

Church Knowle Parish Council - January Meeting

The January meeting of the Church Knowle Parish Council took place in the Church Knowle Village Hall on Tuesday 9th January 2024 at 6:30pm. It was attended by six members of the Council (Cllr Burt in the chair) and one member of the public

The main items of interest in the meeting were:

Vacancies on the Parish Council

There are still two vacancies on the Parish Council which has a full strength of nine and any interested parishioners can apply to clerk@churchknowle-pc.gov.uk. No applications have been received this month.

Neighbourhood Plan

The Steering Committee has met and the process is continuing with the advice of the consultant. Parishioners are invited to join the steering group and can contact the clerk (clerk@churchknowle-pc.gov.uk) or Cllr Carl Grice (carlgrice@yahoo.com) for more information. The Neighbourhood Plan has some statutory weight under the Localism Act 2011 and this is an opportunity for people in the parish to have real input into it.

<u>Planning</u>

The Council resolved to have no objection to P/HOU/2023/06579, a first floor extension at Shotts Meade.

Highways

Church Knowle Speed Limit. The area covered by the speed limit was discussed and it was agreed that it should run between the Church Knowle village settlement signs.

Corfe River Footbridge. This Council agreed to support the rebuilding of this bridge, known as the Orchard Bridge and will seek proposals and funding to achieve this. This bridge can be found at the crossing of the Corfe River on the footpath that runs from the Church Knowle Village Hall to Swyre Head. Any letters of support for rebuilding this bridge would be welcome as these will form part of the supporting evidence for grant applications.

Parish Precept

The expenses and projects for the coming year were examined and discussed.

The Parish Council runs and maintains the Playing Field opposite Margaret Green, runs and maintains the cemetery, owns and maintains the defibrillator at the New Inn, owns and maintains the two adopted phone boxes and the traditional highway fingerposts. It does whatever is possible to keep the parish in good order and support the interests of parishioners. The Parish Precept was set at £15,500.

Furzebrook Phone Box

This was decommissioned by BT and adopted by the Parish Council over a year ago and is available for new role. Suggestions for a use for this box are sought. Pease contact the clerk and these will be put to the Parish Council to be implemented.

Tenders

The recent Playing Field inspection recommended that the wooden elements be treated with preservative. Tenders are therefore being sought for treating all of the timber at the playing field with an approved preservative. The timber will have to be sanded to remove any splinters first. Apply to the Clerk at clerk@churchknowle-pc.gov.uk for details.

The January meeting finished at 8:03 pm. The next meeting of the Church Knowle Parish Council will be at the Furzebrook Village Hall at 6:30 on 13th February 2024.

National Trust



Corfe Castle shop closure for refurbishment

The National Trust shop at Corfe Castle will be closed for refurbishment from the 18th February and we look forward to being open again from early March.

Corfe Castle shortlisted for a Dorset Tourism Award By Eoin McDowell

We are delighted to be shortlisted for an Accessible and Inclusive Tourism Award by Dorset Tourism. Given the terrain in the castle, accessibility can be a challenge but the team have approached it with creativity and gusto and we have implemented the following:

- Purchased an all-terrain attendant propelled electric wheelchair which is suitable for all ages and has an electric assist, allowing users to traverse the hills and cobbled pathways in the castle more easily.
- Making written information boards more accessible through working in partnership with Remark UK, a Deaf Media Company, 7 videos were created replicating the written information into BSL and audio format.
- Creation of seven information videos which can be accessed by QR code in the Outer Bailey.
- Accessible toilets are at both the Welcome Centre and the Castle entrance with planning pending for a Changing Places toilet being installed at the Welcome Centre.
- Working with Access Dorset and social enterprise DOTS Disability; organisations led 'by disabled people for disabled people', to offer Disability Awareness Training to staff and ensure all reasonable adjustments are made to accommodate staff disabilities and neuro diverse needs.
- Walking poles available for visitors to borrow from both the welcome centre and castle entrance. They are height adjustable and lightweight, making them suitable for a variety of visitors.

