CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

JUNE AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

Several residents came to speak at this Meeting including Mr Roy Christopher and Mrs Tessa Somerville. There was considerable concern about the approval at Planning Board by Purbeck District Council in respect of planning application 6/2010/0604 for Wimborne Mead, Jubilee Gardens. This was a case proposing the construction of two new houses in the plot of a single existing bungalow. This type of application should have been determined by the Planning Board as it relates to the erection of two or more properties in a settlement with a population below 3000 individuals. However, the developer received pre-application advice (and tacit approval) before the application was then delegated to the same planning officer who gave formal approval despite the objection of the Parish Council and several adjacent residents. The Parish Council objected in October last year : *The Council suggests this proposal is over development of the site. The access is poor for any increase in density and the proposal will block light to neighbouring properties.* The Council queried this decision with the District Council and a senior planning officer admitted the delegated decision was in error. This means the delegated planning approval had no standing in law and in order to determine the application it was referred to the May 26th Planning Board. Despite several residents and Councillor Dragon speaking against the proposal the development was again approved. It was suggested to the Council that this was done to prevent claims for compensation from the developer against the District Council despite any personal misgivings the Planning Board District Councillors may have had. The residents are considering making an appeal to the Ombudsman as they are unable to appeal the decision to the Planning Inspectorate.

Regarding the repairs required for the Church Knowle bridge, neither Corfe Castle Parish Council (the bridge is in the Parish) or the National Trust (who own the bridge) have received any formal communications from the County Council engineers at the time of the Meeting. The only people who appear to be receiving communications are Church Knowle Parish Council. This was queried with the engineers department (and mentioned to Mr Andrew Eustace of the National Trust at the Meeting) who said they would be writing to this Council shortly. However, they did confirm the bridge will be receiving repairs between the Easter and Early May Bank holidays next year (presumably 10th April to the 4th May). No details were given of any proposals to alleviate the situation.

CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

There has been no progress on the many issues based on the proposed new lighting scheme for East Street. Nothing was ever heard from County Councillor Peter Finney who promised some action back in April. Southern Electric (SEC) have still not organised a redesign of the scheme for the village but have said it will be done soon. The Council has again been assured work will not re-commence whilst this is done. The National Trust have been very helpful in coming up with some funding towards heritage type lights if this can be used in East Street to improve the SEC proposals.

The Parish Council has been made aware of new developments on the proposal to upgrade bridleway 70 (this is the right of way on the top of West Hill) to a Byway Open to All Traffic (BOAT). Councillor Marshallsay informed the Council of activity at Dorset County Council involving the Roads and Rights of Way Committee where it appears a submission will come before that Committee for approval in the near future. It would appear this is preliminary work prior to setting up a public enquiry in conjunction with the Planning Inspectorate where the County Council are likely to take a neutral position on the matter.

Members decided to proceed with the planned replacement of the aging multi-play equipment in the playground with new fitness equipment suitable for anyone over seven years of age. An application to Viridor for part funding has been successful. Equipment will be ordered from a firm called Caloo when the funding is in place. The Council is hoping to save the slide (part of the multi-play equipment) and re-erect it in a new position in the playground at a later date.

The Meeting was addressed by Tracy Long of the County Library Service. The address was co-incidental with the publication, the same day, of a 108 page report by officers in that service that will be going before the Community Overview Committee that meets on Monday June 20th, where members will consider four options put forward.

All the proposals are required to save around £800,000 from the County Council budget. The original proposal, Option A, withdraws funding from 20 of the Council's 34 libraries (closing Corfe Castle library). A new option, Option B, will provide Council funding for 24 libraries and make the additional savings required through a reduction in book funds and staff. This would also close Corfe Castle library and is the preferred choice of the officers.

However, the final two options both retain all 34 libraries by finding the savings through other means. Option C (the AdLib proposal) proposes the reduction of opening hours across all libraries by 10 per cent, as well as cutting book funds and staff. Option D proposes similar cuts to book funds and staff as well as a review of the way books are bought.

CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

The Community Overview committee will make a recommendation that goes before Dorset County Council's Cabinet on July 6th and then the full Council on July 21st 2011.

