns and colours as a form of camouflage or as a signal to other cuttlefish of their mood.

Cuttlefish belong to the group of animals known as cephalopods. Other animals in this group are octopus, squid and even the extinct ammonite which is found in abundance fossilised along our Jurassic coastline. Dorset Wildlife Trust, in collaboration with The Etches Collection Museum of Jurassic Marine Life, are holding a talk by Dr Gavan Cooke, called Ammonites to Octopods this September. This talk will describe the evolution of cephalopods, including the extremely successful but now extinct ammonites through to modern day, tool-using octopus. You can also discover about the complex behaviour of the invertebrate with the biggest brain to body ratio and how you can help scientists with their research, via the power of citizen science.

If you're interested in learning more about these intelligent marine molluscs, then join us for this fascinating talk at the Etches Collection on Sunday 8th

September at 2.30pm. There is a suggested £5 donation payable on the door. Booking is essential, so please contact the Wild Seas Centre on 01929 481044 or email kimmeridge@dorsetwildlifetrust.org.uk to reserve your place. Refreshments will be available before and after the talk at Clavell's Restaurant just across the road in Kimmeridge – booking advised.

Ammonites to Octopods is aimed at the non-science community and will be suitable for those with little or no knowledge of cephalopods who wish to learn more and should appeal to fossil enthusiasts as well as divers, beachcombers and others interested in the marine environment, past and present.