- A new guide detailing a visual story from arriving at the car park through to what to expect at the top of the castle and village centre. This has been designed to help those with neurodiverse needs or with dementia, so that a visit can be more understood before they arrive and a less daunting prospect.

The awards are on the 1st February and we're up against some fierce competition but regardless of whether we win, it means a lot to be recognised and shortlisted. I'm so proud of the team effort and achievements in making everyone feel welcome at Corfe Castle.

Entry to the Castle and Teddy Bear zip wire

This is a reminder that there is free entry to the castle for Corfe residents. Just bring proof of address with you to get in free. The popular teddy zip wire is also back for February half-term; bring your own teddy or borrow a castle veteran. While in the castle join in the new Mission Conservation family quest to earn a conservation coin.







Corfe Castle Surgery

Patient Participation Group (PPG)

At the end of last year my husband and I were fortunate to visit friends in New Zealand and had a wonderful trip but I did need to visit a GP Surgery for a minor ailment.

I was very impressed with the care I received -open access, prompt and efficient, even as a visitor, but of course at a cost for both the local population and me. It made me reflect on the excellent service and care we receive from our own Corfe Surgery Team which we sometimes take for granted and don't always appreciate.

A poster in the Corfe Surgery reception area shows a diagram of the 'GP Practice Iceberg'. Please have a look at it if you are in the surgery. As patients we see the tip of the iceberg (highlighted in just one third of the diagrammatic iceberg) - face to face appointments, busy phone lines and sometimes remote GP contact *but* the work actually being carried out in support of us, as patients, by the surgery Team is phenomenal (two thirds in the iceberg diagram)

There are too many headings to mention here in total but they include; Medicine reviews and prescriptions, reviewing results, home visits, referrals to other agencies, vaccinations and immunisations, training, HR and staff management, Community engagement, managing targets and working with the PPG, remembering that 90% of NHS contacts happen in Primary care.

As we begin a New Year may I thank the Corfe Surgery Team for the high-quality care we have received, hoping that 2024 is an easier year for the team with fewer pressures and successful recruitment.

Our PPG role is to ensure that by meeting together with health professionals patients are given a 'voice' within the GP Practice, to help patients take more responsibility for their own health, contribute to the continuous improvement of services and quality of care at the Practice and foster improved communications between the Practice and its patients -please do contact us if you wish us to raise any issues on your behalf or have an suggestions to make


Soup 'n Pud A choice of Soups and a Roll Followed by Puds with Custard



Wet, wetter, and wettest.

Three years ago, I reported on 11 years of rainfall data for Corfe Castle from 2010 -2020. I had intended to produce an annual update but to quote Robert Burns "The best laid schemes o' mice an' men, gang aft agley". Anyway, better late than never.

Although May to July 2021 was decidedly wet, 2021 turned out drier than any of the years I had recorded before with a total annual rainfall of 758mm. This was due to a fairly dry March, August and September in 2021 and there being just 3mm of rain in April 2021 and 11mm in November 2021. December 2021 was also the driest December in the last 7 years. 2022 turned out even drier than 2021 with a total annual rainfall of just 700mm. This was due to the continuation of the dry spell at the end of 2021 through January and February 2022 and to rainfall in each month from April to August 2022 being well below average. By the end of 2022 our average annual rainfall had dropped from 955mm (up to 2020) to 917mm. With 2012, 2013 and 2014 having been quite wet, there was the beginnings of a drying trend emerging from the data (Figure 1). But....




Figure 2 - monthly rainfall: 2023 (solid dots), all years (open dots)

2023 blew that idea well and truly out of the water. 2023 started relatively dry - especially February - which, with just 12.5mm of rain, was by far the driest February I have recorded. In contrast, March and April 2023 gave us a pretty wet Spring (Figure 2), May 2023 was bang on average and then things went a

bit weird. In June 2023 there was just 8mm of rain (way below average) while in July 2023 there was a soaking 104mm, more than twice the average for that month. August 2023 was back to normal and then we had four months of wet, wetter, wettest & yet more wet (Figure 2).