The Council considers all planning applications and submits comments to the District Council. The Parish Council had no objection to proposals for the installation of secondary glazing and re-roofing to the front elevation of 15 West Street, Corfe Castle. A change of use from dwelling to a mixed use as a dwelling and osteopathy, chiropody, acupuncture and beauty consultancy (retrospective) at Vergers Mead, 105 East Street, Corfe Castle. *Councillors suggest the application be subject to a condition that the commercial use should be restricted to two rooms only.*

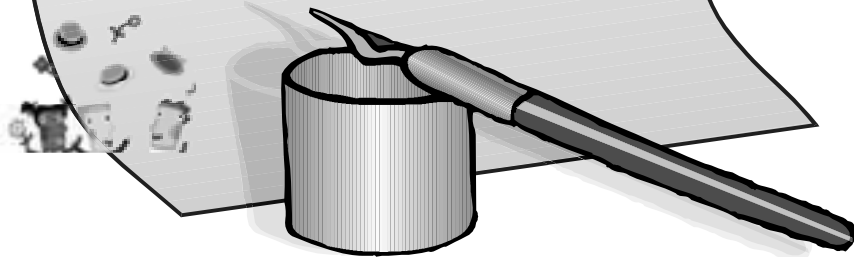

National Trust Summer Programme

Summer's here, the sun is shining (some of the time!) and we at the Purbeck National Trust are determined to make the most of it by getting out and about and meeting as many of you as possible.

A team made up of staff, volunteers and their families will be all dressed up and manning a float in this year's annual Swanage Carnival Procession on July 31. Following the carnival theme of Jurassic Rock, the colourful float will be decorated with images of our relationship with the local geology and the plants and animals which inhabit it. The aim is to highlight some of these wonderful features, landscapes and creatures which all the Purbeck staff and volunteers work hard to conserve "forever for everyone".

The pattern of thick bands of soft clays, massive bands of chalk and thin bands of hard limestone have defined the character of the coast and the habitats which stretch inland. Here on Purbeck we are spoilt by a variety of geology and the industrial history that goes along with it, from clay extraction for making bricks to quarried stone which goes into many local buildings - including the impressive Corfe Castle. The varying geology also supports different soil types and the plant and animal communities which depend upon it.

The interaction of man in our working landscape has also shaped our environment and provided new habitats for wildlife, such as shelter and basking sites for reptiles on dry stone walls. Open-cast quarrying on the heath has meanwhile provided ponds for dragonflies, and bats have taken over disused underground limestone quarries as roosting sites. Come along and see us on the day!

We will also be involved in Studland Country Fair on August 27-28 with a display of chainsaw carving, giant snakes & ladders and jigsaw games and a sandpit. We're hoping to bring some of our livestock along too, subject to health and safety conditions being met – watch this space for more information and possibly some additional attractions.

Meanwhile, The National Trust in Purbeck is hosting a full programme of events for the whole community throughout July and August – here is just a selection. You can find out just why Studland is such an important site for wildlife by joining our BioBlitz weekend on July 2-3. Meet naturalists and scientists and help carry out a whole range of surveys to identify as many animals and plants as possible within a 24-hour period. Events are suitable for all ages and levels of experience. Meet at the Discovery Centre, Knoll Beach – booking is not necessary.

A children's archaeology trail operates at Corfe Castle every day from Saturday July 16 to Sunday July 31 and Archaeology Days take place from July 28-31.

World Oceans Day

To celebrate World Oceans Day the Dorset Wildlife Trust joined forces with the National Trust at Studland Bay. Together we put on a day of events to mark this special occasion including: a shark, skate and ray eggcase hunt, a tasty barbecue, fun quizzes and arts and crafts. Lucky visitors also got the chance to watch underwater footage of seahorses which were actually filmed right there in the bay!

World Oceans Day was created at the "Earth Summit" in 1992 when a hundred and fifty World Leaders all agreed that action must be taken to halt the worldwide loss of animals and plant species. Studland was therefore a fitting place to hold this event. Seagrass meadows are recognised around the world as important areas for marine wildlife but unfortunately, they have undergone serious decline, suffering through disease, pollution and human activities.