All that added up to 1113.5 mm in 2023 – the 2nd wettest year in my records – bested (or worsted) only by 2012. Our average annual rainfall since 2010 now stands at 932mm.

January 2024 started the way 2023 ended with another 60mm of rain in the first 4 days of the not so Happy New Year. This led, for the first time in a long while, to Corfe Castle being cut off when the rivers overflowed. So much for the dodgy drying trend. Another 10 years' data needed. **Richard Caldow**



The Reverend Anne Bond writes

Once upon a time my eldest son said to me, "I simply can't believe that all the activity that goes on in people's minds dies. There's so much of it, and it's so strong and – and *powerful* – it can't just *vanish* ..." (I think it may have been shortly after he fell out of a tall tree wearing a chainsaw, not wearing a helmet, and survived.) He was asking how the force of all that creativity, that energy, those original forward-thinking ideas that buzzed around in his head, could simply ... not *be* any more.

Well, in a way, the 'force' does go on, but not necessarily in the same minds where it originated. However, I don't think that's quite what he meant. He was asking how death could obliterate such a positive and powerful thing as consciousness, to which the obvious answer is that consciousness happens in the brain, and if the brain dies everything else dies with it.

In academic theological circles there is a phrase 'The Great Christian Hope' which is a lot less stuffy than it sounds. Briefly, it expresses the belief that the essence of one's consciousness does go on after death, in a way we can't during our living human present understand, to a new, different sort of life in another dimension.

Am I talking Sci-Fi here?

Um. I don't know ... I don't think so.

Anthropology (which my Chambers Dictionary defines as 'the multidisciplinary study and analysis of the origins and characteristics of human beings and their societies, customs, and beliefs') tells us there is evidence that ever since humans have existed there has been belief in a power beyond humanity known generally as 'god'. Ancient belief systems understood 'god' in various forms and made representative images to be worshipped – all except ancient Judaism, which insisted there is only *one* 'god' in the whole wide world, who exists outside the confines of time and space, meaning he cannot be portrayed because he is pure spirit. Jesus Christ on whom Christianity is based, was a Jew.

For centuries before Jesus was born Jewish prophets foretold the arrival of a 'Messiah' who would be sent from the One and Only God to point humankind in the right direction. Jesus was put to death on a Roman execution cross for – in today's parlance – disturbing the peace. Large sections of the general public believed he was 'the Messiah', which their Roman overlords found threatening. However, from three days after his public execution, for six weeks, Jesus was seen by many to be alive, walking, talking, and eating, before 'disappearing' in the presence of his disciples.

Before the arrival of Jesus the normal everyday ethic of life was that he who hit hardest would always win. But Jesus taught 'love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, strength and soul and love your neighbour as you love yourself'. He referred to God as his Father.

After Jesus's death his disciples wrote about him, books known as the Gospels. In the fullness of time the ancient Jewish Scriptures and the Gospels, together with other writings of mythology, history, prophecy, and many letters, were put together to become what is known today as the Bible.

'The Great Christian Hope' is that Jesus Christ's six-week resurrection from the dead (which has never been disproved) is evidence enough of life after death; not, perhaps, life as we know it now; but also *not* the obliteration of all consciousness that was so objected to by my son.

So enjoy your birding and don't stop filling up your feeders just because the sparrowhawk visits, it's got to eat too!.



Vineyard Farm



An early postcard from the 20th century shows the little thatched cottage of Vineyard Farm with a small barn. The hedgerow before the cottage is roughly where the footpath is today. This view was unchanged from 1886 when the OS map was surveyed.



Plans to build the modern bungalow, close to the Church Knowle Road, were not submitted until 1933 and by then the barn had become a much larger outbuilding.

Earthworks is written on the OS map. Was this caused by a vineyard? Maybe, but one is not mentioned in Treswell's 1585 Survey. The first mention found to date of '*The Viniard*' is in 1602 when it was leased to Giles Green, Lady Hatton's bailiff. He sub-let it to Elizabeth Strong, a widow, and her son, John. So, 17 years after the Survey the name is used but on the 1585 map the area consisted of two closes called 'Mill Close' and part of 'Dry or Wheat Close'. No cottage is mentioned despite one being drawn on the map.