Seagrass meadows support a rich diversity of life as they provide both food and shelter for many marine species. They also provide important nursery grounds for various types of fish and shellfish including cuttlefish, undulate rays and our much loved seahorses. Two species of seahorse are found in the UK, the spiny and the short-snouted seahorse. Both are known to breed at Studland making it the top place for seahorses in the country. Studland is also an important nursery area for undulate rays - an endangered species! Baby rays have been spotted in the bay and their eggcases consistently wash up along the beach.

Events like ours were occurring all over the UK and around the world giving people the chance to learn more about the marine environment. Around 100 people braved the wind and rain to join in the celebrations on the beach at Studland Bay. Many of them signed our Petition Fish to support the creation of Marine Protected Areas. Understanding, as the world leaders did, how important it is to protect our precious underwater world.

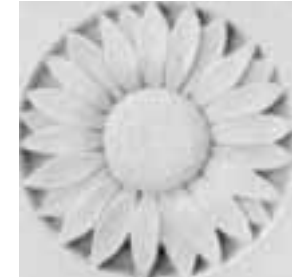

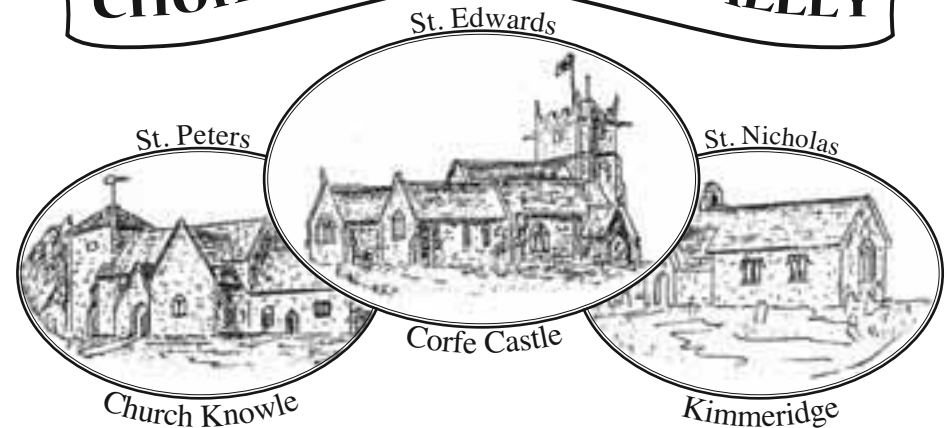

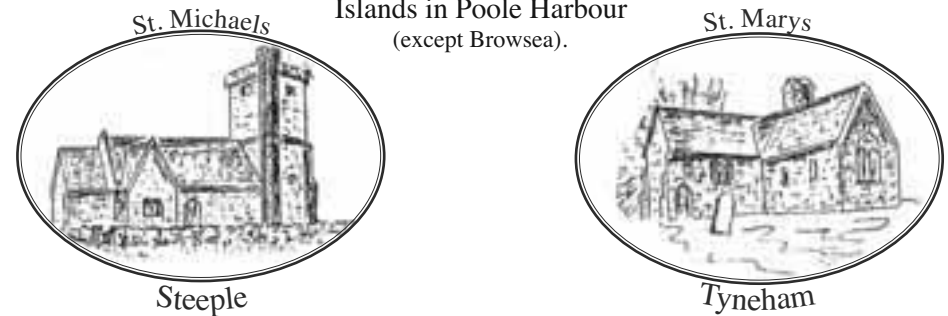

As I write this, drought has been officially declared in the east of England and most other areas has parched land due to the lack of rainfall over the spring which is unprecedented in recent times. The national news tells us that due to the effects of the lack of water many of the crops have suffered which will lead to animal foodstuff shortages leading to the farmers having to buy in fodder for their livestock. Also, the prices for such fodder and indeed food for us humans is set to rise which will add to yet another rise in the cost of living. Even down here in Dorset gardens look parched and the grass is withered and yellow. This is what happens when we are deprived of one of the basic necessities of life. We could say that, in many respects, we are privileged to live in a country that doesn't encounter total extremes of weather which may lead to mass famine, extreme drought or other natural disasters. However, lack of rain in any country does indeed bring hardships and we shouldn't minimise the effects on our own people.