The Strong family remained here for over 100 years eventually taking over the tenancy after Giles had died and his widow had remarried. By 1702, Thomas Strong, a weaver, leased 'a house and barn' called 'The Vineyard' so a dwelling now definitely stood here.

It is known that a 'garden house' (possibly some sort of greenhouse?) stood there in 1626. The land had been used as an old orchard and garden, but was leased specifically to grow herbs, flowers and fruit for the castle. The lessee was to look after the trees and make sure the fishponds did not silt up. This seems to have been enclosed separately and enlarged because by 1630, Mr Green was only able to rent 5 acres of the orchard and garden at 'Vineyard'.

The garden is shown on John Hawsteed's early 1600s map and explains why the soil has been disturbed as there is now a large pond filled with water from the mill leat.

COMMUNITY WEEKEND TO GIVE PUBLIC RARE OPPORTUNITY

TO GO BEHIND THE SCENES ON THE SWANAGE RAILWAY

Dedicated Swanage Railway volunteers are to stage a fascinating two-day Community Weekend giving the public the rare opportunity to go behind the scenes of the award-winning heritage line that has been rebuilt since 1976.

The special event takes place on Saturday and Sunday, 17 and 18 February, 2024, - between 10am and 4pm - with staff at Swanage, Herston, Harman's Cross, Corfe Castle and Norden stations taking part.

Half-price standard travel train tickets for the Community Weekend are available in advance from the Swanage Railway website, at swanagerailway.co.uk, for people living in the BH and DT postcodes with proof of BH and DT residence having to be supplied when purchasers pick up their tickets from Swanage Railway ticket offices on the day.

With advance booking of tickets recommended at swanagerailway.co.uk, there will be the chance to drive a 1950s heritage diesel shunter at Swanage for £20, watch a train guard or on-train travelling ticket inspector perform their duties for £5 (additional train travel ticket purchase required) as well as enjoy £5 behind the scenes tours of the award-winning signal boxes at Harman's Cross or Corfe Castle stations.

Non-advance bookable free (donations appreciated) attractions will be guided access to the footplate of a steam locomotive at Swanage, visits to 1960s heritage telephone exchanges at Harman's Cross and Corfe Castle stations (both subject to volunteer availability) between 10.30am and 3.30pm as well as the chance to have a go at signalling at the Corfe Castle signalling museum (subject to volunteer availability).

Visitors will also be able to chat to volunteers at Herston Halt – which is only accessible on foot or by train - about the development of the Swanage Railway's first station since it welcomed its first train from Swanage in 1984.

Other non-advance bookable free (donations appreciated) attractions on the Saturday and Sunday include the chance to chat to the restorers of heritage coaches and wagons at Corfe Castle station as well as watch demonstration lifts – between 10.40am and 3.30pm - by 1940s and 1950s railway cranes at

Norden station, one of which relaid the Swanage Railway tracks from Herston Halt to Furzebrook between 1983 and 2002.

Demonstration narrow gauge diesel trains will also be operating between 11am and 3pm at the Swanage Railway Trust's Purbeck Mining Museum, next to Norden station, which explains and celebrates the 2,000 year history of Isle of Purbeck ball clay mining.

Event organiser and volunteer guard Clare Collins said: "Our Community Weekend is a different and interesting day out for all the family - a rare opportunity to see behind the scenes of a working heritage railway, explore some of the many different roles required to operate the Swanage Railway and find out about varied volunteering opportunities.

"Volunteering on the Swanage Railway is very fulfilling, it's a great way of meeting new people while assisting with worthwhile community projects at what has become one of Dorset's major tourist attractions," added Clare who is also a volunteer director of the Swanage Railway Trust which manages the heritage line and is a registered charity.

Swanage Railway Trust chairman Frank Roberts said: "It takes more people to operate, maintain and develop the Swanage Railway than many people realise. Our Community Weekend is the first of several special events across 2024 that we hope will be attractive to a wide variety of people of all ages.

"I have been lucky enough to have been a Swanage Railway volunteer for more than 40 years and I find volunteering very fulfilling and enjoyable while working with a splendid group of people of all ages.

"With the Swanage Railway contributing more than £15 million a year to the local economy, we are delighted to give people across the Isle of Purbeck, Dorset and beyond the chance to enjoy a behind the scenes view of a very special heritage railway," added Frank who helped to install the Swanage Railway's lineside telephone system in the 1980s and 1990s while now being the lead volunteer maintaining and developing Herston Halt on the outskirts of Swanage.

Ramblings of a local gardener

In February the weather is very unpredictable and with the changing weather patterns we have to expect everything gales, snow, frost, rain, fog and hopefully some sun -everything! With the lengthening days, there will be more signs of spring each day and I find it interesting seeing which plants are coming up and are healthy, do they need moving dividing or throwing away. Does the garden have gaps that need filling then I have to find seeds or order more plants. It is fun looking up for new plants that will take whatever weather we get.

Looking at the RHS magazine I see there are a lot of shrubs and small trees of all sizes that would be happy in the ground or in a pot. I was very interested in the nut trees that are successfully growing in Devon and should grow well in Dorset. They recommended pecan nuts 'Carson No 3' or 'Lucas'. Nuts are rich in proteins, vitamins and fibre and are expensive to buy. May I also suggest white walnut, cob nuts and hickory nuts, I have ordered some of these, and a selection of apple trees so I can have fresh apples for 10 months of the year.

Broad beans, early peas and onion sets need sowing on good days, on wet days sow lettuce and other tender plants to put in (when warmer), wherever you have gaps. I put up bird feeders where I can see them from inside the house there is lots to watch all day, blue tits, great tits, blackbirds, dunnocks and lots of house sparrow's despite of a daily visit from a sparrow hawk! I even have woodpeckers, nuthatch and goldfinches some days. In the sky I watch many seagulls, crows, magpies, hawks. Great time wasters, and relaxing.

Don't make your garden too tidy as doing less is often better for wildlife. Plant bulbs in grass and only mow when the leaves die and/or leave mower fairly high. Clover copes well in dry and damp times it feeds the soil, stays short, gives nectar for bee's moths and butterflies, and pigeons will eat clover. One of my blight resident potatoes was covered with nasturtiums all summer and when I dug it up in November, I got 14lb! I was expecting very little.

Other ideas: Put in some grow lights, (use silver foil to reflect/maximise light) to grow food inside in the winter. Install big water tanks and dig over excess flow ponds to prevent water runoff which depletes the nutritional soils, and fills the stream/rivers lower down the system. I am happy to give suggestions by coming to your garden or patio in Purbeck.

Movie Night - Tuesday 13 February - Oppenheimer

The biopic of Oppenheimer was one of the major blockbusters of 2023.

There are two basic storylines, and the film shifts back and forth between them. "Fission" is shot in colour and follows Oppenheimer (Cillian Murphy) through his early years as a graduate student and college professor; his leadership of the Manhattan Project culminating with the Trinity Test; his simultaneous triumph and torment in the wake of Hiroshima and Nagasaki; and the eventual loss of his security clearance thanks in large part to early Communist connections and his outspoken opposition to developing a hydrogen bomb.

"Fusion" is shot in IMAX black-and-white analog photography and follows the 1959 Senate confirmation hearing of Lewis Strauss (Robert Downey Jr.), former chair of the Atomic Energy Commission who—as the film gradually reveals—played a critical role in stripping away Oppenheimer's security clearance five years earlier, angering many in the physics community. The black mark against Oppenheimer's name wasn't fully cleared until December 2022.

It is a long film -3 hours and 1 minute!! But well worth it and we will have our usual intermission.

Doors and bar open at 7pm with the film starting at 7.30pm as always, and entry on the night remains just £5.