Throughout history there have been other droughts not always associated with water. As we look at history we see Britain and the rest of Europe suffering such droughts. The drought I am talking of here is the drought of scripture, the word of God, which has been lacking during many periods of history. During these periods we see misunderstandings, persecution and wars many of which have been perpetrated by people who say they were following scriptural principals but the reality is there has been a scriptural drought in these people's lives.

I, like many other people, believe that this country is going through a scriptural drought at this present time. Many people cast off the bible as irrelevant and archaic, primarily because they don't understand what the bible says but the problem is they 'think' they know what it says – this is due to a drought in their own lives. This country's 'new' and modern atheism is active, hostile and based on individuals own thoughts, in fact this 'new' drought we are going through contradicts many of society's norm's which have kept us safe over the years. Following the bible correctly will guide our lives down a more stable path; marriages will be saved, psychological problems averted, the poor and needy helped and wars averted. Instead of 'thinking' you know what the bible says why don't you find out the truth and end the drought in your own life and find peace. We're here to be asked.

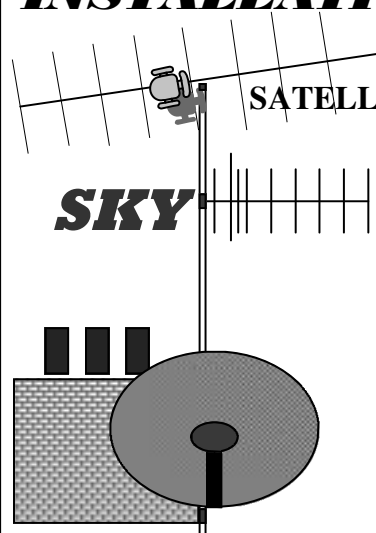

Scheming - Crafty - Aggressive - Malicious

Have you been a victim of a SCAM letter or email? A scam letter is when an offender/s contact you trying to con you out of cash. Some examples of these scams include

Fake lotteries - Prize draws - False investments - Work from home schemes

The type of people that run these scams are clever and sophisticated. They will contact you via telephone, letter, and email or sometimes in person. They will sound pleasant, well spoken and want you to think they are your friend. They will have professional looking leaflets and letters, be persistent and persuasive and try to rush you into making a decision and normally ask you to send money before you receive their tempting offer or win.

Protect yourself by being sceptical. Is it likely that someone you don't know, who has contacted you out of the blue will give you something for nothing?

They will ask you to send bank details, give money up front, ring a premium rate number 090, or buy something to get your prize.

They will lie to you and give you what seem to be good reasons why you should do what they say. They will answer all your objections.

DON'T send any money - DON'T give personal details

Ask for their details and make enquiries on the Internet and with families and friends prior to making any decisions.

Kingston News of Concerts

Of Dorset's many claims to fame, its rural music school based in Blandford is one of its least trumpeted. That seems unjust. Dorset Rural Music School, as it likes to say, has been 'keeping Dorset in tune since 1947'.

On Saturday, July 2, the school's director Richard Hall is bringing some of its best students to St James Church for a concert that will demonstrate the diversity of their talent in a mixed programme of music dating from 1700 to the present day. Including a guitarist and a flautist, they range in age from a brilliant 13-year-old pianist to a remarkable tenor of 80-plus.

The school, which has been teaching music in all forms to people of all ages in the county and beyond for the past 63 years, currently has 150 students on its books taught by two full-time and 23 part-time staff.

Being unsubsidised and entirely self-supporting, it depends on the fees it charges its students, and so has to tread the difficult line between self-preservation and keeping fees low enough not to be prohibitive.

Not surprisingly, the school struggles to make ends meet. Hence the appeal now underway to modernise its home, an old converted stable in Blandford which is desperately in need of upgrading. Our two remaining concerts:

Saturday, July 2, at 7.30 p.m. DORSET RURAL MUSIC SCHOOL - Senior students and staff perform a rich mix of instrumental and vocal music from 1700 to the present day.

Saturday, July 30, at 7.30 p.m. SONGS FOR A SUMMER EVENING - Close harmony group VOCAL POINT bring their own inimitable style to some much-loved favourites plus a few surprises. Robin Stringer

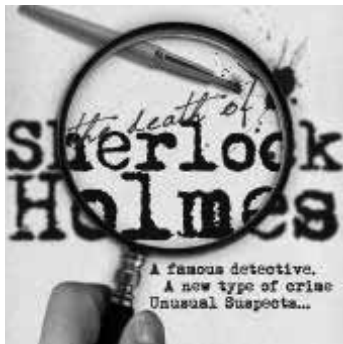

Working together to keep Dorset residents safe

Crime in Dorset continues to fall, with fewer crimes and in turn fewer victims of crime across the Dorset county area (excluding Bournemouth and Poole) during 2010 and early 2011.

Yearly statistics at the end of March 2011 (1 April 2010 – 31 March 2011) show that total crime is down. During this time there were 1,457 fewer offences recorded by Dorset Police compared to the same period in 2009-10 – a reduction of 7.1 per cent across the county area.

There were significant reductions in anti-social behaviour, violent crime and those killed and seriously injured in road traffic accidents on Dorset roads.

- There were 2,286 fewer incidents of anti-social behaviour (-10.4%)
- There were 400 fewer violent crimes in the Dorset county area (-9.4%)
- There were eight fewer fatalities and 52 fewer people seriously injured on Dorset's roads (these results are for roads in the Dorset County Council area and not pan-Dorset)

The Dorset Community Safety Partnership (CSP), which consists of Dorset local authorities, Dorset Police, Dorset Probation Trust, Dorset Primary Care Trust, Dorset Fire & Rescue Service and Dorset Police Authority, continues to work with communities on those issues that matter locally.

Councillor Ray Nottage, Chair of Dorset CSP, said: "By making the community aware that crime rates are falling we hope that they feel safer and more confident that local agencies like the police and local authorities are working together to keep crime low."

"We know that Dorset remains one of the safest places to live in England and we know that crime is continuing to fall in Dorset."

Superintendent Dave Thorp of Dorset Police, said: "These figures show how effective partnerships can be in helping to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour. It is extremely pleasing to see that the latest crime figures show that we are maintaining a downward trend in crime in Dorset."

"We have worked extremely closely with the councils and other partners who are absolutely essential to making our communities safer."

Purbeck School - changes ahead!

These are exciting times for education in the Isle of Purbeck. After much thought and debate our schools are going to change from a 3-tier to 2-tier system. The transition will be completed in 2013; all First Schools will become Primaries and from September the *new* Purbeck School will take students from ages 11 to 18. I say a *new* school because so much will change irrespective of the changes in the government's education policies and funding.

First we are preparing to be welcome three whole year groups (Yrs 7, 8 and 9) in September 2013. As well as basic classroom and learning needs careful attention is being given to social and play areas, expanding dining capacity, 'green' considerations and the appearance of the front of the school site. Building work starts this summer term with a major refurbishment of the Design Technology area. We're working on how best to use the facilities of the Wareham Middle School in addition to extending facilities at The Purbeck.

Aside from improvements to the buildings and accommodation, detailed staffing and curriculum structures are already being developed now, to turn our aspirations into reality. For example we will introduce a third language (Spanish) from Yr 7 and a radically different Performing and Creative Arts experience.

Meanwhile the progress and well being of our current students remains at the top of our agenda. We pride ourselves in offering wide and varied curriculum and extra-curricula opportunities for our students, and like most secondary schools we have introduced the English baccalaureate performance measure (based on achieving grade A*-C in five subjects areas, viz. English, Maths, a modern foreign language, a Science and a Humanity subject. The net result has been a significant swing in student choices and a clear majority of our students will be following the *ebacc* core route from September this year.

Exciting times indeed, and many challenges but we're determined to create an outstanding new Purbeck School. Our young people deserve the best and we're committed to giving it to them.


